

Schedule #3

Mardi Gras 74 was everything the Make implies. The Colosieum of Caesars Palace was suberly transformed into the most magnificent New Orleans Mardi Gras setting, through the efforts of Harry Finley & Fred Gibbons, "Flower Fashions of Beverly Hills". Guests entering the cocktail area were met by a large clown statue standing with multi-colored carnations at his feet. A garden effect was aided with fountains of colored water which had flowers floating in the pools. The entry was draped in a arch effect with ration Sikk & ballons. Red carpet led the way to the dance floor and stage, Vlarge candle-lit wood & wrought iron chandilier stanchions on each side, which flickened softly thru out the entire evening. The entire Mardi Gras room was done with trellis arches & brick backdrops which had hanging flower pots. Carnival masks, clowns, ballons & old Mardi Gras carnival posters gave a real festive air. The ceiling was draped with 3 large chandiliers done with yards & yards of wide brilllient colored wide silk, which was brought up with ballons & satin ribbons clustered & desending from the centers. The tables were each draped with a different colored tablecloth, picking up the colors of the ceiling. On each center pieces of candles & fresh flowers which were, carnations, mums & dutch iries giving a very elegant setting. On the stage the King & Queen throngs reinged among clowns & court jesters.
