## Service helping get seniors to center

For many seniors, the downtown Henderson Senior Center is a good place for an inexpensive, hearty meal and some fellowship, but until recently getting there wasn't always easy.

Some seniors have relinquished their driver's licenses, have mobility problems or can't depend on busy friends and family for rides.

A pilot program by the city's Parks and Recreation Department offers a shuttle five days

a week from the seniors' front door to the center, then back again.

Gerontology coordinator Sue Bobby said the service, funded by a federal grant, is available in ZIP codes 89002, 89011 and 89015.

The cost is \$1 per round trip, but Bobby said some money is set aside for seniors who cannot afford it.

"All they have to do is talk to management," she said. "We are very discreet. No one has to be embarrassed if they have to ask for help."

Once at the center, seniors can get free loaves of bread, pastries and dairy products, Bobby said. They can also enjoy lunch for a suggested donation of \$1.50 or get wellness checks.

Richard Meza, who has taken the shuttle nearly every day since it began in January, said he couldn't enjoy the center as often without it.

"I used to pay \$14 for a taxi," he said. "Instead of coming every day, like I do now, I could only come once a week."

John Clayton, who rides the

shuttle twice a week, said people with mobility issues have a difficult time taking the regular city bus.

"(Citizen Area Transit) doesn't have a bus that comes down here, so you have to walk all the way from Boulder Highway. This is a great ser-

## It's time to spring clocks forward

With daylight-saving time just around the corner, valley residents can expect to see the outdoors stay a little lighter, a little later and with the Energy Policy Act of 2005 taking effect this year, that change is going to come a little earlier.

In 2005, President Bush signed the act, which among other changes, moves the start of daylight-saving time from the first Sunday in April to the second Sunday in March, according to the U.S. Department of Energy.

The changes were scheduled to take effect in 2007, making March 11 the day residents will once more advance their clocks and wrestle with one less hour of sleep.

Although the jump won't officially happen until 2 a.m. on the morning of March 11, some valley agencies are already preparing.

Sylvia Romero, a spokeswoman for Las Vegas Public Works, said technicians were out fixing the timers on school flashers the week of Feb. 26, with completion scheduled for March 2.

Romero said changing the timers has to be done every year and this year was no different, even with early daylight-saving time.

## Into the sunset

Historic chapel makes 15-mile journey to museum

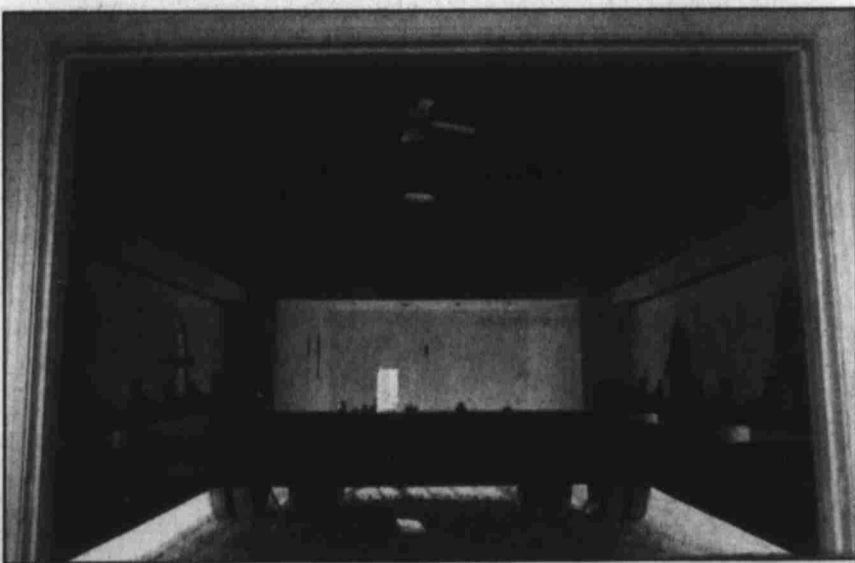

Rescued from the brink of destruction, one of Las Vegas' most historic wedding chapels has been safely relocated to the Clark County Heritage Museum.

Owner of Henderson's Bland-Ford house movers, Lee Sorensen, said his crew lifted the Candle Light Wedding Chapel onto a truck at 1 a.m. March 1 for a 15-mile, five-hour journey from Las Vegas Boulevard South to its new home at 1830 S. Boulder Highway.

The cost of the move was \$76,000, which was paid with capital improvement funds approved by the Clark County Commission. To get the chapel to the museum on Boulder Highway, movers had to take several side streets on a zig-zag course through Las Vegas and Henderson, museum Administrator Mark Ryzdyski said.

Ryzdyski said the building was not damaged, nor was any other property during the move, although a construction fence was knocked over on the Las Vegas Strip

and there was a close call with a parked car.

He said the chapel, built in 1966, is a replica of the famous Little Church of the West, a chapel on

Las Vegas Boulevard South, which was built in 1942 and is listed on the National Register of Historic

## Walker students to have choice to transfer

Students zoned for overcrowded Marian Walker International School will have a choice next fall to stay there or transfer to sister school James & Alice Rae Smalley Elementary School, which is scheduled to open in August.

The Clark County School Board approved a plan Feb. 27 to turn Walker's current attendance zone into a shared zone when Smalley opens at the intersection of Paradise Hills Drive and Greenway Road.

"The zone stayed the same. They just put another school in it," Walker Principal Alan Bowman said. "And not a minute too soon."

The shared attendance zone begins at the intersection of Horizon Ridge Parkway and Horizon Drive and stretches east and south to the Henderson city limits.

Walker opened with 570 students in the fall of 2002. Rapid growth in the area made its student population nearly triple in less than five years. The year-round school has been adding portable classrooms that now total 27 in order to accommodate 1,414 pupils enrolled in kindergarten through fifth grade.

"Most of the growth seems to be in the area to our southwest, on the west side of Greenway," Bowman said. "There is a really heavy concentration of kids near where Smalley is going up."

The location for the new school might seem ideal for absorbing most of the population growth, but neighboring residents initially opposed the project because they feared it would bring traffic congestion and other urban problems into the Paradise Hills Rural Neighborhood Preservation Area.

They also voiced concern for the safety of several horses kept on properties bordering the school site. Henderson City Council members approved the project in April, with the condition that the school district pay for temporary boarding away from the site for the horses.

## Drivers on 95 to see the lights

Signals at College Drive exit should be operational in May

Heavy traffic, with cars sometimes backed up to the freeway, has prompted the city to install traffic lights off the College Drive exits from U.S. 95 in Henderson.

The new signals, which should be up and running in early May, are at the bottom of the east and west exit ramps from the freeway. They will cost about \$800,000, city traffic engineer John Penueles said.

The signals are among four traffic light projects in the city, he said. The other three intersections getting traffic signals and their cost are High Mesa Drive and Horizon Ridge Parkway, \$620,000; Lake Mead Parkway and Athens Road, \$680,000; and Horizon Ridge Parkway and Seven Hills Drive, \$650,000.

Penueles said the lights at the College Drive exit cost more than the others because they are more complicated and spread out.

Rob Herr, Henderson's assistant director of public works, said traffic counts taken at the intersection in 2003 surpassed a threshold set by the state to warrant a traffic signal.

Traffic counts showed 6,500 eastbound vehicles exiting the freeway each day and about 1,400 westbound vehicles exiting. In addition, 6,700 southbound vehicles were traveling through the College Drive intersection and 5,800 traveled through it northbound.

Penueles said the volumes have surely increased since the 2003 study.

"There's no doubt they've increased," he said. "Volumes always go up. They very rarely go down."

Nevada Department of Transportation spokesman Bob McKenzie said the agency has standards it applies to all projects before they are approved for construction.

"We make sure they've got the proper traffic controls on the ramp so, during installation, traffic will still be able to proceed,"

**THURSDAY, MARCH 1**

The Henderson Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of nine changes to the city's zoning ordinance, including adding a requirement that developers have 90 days after neighborhood meetings to bring their plans to the commission, or the developers must host another meeting. The City Council will vote on whether to adopt the changes March 20. The changes passed with a 6-0 vote in favor with commissioner George Bochanis absent.

**FRIDAY, MARCH 2**

Three people died in a car crash in front of the Palm Hills subdivision's entrance on Horizon Ridge Parkway. All three were in a Dodge Neon that was struck by a Chevrolet Tahoe. A fourth person in the Neon was taken to Sunrise Trauma with internal injuries. Two of the deceased were Henderson residents. The collision occurred around 11:40 a.m. Police said speed and alcohol did not appear to factor in the crash. No citations or arrests were made.

Elyse Marie Palmer, 19 years old at the time of the slaying, was originally charged with murder, but she pleaded not guilty to the charge. Farrell's body, which was stabbed and shot, was found inside the Applebee's restaurant at 699 N. Stephanie St., according to earlier reports by the Las Vegas Sun. Palmer is a former Green Valley High School student. She is being held on \$1 million bail at the Clark County Detention Center. Palmer's sentencing is scheduled for March 12.

## Park near stadium set to receive major upgrades

County plans 2 adult soccer fields, 14 baseball diamonds

A proposed 200-acre park near Sam Boyd Stadium would satisfy some of the demand for park facilities in the county and become a regional sports complex that offers a variety of outdoor activities, planners say.

Designers unveiled plans for the expanded Silver Bowl Park to the County Commission on Feb. 20. Senior Parks Planner Justin Williams said the Parks and Recreation Department doesn't have a timetable on construction because it is working on the cost estimate. Williams said the county would likely seek Southern Nevada Public Lands Management Act funds and grants along with public funding.

The park would be built on land around Sam Boyd Stadium and south of the Wetlands Park. The existing Silver Bowl Park southwest of the stadium would receive an overhaul with new fields and additional parking. That would likely be the third and final stage of construction, Williams said, since numerous athletic organizations and residents use it now.

The plans for the first two phases show 14 baseball and softball fields with four of them official-size baseball fields. Two adult soccer fields are also included. All of the fields would have synthetic turf to reduce water use.

The existing park would re-

main grass but to reduce wear and tear, the multi-use fields would be rotated as needed to accommodate different games. Residents have asked for soccer fields for various ages and fields for lacrosse, flag football and ultimate Frisbee, Williams said.

"We're trying to accommodate many interests," he said.

The park would also have playgrounds, separate remote control car dirt and paved tracks, walking trails,

concession stands and a Park Police substation. Statues of famous sports figures and a plaza with a Clark County Sports Wall of Fame are proposed.

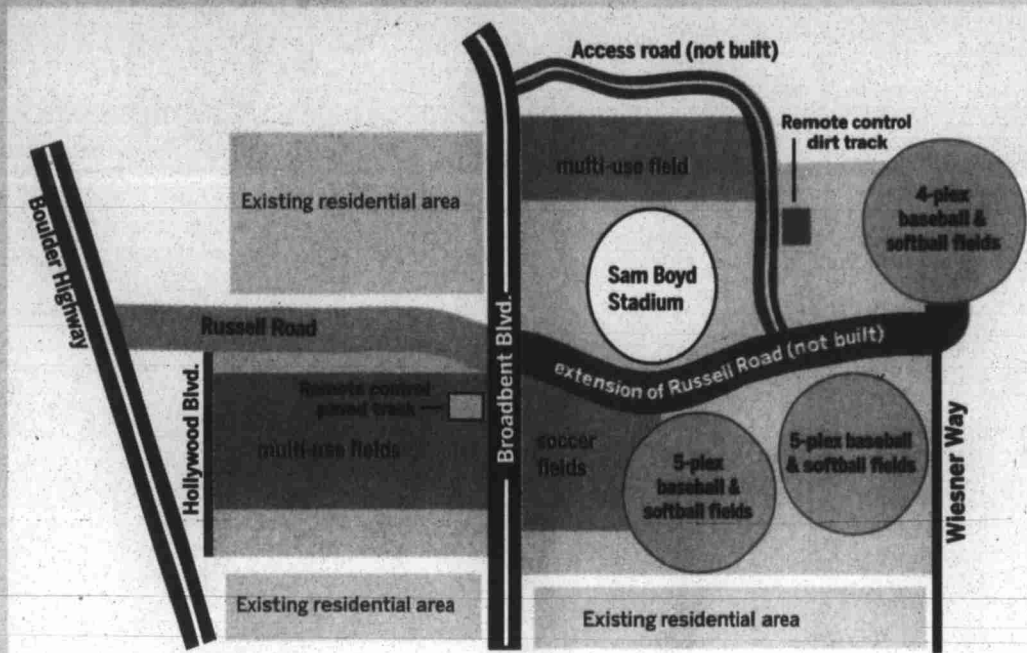
Silver Bowl tops the parks department's wish list because it would be widely used by residents from around the valley and could draw tournaments and league play. The county is behind in building parks required in its Master Plan.

The 20-year plan establishes a rate of 2.5 acres per 1,000 residents. Williams said the southeast area has about 600 acres but based on current population in the area needs 700 acres.

The proposed 200-acre Silver Bowl Park would serve a large number of people, allow-

ing the county to catch up in other areas of the valley that are under served.

In the same area, Clark County Public Works is in the design stage for rebuilding Russell Road east of Boulder Highway. Plans show the six-lane road will be shifted north closer to an apartment complex.

The new intersection at Broadbent Boulevard would have dual left-turn lanes in all

four directions. The development of the park would likely mean a traffic signal would be installed at the intersection, according to the plans. Russell would also likely be extended to dead end at Weisner Road, just east of the stadium. The city of Henderson has no plans to continue Russell further east at this time, a city planner said.

An access road would be built north of the practice

fields to the north of the stadium to improve traffic flow to the baseball diamonds and for events at the stadium. It would also service a proposed fire station.

The new parks would include more parking spaces in the area that would accommodate overflow parking for the stadium during events.

## County Web site to assist voters

Voters countywide can now download maps to polling locations and sample ballots from the Clark County Election Department Web site. The department added the information last week in response to requests from voters.

The revamped Web pages provide a Mapquest-generated image to guide voters to their designated polling place. Users must be able to view PDF documents.

"During election season most of our requests are for these two items," Registrar of Voters Larry Lomax said. "By allowing voters to access polling place directions and receive a replacement sample ballot online, we've just simplified the process for thousands of voters."

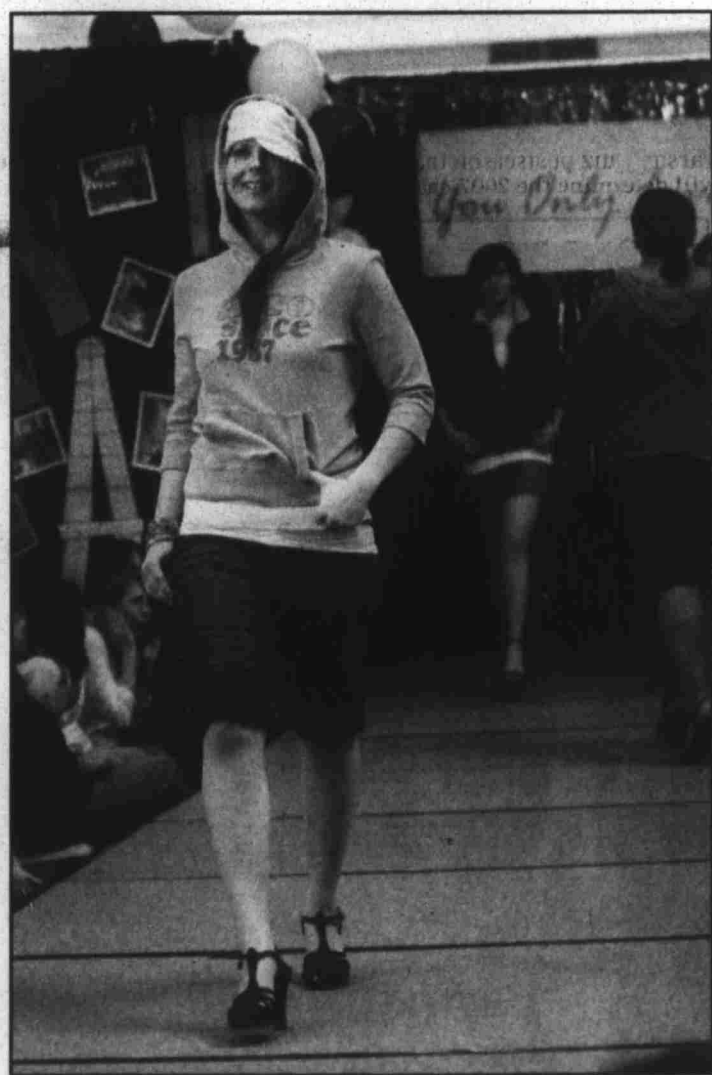
The new information is also available to residents of Henderson, Boulder City and other municipalities. The county's site links to the cities' election Web sites.

Registered voters need to type in their name as it appears on their registration cards and their birth date to view their personal information, access voting forms and find their elected representatives plus the new maps and sample ballots.

Residents visiting the Web site for the first time can also get information on how to register to vote.

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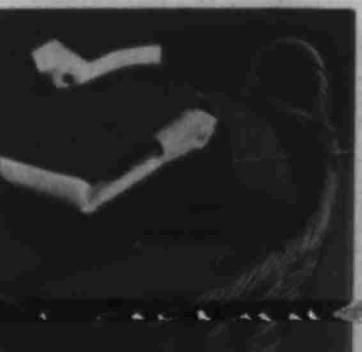
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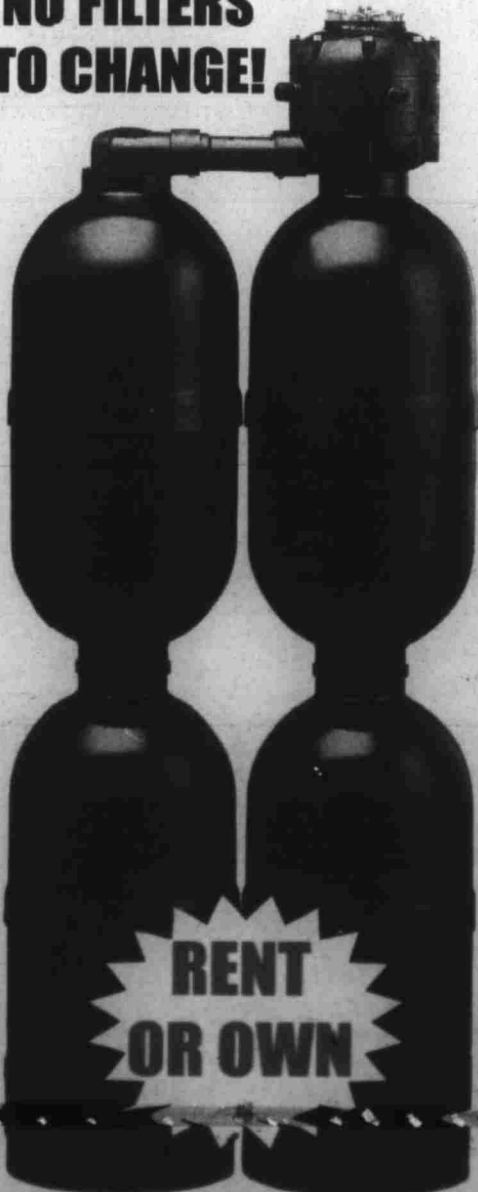

## Bars following ban on smoking suffer in victory

When voters approved Question 5 in November, it appeared as though bar patrons who don't smoke would at last be able to come home without smelling like an ash tray.

Question 5, which banned smoking in most establishments that serve food, seemed like a practical adaptation of smoking bans in other states. Casinos would be exempted, but everybody else would have to follow the rules.

But in many ways, the Old West refuses to die in Nevada. There will always be folks who know when to fold their cards, and there will always be folks who have a king of spades up their sleeve that they'll play at the right time.

Such is it with Question 5. Some businesses chose to boot smokers from their establishments. Some acted creatively, building walls to separate the bars from restaurant areas, sidestepping the rules without stepping on non-smokers' toes.

And some have looked the other way while smokers continue to puff away.

Some bartenders and pub managers have straightforwardly told patrons that because there aren't any Health District inspectors around, they don't need to bother putting out their cigarettes. Others haven't even addressed the issue, completely ignoring a law

that 310,524 Nevadans voted to approve.

It's a slap in the face to those Nevadans, as well as to fellow bar owners, who have ceded to the voters' demands and are asking customers not to smoke.

Non-smoking bars are suffering.

Some patrons who are sent out to the cold to smoke are simply leaving. That's troubling for bar owners who are watching some of their best customers, especially those who pump dollar after dollar into their lucrative bar-top video poker machines, walk out.

That's why the Question 5 ban cannot, and will not, work without enforcement. It's not fair that the owners of establishments like Steiner's in Silverado and northwest Las Vegas, and Nikki Lee's near McCarran Airport, which have banned smoking, are put in a position to be spited by their patrons because those bars choose to enforce the law.

It's not fair that those patrons can go down the road to a similar bar that is not asking its customers to follow the new law.

The Health District should have the power to fine businesses that are ignoring Question 5. Until then, the only people who will be punished under the smoking ban will be bar owners who are honoring the new law by asking their patrons to put out their cigarettes.

## Curriculum for school success



I think we can agree that in most cases teachers lack the resources they need to be successful and are severely underpaid with little opportunity for financial growth.

A teacher's compensation is at the top of the list as to why the Clark County School District is unable to attract and keep a substantial quality workforce of educators.

I don't subscribe to the notion that our current teachers are not of quality. In fact, I believe that these teachers are asked to perform their job in a classroom environment that is not conducive to stimulating the learning process of each and every one of their students. Applicants who transfer from another state for a teaching position soon discover that working at one of our gaming resorts is more financially rewarding with less effort, and they can spend more time with their families while adding to their bottom line.

Classrooms are overcrowded with a high student-to-teacher ratio and a minimized time period in which to teach, enforce and reinforce a subject lesson. Our future, the children, are also at a disadvantage within the classroom. They must compete for individual assistance to validate what was taught, which is necessary to reinforce the class subject for future testing.

It is a formula that has failure for the student and the teacher written all over it, and time has proven so.

Teachers' time before and after school to help their students is limited because many teachers work either in other school programs or outside the system to subsidize their incomes to make up for low pay.

Let's evaluate: What is the Clark County School District working with? The problem lies in overworked and underpaid teachers and under-served students who are required to learn in an environment that is not interactive or stimulating.

These are factors necessary to teach students of all learning types, whether it be through visual, audio, hands-on, creatively or one-on-one instruction.

As a parent of six children who have attended every grade level of the Clark County school system, I am confident in my opinion of how effective or ineffective our children's educators have been over the past decade.

The teachers are the key factor as to whether our children learn at school. The effect of the teacher on each student is dependent upon the teacher's ability to support and enhance students' ability to comprehend and learn.

Currently teachers are leaving the profession because the money is not worth the stress — or it could be that the stress isn't worth any amount of money. We as citizens know that education is one of the most valuable public services for our children's future, and therefore we need to support a program that will compensate educators financially at a level that enables them to focus on generating results for each and every student they teach.

Several states have implemented teacher compensation programs related to student and/or teacher performance. Among those states are Arizona, Florida, Iowa and Kentucky.

Most of these states' pay-for-performance programs vary. Some tie teacher salaries to student performance as measured by tests; others link teacher salaries to performance evaluations of the teacher; and some use a combination of both.

I would like to see the school district

explore the following as an option:

- Decrease the number of students per classroom.
- Ensure an interactive learning environment to meet the needs of all students.
- Develop a substantially higher base salary chart that takes into consideration the variable level of a teacher's skills and added values (Higher pay decreases stress by lessening the need to work a second job, ultimately giving teachers the time necessary to focus on the development of each of their students).
- Offer additional merit pay that is a percentage of the teacher annual base salary and will substantially impact a teacher's annual income.
- Qualify teachers for bonuses using an evaluation derived from the student's educational performance and growth.
- Implement state or county testing at the beginning and end of a school year to establish a measurement of the teacher's success.
- Give teachers the flexibility within the classroom to teach creatively and to perform periodic testing to evaluate and assess each student's needs.

The bottom line is everyone will win. Teachers will be in control of the classroom, student success and their financial growth.

The school district will have a tool to evaluate and monitor teachers, and students will have teachers who have the time, energy and incentive to help them succeed.

Keep in mind that with any compensation plan that requires results before compensation, there can be resistance. Any resistance should not be considered a concrete obstacle by any means. With a merit pay program that is completely objective, the teacher should soon discover that he or she is the one responsible for increasing their annual income.

#### CCSN doesn't need to build apartments

Community College of Southern Nevada President Richard Carpenter and the Board of Regents have been working with the Molasky Group to develop and lease the land owned by the college near Heather Drive and Chimney Rock Drive, next door to Foothill High School.

This venture would turn educational land to semi-public with 361 apartments for rent.

Apartments are not acceptable on this property. It is intended for educational use. The regents, Planning Commission and City Council need to hear your voice. It will make a difference.

At a neighborhood meeting Feb. 19, when asked if CCSN had explored other options in developing this property, they refused to discuss it.

This leads me to believe that this opportunity developed and they were not interested in doing anything with the property or developing

affordable housing for the CCSN faculty until Molasky approached them with this deal.

When asked multiple times about lifting the educational requirement from the BLM and this process, Molasky representatives dodged the question. The company has entered into a deal with CCSN and if this passes, Molasky will pay CCSN \$1 million and CCSN will get half of the revenue created each year from the rentals. That is 361 apartments at \$900 to \$1,500 a month for 50 years. I bet it didn't take 50 years to develop all of the land around UNLV.

Carpenter said, "Nevada's college system is one of the fastest-growing in the nation."

So why give up this land for 50 years? It will be needed for educational purposes! What gives the Board of Regents the right to give up our valuable assets?

Molasky said it would discount 10 percent of the units to be used by college faculty.

This they feel would attract more full-time faculty because inexpensive housing is being made available to them.

How many full-time faculty members does the Henderson CCSN campus have? When asked, Carpenter said he did not know. It seems to me you should know if you need these apartments.

A lot of the classes are taught by part-time adjunct faculty with other day jobs in the industry. That is a great asset to the college, as internships and job placements can be made with these part-time faculty members who are current on industry standards and trends.

If they cannot fill the 36 units with faculty from CCSN, Molasky would then offer

the apartments to City of Henderson personnel. City personnel make great pay and have great benefits. Why should your tax money go to helping pay a city employee's rent? Your money could be used to help fund the college

system instead.

Right now the college sits on 80 acres. The empty desert makes up about 40 acres, and the rest of the acreage has buildings and parking lots. Twenty acres would be used for the apartments (half of the desert behind CCSN). The other 20 acres would be left for future buildings.

What could stop them from deciding to lease that land to another developer and put in a strip mall with a bar and gambling? College students would like that stuff, right?

Also, one-access to the apartments would be on Heather Drive and one on Chimney Rock. The Chimney Rock exit would increase traffic in the older neighborhood next door as apartments residents cut through to get to the businesses on Horizon and College instead of going around to Heather and then down College. Our neighborhood was not designed for that amount of traffic.

The plans for the two-story apartments are very close together with little park or transition areas. In fact, the apartments are only 20 feet away from the existing properties along the far side of the desert. Nothing like having your neighbors literally staring down into your backyard!

Talk to your City Council members and find out their position on this matter before you vote for them. Let them know that you do not approve of this misuse of public education land!

If it happens at CCSN (in Henderson, of course), it could happen anywhere in the state of Nevada when a college or university feels they may need extra funding beyond what the state has decided to give them and they just happen to have a few acres to spare.

It is not just our neighborhood's problem. Do you know where all the empty college properties are located throughout the valley or even the state? There could be property closer than you think.

We all have budgets and we need to learn how to work within in them.

## Springing forward into warmer weather



Wow! It feels like we're not only springing forward into daylight-saving time this weekend, but into early summer as well. What a welcome warm-up though.

Highs this weekend will top out in the extra warm 80s and should last into most of next week. Hello Nevada Power bill.

Speaking of power bills, the 80s will be short-lived, as we usually have at least one more cold snap by the end of March. But daylight-saving time will last more than seven months this year. With this year a new, longer schedule begins for getting more daylight at the end of our day, thanks to the Energy Policy Act, which was passed in 2005.

Since the '60s we've been setting our clocks forward one hour on the first Sunday in April and then back an hour on the last Sunday in October. But the new law extends daylight-saving time by four weeks, from the second Sunday of March to the first Sunday of November.

The change allows us to use less energy in lighting our homes by taking advantage of the longer and later daylight hours. But it seems like for us desert dwellers,

we'll just have to keep the air conditioning on a little longer each day. That can't be cheaper, especially when the days are extra warm, as they will be this weekend and next week!

Thanks to high pressure, these 80-somethings will hang on in east and north valley neighborhoods for most of the week. Normal daytime highs for mid-March are upper 60s, with mornings in the upper 40s. We'll beat that every day for the next seven days by as much as 10 to 15 degrees. Maybe more!

For those who like to get up with the sun, you may have to set the alarm clock on Monday, so you won't be late for work. Beginning Sunday morning, the sun won't slide above the eastern horizon until around 7 a.m. But the daylight will last all the way until nearly 7 p.m. There will now be enough daylight left after dinner to walk off dessert.

By the way, changing your clocks is a good time to change the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms. Have a safe, great weekend and lather on the sunscreen!

## Time change early this year

Jaime Lynne Lea, a spokeswoman with the Clark County School District, said the schools brace for the change on an individual basis. "It kind of depends on how old the school is," she said. In some of the newer schools, electronic clocks and clocks connected to computers should right themselves with the switch, Lea said. With older schools using battery-operated clocks, custodial staff may go around and change each clock, she said. There is no blanket policy for a uniform change in the district, she said. "Each of schools are just so

different," Lea said. But as valley residents dig out VCR manuals and car information booklets, at least one thing in Las Vegas should make the switch without a problem — the streetlights. Rather than being controlled by a clock or timer, the lights are controlled by the sun, Romero said. Daylight-saving time will also last longer under the new law, not wrapping up until the first Sunday in November, which this year is Nov. 4.

## Walker's population tripled in less than 5 years

Construction began over the summer and the school is expected to be completed by late August, in time for the start of the 2007-08 school year.

School Board member Mary Beth Scow added a condition when the board approved the shared attendance zone for Walker and Smalley that the school district conduct a study to minimize school bus traffic through the rural neighborhood preservation area. The scope, length and deadline for the study were not discussed. The School Board also suggested that the attendance

zone for the schools would likely be adjusted in a few years, to accommodate ongoing growth.

In the meantime, newly appointed Smalley Principal Pam Simone and Bowman will have to develop a plan to make the shared zone work and to encourage half of Walker's student population to transfer to the new school. "I attended Walker's PTA meetings in January and February so I could hear from the parents there," said Simone, who transferred to Smalley after several years leading David Cox Elementary School in Green Valley. "I'm in the

process of hiring my staff right now. Mr. Bowman and myself are also in the process of planning how registration will take place."

Simone will have to execute the plan with the person who takes over Walker's leadership after Bowman retires this summer.

This might not have to be the last time she has to oversee a redistribution of Smalley's student population.

If development in the surrounding area continues at a similar pace, which in the past three years has been adding 200 to 300 new students per year to Walker's population,

both Smalley and Walker will be overcrowded by 2009.

Construction of new schools is funded through bonds approved by voters. The school district's ability to issue bonds ends in the summer of 2008 and voters will be asked to approve a new 10-year program that fall.

Leah Marchione, a school district spokeswoman, said school district officials are at the beginning stages of developing a new 10-year bonding plan.

## Commission backs change that would affect developers

Developers may have less leeway to procrastinate between the time they hold neighborhood meetings and bring their designs to the Planning Commission if the City Council passes proposed changes to the city's zoning laws March 20.

The Planning Commission voted March 1 to recommend approval of nine changes to the city's zoning ordinance, including adding a requirement that developers have 90 days after neighborhood meetings to bring their plans to the commission or they must hold another meeting.

Also among the proposed changes was one to eliminate a requirement that single-family homes on lots under 20,000 square feet have covered parking. The commissioners voted to hold that one for further review.

Tracy Foutz, assistant community development director, said the idea to eliminate the covered parking requirement came from Henderson

residents who wanted to convert their garages to a living space. With housing costs high, a growing trend has been for young adults or family members who otherwise would move out to move into the family's converted garage.

Planning commissioners said they wanted to make sure they weighed all of the potential negative consequences of eliminating the requirement and sent the item to be reviewed by a committee.

Foutz said Henderson is the only city in Clark County with the restriction.

The 90-day time limit after neighborhood meetings passed unanimously with the other changes on a 6-0 vote. Planning Commissioner George Bochanis was not present.

Henderson Principal Planner Scott Majewski said when developers seek a change to the use of a parcel, such as from single-family homes to multi-family apartments, they are required to have neighborhood meetings.

Developers must prove they gave notices of the meetings to the right people so that neighbors can voice their opinions on the project.

In the past, some developers have waited long periods of time after a neighborhood meeting because of opposition from neighbors, although Majewski said it's "not that common."

Nicole McGeary, president of the Sunridge Estates Homeowners Association, said the residents of that neighborhood felt they were in a war of attrition every time they tried to fight a plan for the nearby Canyons at MacDonald Ranch project.

Several pieces of the project have faced opposition from the nearby communities because of blasting issues, housing density and traffic concerns.

McGeary said sometimes nearly 100 neighbors would show up at meetings only to have the developer request a time extension. Some issues dragged on for months. As a result, the residents, many with families and full-time

jobs, tired of showing up for the evening meetings.

"By having so much time in between, it really cuts down on the number of people that show up for the actual meeting," she said. "And the developer will say, 'As you can see, there's not a lot of opposition to this.'"

Majewski said the change should allow residents to be current on the proposals so they can voice their opposition or support sooner and more clearly.

Other proposed changes to the zoning laws included a definition for residential facilities for groups. According to the proposed code changes, a facility for groups is an establishment that provides limited supervision for 10 or fewer non-related people with physical, age-related or mental challenges, a change from eight. The change brings the city in line with state law, according to city documents.

# Candle Light Wedding Chapel to be restored

Places. In its heyday, the Candle Light Wedding Chapel hosted more than 10,000 weddings a year, including weddings of stars such as Bette Midler, Conway Twitty, Michael Caine and James Caan, chapel owner Gordon Gust said.

After its doors were shuttered in 2005, Gust said, vandals moved in, smashed out the windows and covered it in graffiti.

"It's sad that they have to do things like that, but we'll get it restored," he said. "It will look like it did before."

Ryzdyski said the museum already has committed \$15,000 for immediate rehabilitation costs, but it will cost much more to fully restore the chapel.

The museum is also looking for funding to lay a foundation for the chapel and place it on Heritage Street, which could add another \$50,000 to \$100,000 to the cost, he said.

Ryzdyski said he hopes the chapel will someday host more unions, but the restoration is likely to take at least two years.

The museum had been in talks with Gust, who owns two other Las Vegas chapels, about moving one of them to the museum grounds. Only after the Candle Light was threatened with destruction did Gust decide to donate it, he said.

The chapel closed when the land underneath it was purchased by Fontainebleau Resorts, which is planning a 4,000-room casino resort at the corner of Las Vegas and Riviera boulevards.

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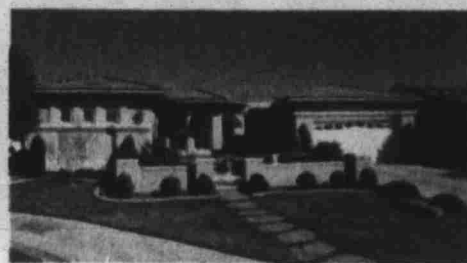
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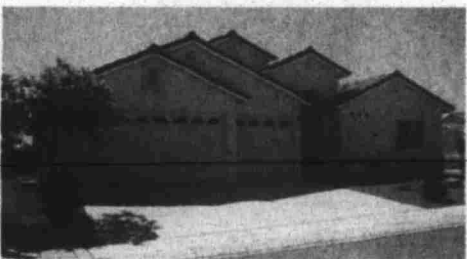
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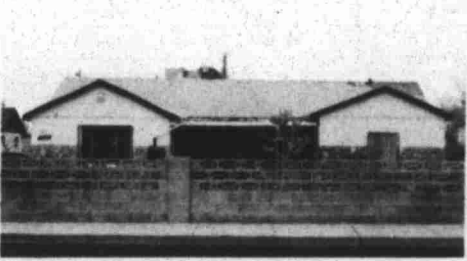

## More and more football players taking up track

When the high school track and field season starts next week, several schools will rely on football players to fill crucial roster spots.

The relationship between the two sports continues to grow each year as several football coaches are stressing to their athletes to stay involved in the spring.

And it's more than the skilled position players in sprinting events.

Just ask Foothill junior

lineman Alex Bair.

The 265-pound offensive tackle doubles as a shot put and disc thrower for the Falcons. He said track events help him with his power.

"Shot put and the disk throw helps with your explosion out of an athletic stance," Bair said. "I can get a little stronger, get more lift, everything I do is really power oriented. Plus, I have fun and stay in shape."

Bair, one of the valley's top college football prospects for next spring's signing period,

is increasingly becoming the norm. A growing number of football players, not just linemen, are trying out for track teams to stay in shape and learn skills, such as speed, quickness, stances and footwork that they can take with them into the football season.

"Track helps with agility," Green Valley football coach Matt Gerber said. "It can also help individuals work on stances, footwork, exploding off the ball. We feel those are all big things for them."

The speed can be invaluable, Foothill football coach Marty Redmond said.

"Having that speed will definitely help football performance. I don't know any one that has gotten of a track and been slower," Redmond said. "A lot of skilled position college football players were track athletes in high school."

Some local examples are Oregon State's Gerard Lawson (Palo Verde), San Diego's Henry Batton (Palo Verde) and Boise State's Rashaun Scott

(Green Valley). All three were former high school track athletes that now play defensive back at the next level.

Track coaches said they teach a lot of the same techniques that their football counterparts do.

"Athletes in both sports have to be quick," Foothill track coach Jim Yamka said. "Two days a week we work on speed techniques for all runners, from throwers to our distance runners. Speed is everywhere. They also do stair drills and other conditioning

techniques."

Some track coaches have built relationships with their football counterparts or have coaches that work on both staffs to help foster the transition from football player to a track athlete.

"We get athletes that normally wouldn't come out," said Silverado track coach Mike Bashay, who is also an assistant football coach.

But some football coaches are skeptical of the idea. They

## Fans turn the corner on Rebels basketball

When I first saw the marketing campaign last autumn, it struck me as desperate. "Make us YOUR team," urged the ads for UNLV's men's basketball team.

Fifteen years after the Rebels were a national team, the marketing department was trying to get the program adopted in its own hometown.

To me, it marked a watershed moment — the school was finally acknowledging that it could no longer rest on the laurels of its past accomplishments, that "UNLV basketball" conjured up images of greatness in fewer and fewer ticket-purchasing fans.

The image was solidified in December, when I was one of less than 700 people to watch the Rebels play Northern Arizona in St. George, Utah, 90 minutes from downtown Las Vegas.

On March 3, three months and a day after the Debacle at Dixie State, it seemed as though the message had gotten out.

The scene outside the Thomas & Mack Center looked more like a football game. The parking lots were full more than an hour before tipoff. People were tailgating, UNLV flags were waving in the warm early spring wind and, lo and behold, about 18,000 folks that wouldn't drive an hour and a half to see the Rebels in St. George three months ago were sitting in traffic that long or longer, just to watch those Rebels play.

The first crowd of that size in 14 years at the 18,500 seat arena was a great sign for the future of the program. It represents a break in the dichotomy of sports in this city — the larger Las Vegas gets, the fewer people turn out to sporting events.

Clearly, though, the fans weren't out to see the Rebels as much as they were there to see a good basketball team. After UNLV's 65-47 win against Colorado State on senior night, the Rebels were ranked for the second time this season in the coaches' poll, and are a lock to make

## Silverado slugger set for big year

One of Southern Nevada's most prolific power hitters said he is primed to have another monster season for the Silverado baseball team.

Senior catcher Mike McDade showed few weaknesses at the plate last year as he finished fourth in runs batted in and tied for third in home runs in the regular season in Southern Nevada. Now, McDade said he has improved his plate discipline and is hoping to help his team reach its goal of a state championship.

"Each year I make sure to work even harder than the last on any weaknesses I see in my offense," McDade said. "This offseason I worked on inside pitches and going the other way. I think I've made some big improvements. I feel like if I stay at it I'll have a pretty good year."

McDade posted gaudy numbers as he batted .440 with 10 home runs and 59 runs batted in to help the Skyhawks reach the state finals. While he said it will take all his effort to improve on those statistics, McDade said he's been working toward this season since he was old enough to hold a bat.

"I've always had baseball in my life," he said. "I started swinging a bat when I was 3 years old and I haven't taken a break from it since. I love the game. I love hitting and I couldn't imagine ever leaving it."

While McDade is best known for his offense, he said he's been proud of how his defense has progressed

since switching from third base to catcher as a freshman at Durango.

"(Durango) had a good returning third baseman and I wanted to play so I said I would move behind the plate," he said. "In the beginning I was a little mad but I kept working at it and it got easier and easier. I think my defense

has gotten pretty good since then. I think that's the most important thing; always working hard and never quitting."

After his sophomore year, McDade switched schools and traded in his Trailblazers jersey for the teal and purple. The move is something his Silverado teammates have been grateful for ever since.

"I think Mike is the most important player on our team," senior pitcher Kevin Rath said. "He handles pitchers well, he comes up big at the plate and he's a great leader. He's a lead by example kind of guy. I'm really thankful he came to our school because having him behind the plate has been huge for me as a pitcher. He's a great player and an even better teammate."

While transferring is never easy, McDade said his coach and teammates made the transition easier and he's felt it as the right move ever since.

# Oldest golf course in Southern Nevada still going strong

Some things never go out of style. After 69 years of operation, the Las Vegas Golf Club, Southern Nevada's oldest golf course, is still drawing more than 80,000 rounds per year.

Opened with nine holes in 1938 and expanded to 18 in 1947, the Las Vegas Golf Club covers roughly 140 acres on Washington Avenue between Decatur and Valley View boulevards, including the area's largest driving range with 64 stalls hitting over 10 acres.

It was designed by renowned golf course architect William P. Bell, designer of the Bel-Air Country Club.

"I think our main appeal is (the traditional design of) our course," general manager Jeff Baker said. "We're not the typical desert-style course. A lot of other courses are surrounded by desert because of water restrictions. We were grandfathered in and we have our own well. When a shot goes wide on our course you aren't hitting off sand or gravel."

Along with the limited wa-

ter hazards, Baker said the vast tracts of grass help create a forgiving course that has been a hit with customers.

"I'm not a great golfer so I'm not a big fan of target courses," Baker said. "I prefer a larger open space where I can shoot off the fairway the next hole over if I screw up. We have a large number of seniors who golf here and they seem to enjoy that it's a more recreational course. You don't have to be a five handicap to play here."

Norman List, 69, said he's

golfed regularly at the Las Vegas Golf Club for more than five years as part of his activities with his senior center.

"It's a really nice course, there's friendly people and the price is fair," List said. "The course is real level — which is good for seniors — and it's kept in good condition. We also like that they let us walk the course. It's good exercise."

Only four years younger than Reno's Washoe Golf Club, the state's oldest course, the Las Vegas Golf Club underwent \$4 million of renovations

in 1999. The improvements included the construction of a new clubhouse, but course superintendent John Lanier Jr. said they have more work planned to keep the course in top shape.

"We're in the middle of redoing the bunkers right now which will cost about \$30,000," Lanier said. "It's a pretty big project where we're redefining the lips, getting rid of any contaminants in the bunker and adding new sand. After that we'll move on to the tee boxes and then some other general

landscaping projects."

With long term plans to keep the facility functioning in the condition their golfers have come to expect, Baker said new customers will be pleased with their experience on the historic course.

"I think people will be pleasantly surprised when they come out," Baker said. "We keep the course up well and we have a lot to offer."

To the north of Interstate 215 lies Green Valley High, the 2005 boys state champion and state runner-up in 2006.

To the south is Coronado, who has claimed two Sunrise Regional titles in the past five years — Green Valley owns the other three.

"To beat them is one of our goals every year," Green Valley coach Greg Murphy said. "It's a pretty good rivalry and will continue to be for a long time."

On Feb. 28, the sides renewed their annual conflict, as did the rest of the division, at Anthem Country Club. Coronado's home course was the site of the 2007 season opener.

by the end of May, but after today, we have a lot of work to do," Murphy said. "I'm not sure if we're at the top right now but it will separate itself throughout the year."

Both Murphy and Sawaia are interested to see how the new Nevada Interscholastic Activities Association format will affect their players. The NIAA moved from 9-hole head-to-head matches to 18-hole tournaments that feature every team in the division.

"Now we're going to see each other six times this year instead of two, so we'll see how that affects the rivalry," Sawaia said. "We do have a good rivalry and that's because both teams win. They get excited when we play each other."

A dark horse, however, has entered the fray.

Foothill finished second in the season opener by shooting a combined 327 — just seven shots shy of Coronado. Led by senior Canyon Springs transfer Matt Nolasco — the medalist shot a 61 at the tournament — the Falcons certainly aren't conceding the divisional title to its perennial powers.

"The boys played well in bad conditions," Foothill coach JD Fraser said. "Anytime you finish second in that division, you've had a good day. We've never been up there in seven years but this gives them the attitude that they have a chance."

The clinic featured the kids competing in contests on the court with pro players Amer Delic and Brian Wilson and the women's tennis team from Ohio Northern University.

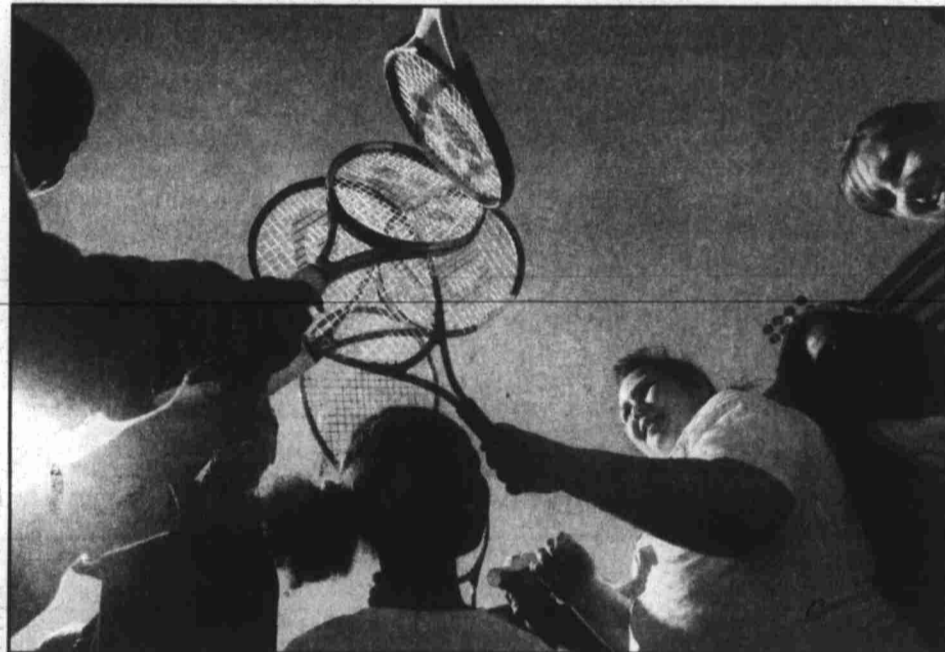
"I think it's fun," said Emma Ellis, a fourth grader at Ulis Newton Elementary School in Henderson. "It's my first time seeing tennis in person."

## Athletes undergo SPARQ test

Football, baseball, softball players go through on-field testing at Chaparral

Some were surprised and some were disappointed, but athletes attending the NIKE Team SPARQ Challenge at Chaparral left with a better understanding of their ability.

SPARQ — Speed, power, agility, reaction and quickness — of each athlete was measured by a series of challenges over the two-day period. The challenge showcased some of the area's top talents in football, baseball and softball.

"It's getting bigger and bigger every year," said Jesse Vincent, SPARQ field representative. "Last year, we tested Las Vegas High School and we were really excited to get back."

More than 100,000 athletes will be tested this year. Las Vegas and Henderson based teams, including Basic, Chaparral, Del Sol, Green Valley, Liberty and Palo Verde, contributed nearly 300 athletes.

In addition to the on field testing, the group collaborated with several local high school physical education programs and held classes during school hours. The effort was well received by the student body, said Hayden Ross, a physical education teacher at Chaparral.

"They were really excited about the program," Ross said. "They said they can't wait to come back and do a post-test."

Testing is sports specific. Baseball and softball players are tested by a medicine ball throw, vertical leap, 30-yard dash and shuttle run while football players are measured by a shuttle run, vertical leap, 40-yard dash and bench press repetitions.

"We'll use it in our camps," CCSN pitching coach Rich Ebarb said. "It gives you a good idea of what an athlete's ability is and it gets people motivated to see how they compare to kids around the

country."

Green Valley running back Frank Satterfield has received interest from Utah, UNLV and Wisconsin and hopes to add Southern California and UCLA to the list. Satterfield had mixed emotions of his recent test, partially due to poor weather conditions.

"I improved in some," Satterfield said. "I improved my bench. That was one of my main focuses. I did better in my shuttle at the NIKE Combine in Phoenix. I slipped a little here."

Satterfield ran a 4.5 second 40-yard dash in his track and field spikes before SPARQ officials said his type of spikes weren't allowed. Satterfield managed a 4.6 without them.

DelSol lineman Pat Mendes turned in the most impressive all-around performance of the day, recording a field high SPARQ rating of 74.43. SPARQ ratings are determined by an equation accounting for all four events.

"I was surprised a little bit on the vertical (jump) and my bench reps were the highest they've seen today," Mendes said. "I've just been working real hard."

Mendes did 27 reps of 185 pounds on the bench press while recording a 31.5-inch vertical leap. He clocked a 5.0 on the 40-yard dash.

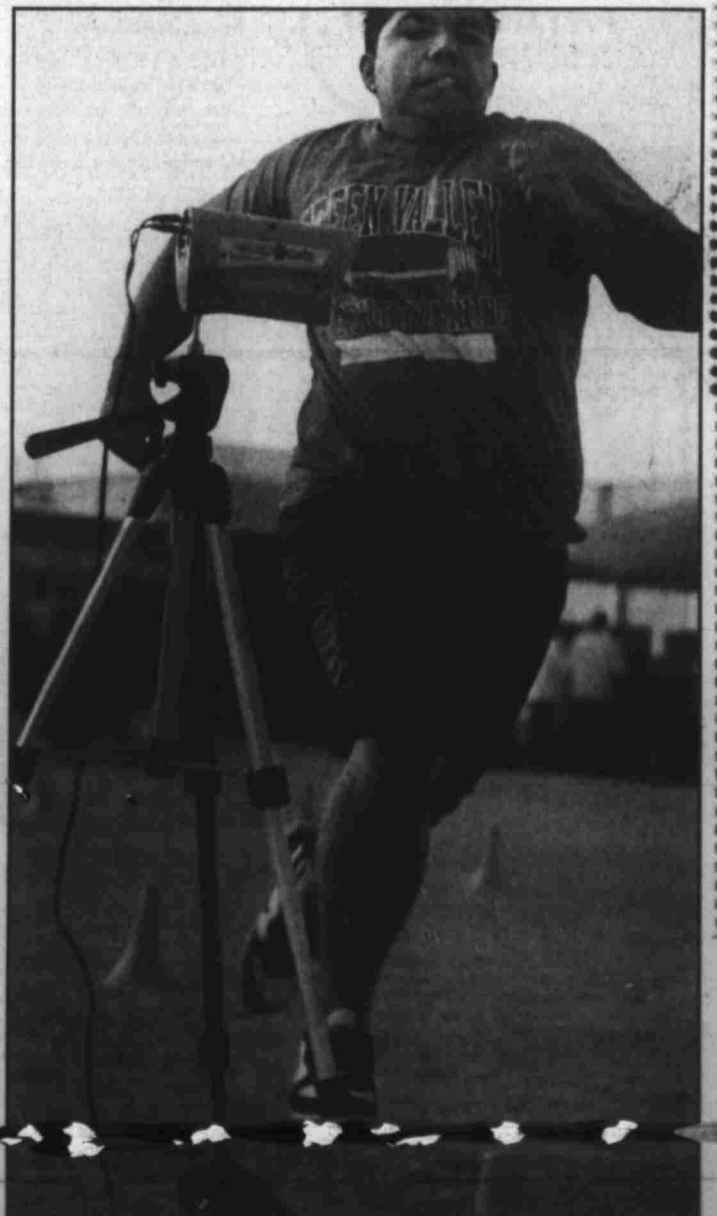
As for Moore's teammates, they said they had to move on.

"It's great to see the fans enjoying it," said UNLV coach Lon Kruger. "The way the seniors conducted their business, it kind of made it easy to cheer for them and turn out for them."

The crowd wasn't as rowdy as smaller crowds of years past have been — the "Reehh-bulls" chant sounded more like an off-stage choir than a chorus of 18,000 rabid fans — and many arrived late and left early, a testament to the number of folks who have moved here from Southern California since the last time the Thomas & Mack was this close to full for a UNLV basketball game.

The fans seemed to have more of a minor UNLV head cold than Runnin' Rebel Fever.

But the team did what it needed to do, which was win and impress, just as it did when more than 17,000 turned out for an overtime win against New Mexico Jan. 27.

And maybe some of

those fans, long since detached from alma maters in the faraway places they moved from, will give the team a shot.

It's been a long time since Las Vegas could call anything OUR team.

**OVERTIME:** The carnival is back in town. More than 160,000 people are expected to turn out to the NASCAR Nextel Cup Series race at the Las Vegas Motor Speedway this weekend. When they show up, they'll find a whole new track. Increased banking and a narrower track width will produce faster racing, and likely more crashes. The question is, will the reconstruction be as well-received as the 2003 rebuild at Homestead-Miami Speedway, or panned like the repaving done in 2005 at Lowe's Motor Speedway near Charlotte? After a fun three hours, we'll know Sunday afternoon.

# Gators track coach focused on improvement

For Green Valley High track coach Blaine Thompson, only one thing keeps him motivated — the kids.

Seeing his track and field athletes continue to get better on the field and in the classroom has been the biggest reward for the 43-year-old coach.

"One of the greatest things in the world is seeing the difference between where someone starts in the beginning, and where they are at the end," Thompson said. "And that can be a big difference."

Thompson said most of the time the biggest difference on the field comes in the first year.

"When a kid jumps from dead last to the middle of the pack, that is quite an improvement compared to starting in the top five and going to No. 1," he said.

Thompson is entering his 15th season as head track

coach for Green Valley and in order for him to help the kids, he demands respect.

During a recent practice he told the crowd of about 100 athletes that same point.

"No talent is worth dealing with (disrespect)," Thompson told his athletes, who said he would be willing to kick anyone off the team if they disrespect anyone.

For Thompson, respect is much more than just listening.

He said the 2003 boys state champion team and the girls team that won the southern zone his first year understood that.

"Listening is part of it, but they also had character, a willingness to compete. They gave it all they got and then were satisfied, happy with the results, because regardless they gave everything they had with no complaints, no disputes or blaming," Thompson said.

Fellow coach Robert Tilley,

who coaches the pole vaulters, said Thompson is very structured.

"He likes everybody to be able to follow the rules and stay in line," Tilley, 37, said. "And when it is time to get things done, he is the first to take control, to make sure that everybody is on the same page."

As hard as Thompson works his athletes, he also understands they are students.

Thompson said he tells the athletes every year there is a difference between a jock and an athlete.

He said a jock may be able to succeed on a field, but an athlete succeeds first in the classroom, then may be able to succeed on the field.

"I don't want anything to do with jocks," Thompson said.

Assistant distance runners coach Mark Fordney remembers a time when Thompson missed practice to help tutor a girl in geometry.

"I think he is tough, but

fair," Fordney said. "He honestly cares about the kids and wants them to excel."

As a math teacher, Thompson uses the basis of building blocks to help kids improve on the track.

Thompson grew up in Redland, Ore., about 30 miles from northwest of the Snake River. After lettering in three sports in high school, Thompson played cornerback for Oregon State and ran on the Beavers cross country club team.

While at Oregon State he realized he wanted to be a teacher and a coach.

"The whole time I was in college, the one thing that seemed to be consistent was that I was always involved, no matter the subjects, in teaching and coaching, in some form or another," Thompson said. "It dawned on me that is probably what I want to do."

Wagner feels that will be a recipe for success.

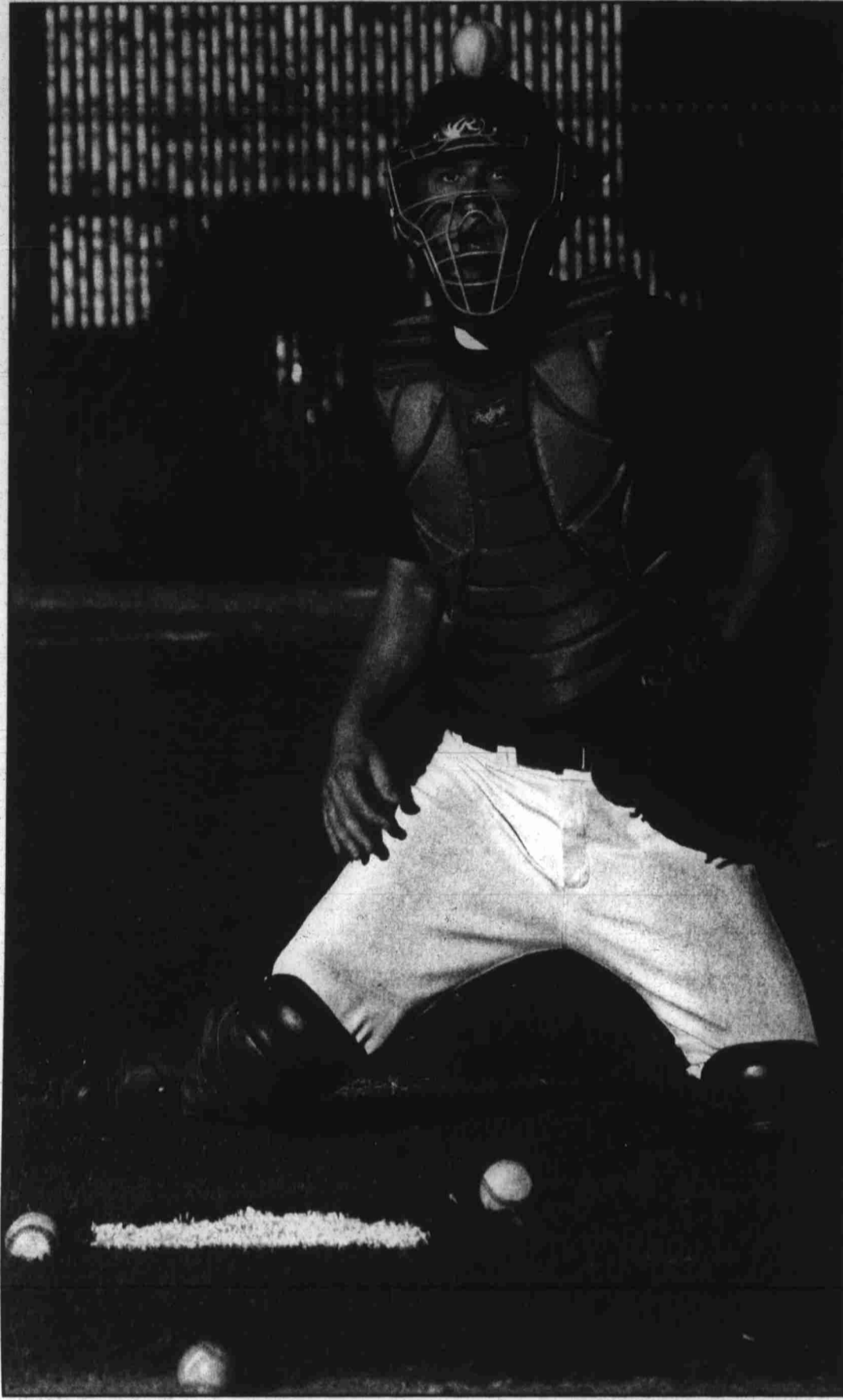
"We're not ready to go out and say all the things we're going to do this year and make predictions," Wagner said. "But if we do what we are capable of doing, we have a chance to do some real good things."

standpoint but we've made some adjustments," he said. "It's going to be a different brand of offense for us. We're going to have to rely a little more on solid pitching and solid defense. That's something we're stressing in these early practices."

Equestrian center marks first year

The South Point Events Center and Equestrian Arena will celebrate its first birthday on March 14 after holding more than 50 events during its first year of operation.

Events center General Manager Zandy Carnes said she has been pleased with the speed with which the center has established itself as a destination for premier events.

"I think the center has been a success because of the types of events we've been able to draw — especially recently," Carnes said. "We went through a growing process but it didn't take long before we were hosting a lot of world championship-type events. Instead of just hosting a competition, we're now hosting the championships and that's been very important for our growth."

The 4,400 seat arena and adjoining 80,000 square foot exhibition hall have been the location of a wide range of events, from barrel racing and bull riding to salsa dancing championships and monster truck rallies.

"Word-of-mouth has spread and brought a lot of new events our way," Carnes said. "We've become one of the most sought after locations by most major horse groups. They've told us they love our facilities, particularly because we're indoors. They don't have to worry about whether it's windy or rainy or cold."

Stephanie Wheeler, Show Manager for Blenheim Equisports, said its first event at the events center, the Las Vegas National World Cup Qualifying Grand Prix last November, was a success and has convinced Blenheim to return in April.

"I thought our event was a huge success and all our exhibitors told us they loved it," Wheeler said. "I think it's one of the best indoor facilities in the country. It really is a world class facility."

Wheeler said Blenheim had heard of the center's construction long before it was opened and booked its event a year in advance. In that first year it operated

its show out of 100 stalls. At the equestrian arena the following year they needed 600 stalls.

While the BMX championships held last summer has drawn the center's biggest crowd, traditional rodeo events as well as jarripeno, or Hispanic rodeo, events draw consistently strong crowds.

"We're trying to think outside of the box when it comes to scheduling new events," Carnes said. "We will always hold rodeo and horse events but we've had a lot of success with things like the monster trucks and salsa dancing. The salsa dancing really showed us what we can do because we hauled all the dirt out and put in a dance floor and lights. It went well."

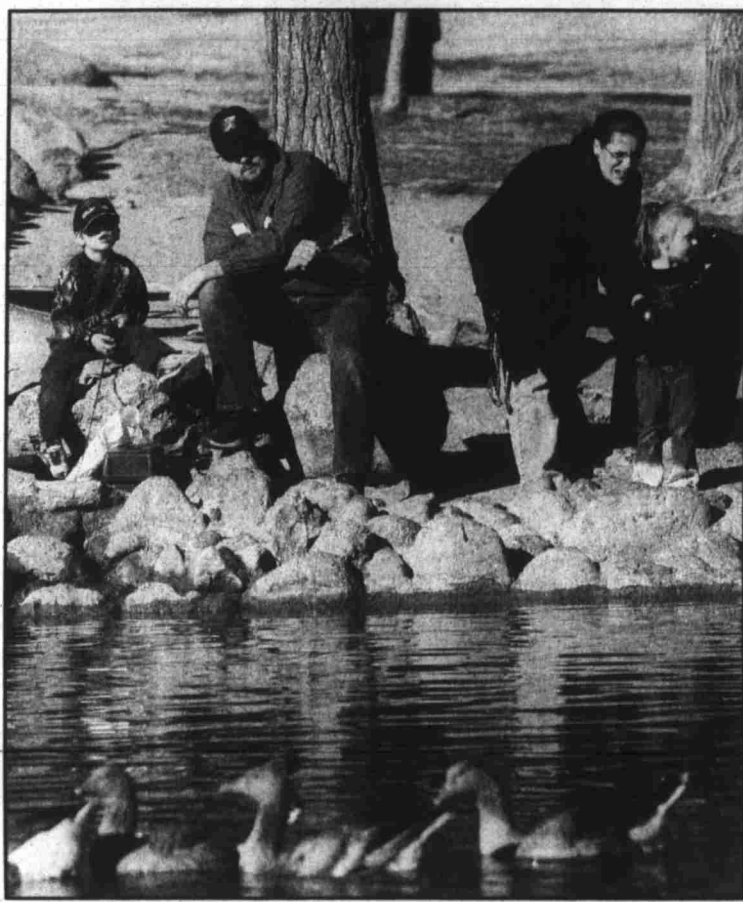
Carnes said the center is currently looking into modifying the arena to allow for concerts to be held there in the future.

"We really believe that every seat in the arena is a good seat and that it could make for a good concert location," she said. "Ideally we would hold the concerts in conjunction with another event. We'd hold the bull-riding championships and then follow with a concert. We want to satisfy as many audiences as we can reach."

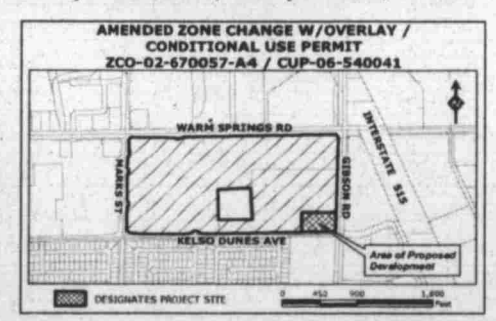

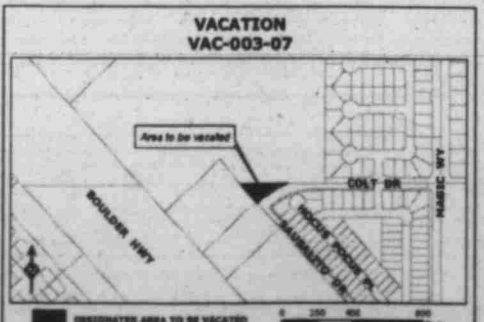

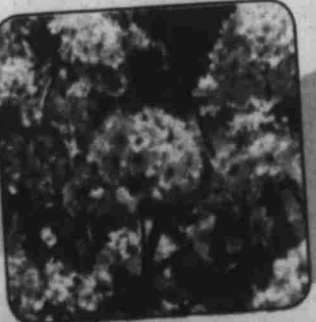

## Dialing up an alternative

*Area 108 reaching out for valley listeners tired of cookie-cutter pop music*

By KIRK BAIRD

When Larry Mac interviewed in November 2005 for the program/music director job at KVGs 107.9-FM, otherwise known as Area 108, he knew he was in for a challenge.

The station office was squeezed into a small office building, with a room slightly larger than two cubicles as its studio.

Its transmission power would be half that of some of its FM competition.

And there were no disc jockeys.

"The station was bare bones," he said. "But I worked at bare-bone stations before, at an AM station. And I worked at stations I would call 'signally challenged.'"

So the 15-year radio veteran knew what he was in for when he accepted the position, leaving his job at a successful hard rock station in Phoenix for the challenge of creating the closest thing to college radio Las Vegas has heard since UNLV's KUNV 89.7-FM went to an all-jazz format nearly a decade ago.

Nearly 18 months later, Mac acknowledges his work at Area 108 is still a struggle.

The station generally places in the bottom five in ratings.

The signal is weak enough that, depending on the part of the town, a radio may not be able to pick it up.

And, despite being on the air for more than a year, there are still many Las Vegas who have never heard of Area 108.

"Every day I get a phone call ... 'Hey man, I just found (your station). How long have you been here?'" said Mac, who can be heard from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. weekdays.

It's those calls, though, that give him encouragement that the station is being discovered. He's also optimistic about rumors the Federal Communications Commission will allow the station to boost its signal sometime this year.

Oh yeah, and Area 108 is now fully staffed with "people that are passionate about the music."

So when Mac sits at his desk and talks about how far the station has come, he can't help but smile.

"It's turning out pretty good," Mac said.

### Alternative radio

There are approximately 70 commercial alternative stations in the country — the majority of which are run by corporate media giants, such as Clear Channel, which owns KXTE 107.5-FM (Xtreme Radio), a hard rock/alternative station and Area 108's chief marketplace rival, along with more than 1,200 radio stations nationwide.

Mike Boyle, senior editor for trade publication Radio & Records, said even as alternative radio format remains strong and viable, there's increasing criticism that the lack of diversity in station ownership is hurting the format and radio in general with a "homogenization of sound."

"These big corporations have made them all cookie cutters," Boyle said. "They all sound the same."

Area 108, though, represents "a breath of fresh air," he said.

KVGs is owned by Riviera Broadcast Group, a small media group that also owns KOAS 105.7-FM (The Oasis), as

well as two other stations in Phoenix.

"There are a few real gems out there that will step out and not be cookie-cutter alternatives and take some changes and have some really diverse and interesting programming ... such as Area 108," Boyle said. "It is rare, but it's a breath of fresh air."

KVGs features a steady mix of 1980s and '90s college radio favorites, mainstream alternative and independent-label (indie) artists as well as new bands.

Listen long enough and you'll hear The Clash, Depeche Mode, Nirvana, The Cure, Pearl Jam, Talking

Heads, Bjork, Elvis Costello, Red Hot Chili Peppers, Foo Fighters, Soul Asylum, the Pixies, Ministry, Nine Inch Nails, Snow Patrol, Mazzy Star, the Charlatans UK, and Las Vegas bands-gone big the Killers and Panic! at the Disco.

Alternative music has become increasingly splintered into sub-genres, and everyone now has a different defi-

inition of what alternative is, Mac said.

"I'd like to think we meet a good portion of the definition, while still keeping our focus," he said.

Even if the station does feature some of the same bands as other stations, Mac said Area 108 tends to dig deeper into the group's catalogue to

of Piano Gallery of America, a combined learning institute and piano store in Summerlin, said students Feng's age usually take up to six months to learn the Mendelssohn piano

month. "It's quite amazing that she can put this together," he said.

It helps, though, that Bu will serve as guest conductor for the piece.

"I don't have to push the tempo, so I can kind of help her along the way," he said. "I think we're going to be OK."

Feng, who moved from her native China to the United States two years ago with her mother and stepfather, said playing piano was common where she grew up.

"For some reason, in China, everybody played piano," she said.

Feng's aunt, who was a piano instructor, was her first teacher. Even when Feng took a two-year break from piano, she would go back to practice on her own. Still, she never dreamed she'd stick with it.

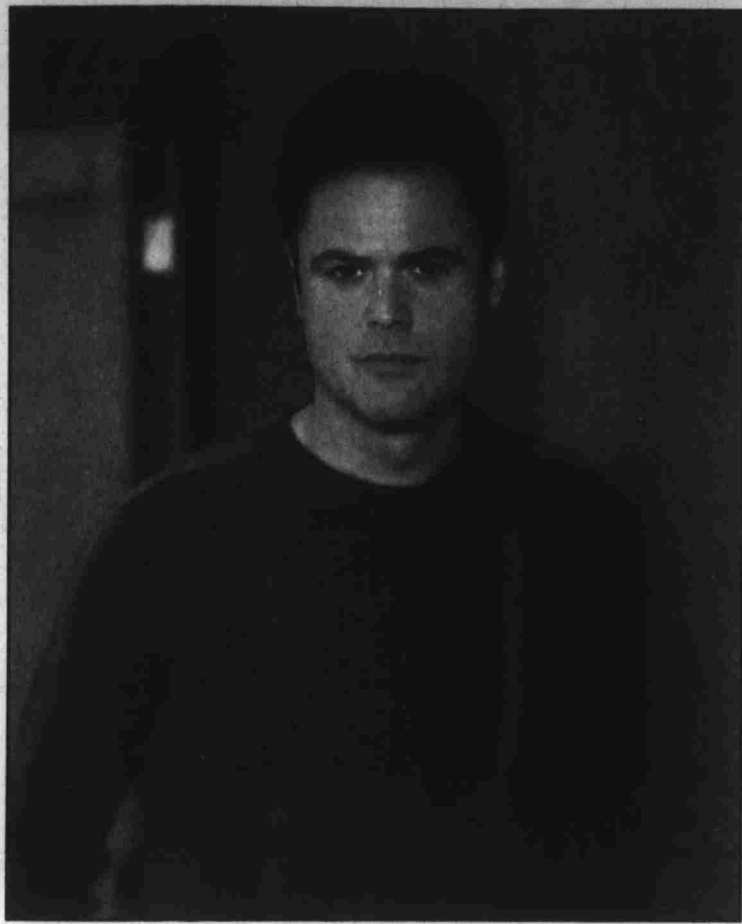

# Roses can grow strong in the Mojave Desert



Once the calendar indicates that spring is coming (even when the thermometer disputes it), many of us in Southern Nevada start thinking about roses. And how can we help ourselves? These plants produce some of the most beautiful flowers on earth. With more than 100 species, and countless cultivars and hybrids, there is a rose with the potential to succeed in virtually any situation, even the challenging Mojave.

Roses are generally sold as either bare root plants or container grown. It is a little late for the bare root style, since gardeners usually plant them in mid to late winter, assuming that the winter does not have sustained low temperatures. They are less likely to succeed if they get in the ground later than mid-February. On the other hand, it is possible to plant container-grown varieties throughout most of the year, except during the hottest part of the summer, when most people are trying to stay in the shade, anyway.

Many roses that are common in this area grow as shrubs. When selecting one for the garden, make sure it has at least three sturdy canes (stems) that are 14 to 18 inches long. As with any potted plant, check the roots and make sure that they are healthy, cream colored and firm before putting them in the ground.

The environment where the rose is going will be critical. The desert tends to be an infertile place; hence, it is a good idea to add compost to improve soil structure and general nutrition, along with a handful of superphosphate — for flowering —

in the planting hole. Some experts advise adding some blood meal, as well. Sulfur is often a good idea, as this will help to improve the pH balance. Many roses are grafted onto a rootstock of a different variety. The joint will be a slightly swollen area where the stems emerge. When planting a new rose, do not cover this grafted section.

The soil needs to be well drained, since roses should receive deep watering. Established plants will probably not require deep irrigation more than twice a week in the hot weather, and once a week otherwise. To avoid the foliar disease powdery mildew, it is best to limit the amount of water that gets on leaves. Drip irrigation or soaker hoses can help with that. Even though the soil will have been amended, roses generally need regular fertilization. During the spring, a rose fertilizer once a month is sufficient, and come the summer, use half the recommended dose. If the leaves become oddly colored, with dark green "veins" and paler green tissue in between, then the plant may be suffering from an iron, manganese or zinc deficiency. To correct this, add a chelated iron product with micro-nutrients.

There are lists of rose varieties that contend successfully with our difficult growing conditions, and the vendors who sell them. Both are available from the Cooperative Extension office, along with more detailed information on growing and pruning these beautiful, if somewhat labor-intensive plants.

# Family research to cost more



Riddle: Who can turn \$37 into \$125? Answer: The National Archives. The Federal Register (Vol. 72, No. 37) on Feb. 26 released a proposed increase in the National Archives fee schedule. As a rule, fee increases are expected; they aren't column-worthy. These are different. Take, for instance, the aforementioned \$37.

Just over a month ago I wrote a column praising the Civil War pension file of David H. Hazzard, which recorded the efforts of his wife Harriet to receive her widow's benefits after his death. I wrote that Harriet, "... created an archive proving three generations of the Hazzard family — mine for \$37."

Did I stick my foot in my mouth? The proposed fee schedule aims to turn the \$37 fee for ordering the "made-to-order-reproduction" (photocopy) of a Civil War soldier's full pension application file (Complete File) into \$125 for the same item. It doesn't matter if the file is a Hazzard-like 2 1/2 inches thick; or if it contains only 20 pages.

Specific fee increases include the following:

1. Passenger arrival lists (NATF Form 81) \$25 [currently \$17.25]
2. Federal Census requests (NATF Form 82) \$25 [currently \$17.50]
3. Eastern Cherokee applications to the Court of Claims (NATF Form 83) \$25 [currently \$17.50]
4. Land entry records (NATF Form 84) \$40 [currently \$17.75]
5. Full pension file more than 75 years old (Civil War period) (NATF Form 85) \$125 [currently \$37]
6. Full pension file more than 75 years old (non-Civil War)

(NATF Form 85) \$60 [currently \$37]

7. Pension documents packet (selected records) (NATF Form 85) \$25 [currently \$14.75]

8. Bounty land warrant application files (NATF Form 85) \$25 [currently \$17.25]

9. Military service files more than 75 years old (NATF Form 86) \$25 [currently \$17]

Most of the proposed increases aren't unreasonable. The National Archives (like the rest of us) has to pay power bills, maintenance, employees, etc. In addition, the National Archives building suffered heavy damage in last summer's flooding and was closed for two weeks.

The flow of document requests didn't stop during the closure; once they reopened, staff had a backlog of requests to fill in a damaged facility with reduced power. They finally may be back to normal by now, but only after several difficult months.

But to raise the cost of a Civil War pension file from \$37 to \$60 or \$125 eliminates any chance that many people will gain access to their ancestor's complete pension file. Most folks — even the most rabid genealogists — can think of better ways to spend \$125: like buying groceries for the week; filling the gas tank three times; or flying to Washington, D.C., and copying the file ourselves. Pricing our citizens out of their own history seems contradictory for a National Archives.

The proposed rule is due to take effect on May 29. However, the National Archives will accept public comments regarding the proposal until April 27. If no one objects, we can be assured the changes will go forward as planned. However, if the National Archives gets enough reasonable responses objecting

to a few specific changes, it may modify its request.

The proposal appears in two sections of the Federal Register:

- Rules: Public availability and use: Reproduction services; fee schedule, 8279-8280 [E7-3162]

- Proposed rules: Public availability and use: Reproduction services; fee schedule, 8327-8329 [E7-3160]

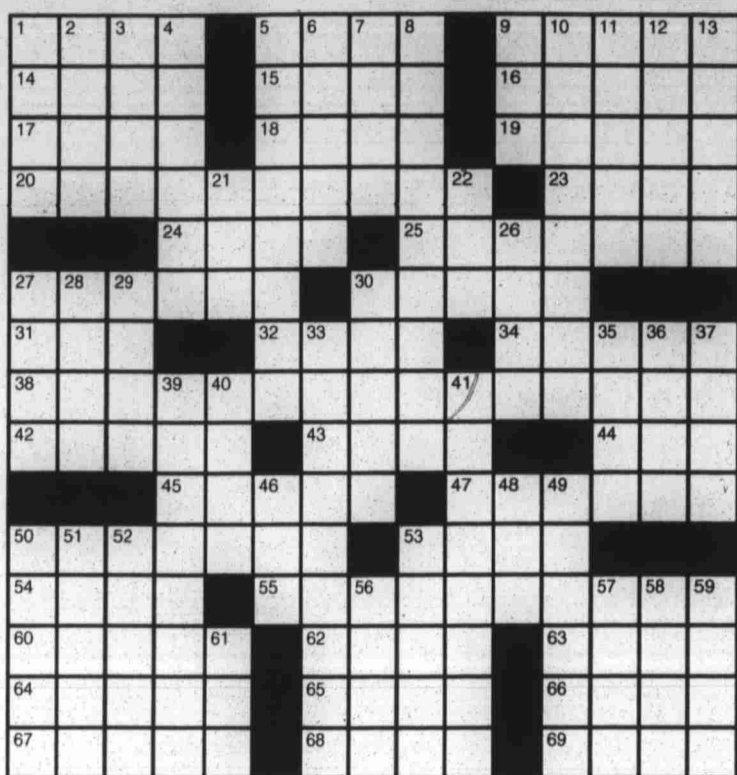

**Alternative radio station building audience**

unearth obscure or forgotten songs, rather than regurgitating hits. "We'll surprise you sometimes," he said. "But you know you're going to get alternative music."

It's the station's willingness to expand its playlist that attracted "Gonzo" Greg to Area 108.

"The radio industry doesn't want to take a chance," Greg said. "Anything risky, not safe, they're not going to try."

A 40-year-old disc jockey with more than a quarter century of radio experience, Greg left his job at an alternative/hard rock station in Indianapolis for KVG5. His a.m. drive-time show, Gonzo in the Morning, which airs 6-10 a.m. weekdays, debuted in February 2006.

The show has done well enough and is growing a dedicated following, much like Area 108 itself. And just like the station, Greg said the biggest challenge for his show is simple: being heard.

"The signal is a big issue that's being worked on," he said. "People like the station. I hope they find a way to listen."

**Signals**

When George McCabe first learned of Area 108 last summer, he felt an instant connection to the station.

"I love to hear New Order, Pearl Jam, Smashing Pumpkins," he said. "I like the fact they're in the market."

Still, he acknowledges getting frustrated with the station's weak transmission.

McCabe, who lives in Summerlin, said he often loses Area 108's signal during his drive to work on the 215 Beltway to Green Valley.

This reason, combined with the low ratings, is why McCabe, public relations director at Brown and Partners, an advertising and public relations firm, and other co-workers are hesitant to recommend their clients purchase advertising time on the station.

"It's ironic. We know the station as listeners, but we can't in good conscience let our clients advertise on that station for those reasons," he said. "Until their signal covers the entire market as strong as their competition, I think they will face some challenges."

Gonzo in the Morning show co-host Nicole Padberg, though, counters that the weak signal gives the station indie-cred.

"Not having a strong signal helps with the alternative vibe," she said.

Mac, however, takes an optimistic appraisal of Area 108's situation.

The ratings are a reflection of the station's signal strength, and when it boosts its transmission, he expects more listeners to tune in.

Until then, Mac said Area 108 will continue to employ a grassroots approach to increasing its audience, including street market teams, contests, a Web site club for listeners called Alien Nation, and, of course, a MySpace page; however, there is no budget for billboards or TV

"We're a real word-of-mouth station," he said.

It's a marketing plan not unlike that of a typical college radio station.

Mac likens Area 108's struggles to that of a college

station, too.

"In this market, we're the underdog," he said. "If you're a college radio station, you're

usually the underdog."
