(Mizfah) Each individual is an unrepeatable miracle. Each man's ignorance of God is greater than his knowledge of God. Hereafter? Have confidence. It's not the kind of reward we're used to. Rabbi Gold expressed great admiration for religious as nurses and teachers. Their religion has nothing comparable as the Orders founded in monastic times.
