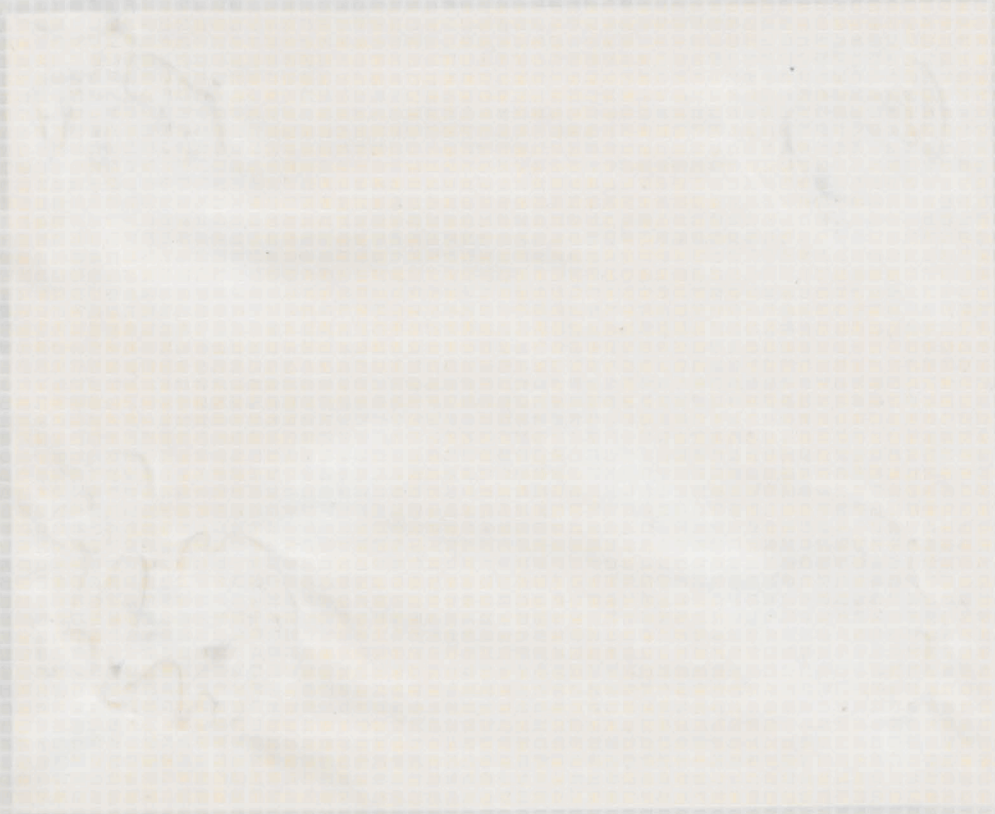

"HUMAN RESPECT"

Human respect has a rather technical meaning in religious terminology. It sounds nice but it is not meant to have a flattering connotation. It is used to describe the motive of those whose actions are influenced by public opinion.

Many a noble resolution has been dampened by fear of "What would people think?" When one is motivated by a desire to please men rather than by his convictions then he is a victim of what is known as human respect.

The man who works satisfactorily only under supervision is known as an "eyeserver." He is concerned only with making an impression on the "Boss." A "hiring," the Scripture would call him.

A public servant who succumbs to this temptation becomes the object of very graphic criticism. He won't take a stand lest he might incur the disfavor of one side or the other. They say of him that he "Carries water on both shoulders."

He who would attempt to teach the Gospel and indulges in platitudes lest he might give offense or impair his own popularity by specific pronouncements, falls into the same category. The "dos and don'ts" of the commandments cannot be conveyed by "doctrines fashioned to the varying hour."

There is little promise in a policy of human behavior that makes for avoiding controversy. There is something insipid about neutrality.

Our Lord Himself had very emphatic words to say about it — "Because thou art neither hot or cold, I begin to vomit thee out of my mouth."

And again He says "He that is not with me, is against me and he that gathereth not with me, scattereth."

A scholarly but wise man advised "Above all to thy own self be true and it must follow as the night, the day, thou canst not then be false to any man."

ROSE DE LIMA HOSPITAL PLANNING \$1½ MILLION EXPANSION

Rose de Lima Hospital, the pride of this city in medical life because of its widespread reputation as the only accredited hospital in this area, made it known this week that it is planning an expansion program that will cost approximately a million and a half dollars.

The enlargement will feature some 40 more bedrooms, a tumor research and treatment clinic for Cancer patients, and several operational features that will bring the institution up to complete modernity.

The additional structures will be built behind the present hospital layout in order to maintain peace and quiet, rather than to build along the BMP highway sector of the hospital's land.

Funds for the gigantic venture will be raised from private and public sources, a large part of it due to come from the federal government.

'Not What Is Done But Motive' Is Important To Community, Remarks Prelate Before Crowd at Henderson

Henderson, Nev.—The Diocese of Reno surged past another milestone of progress Oct. 15 when dedication ceremonies for the Rose de Lima hospital were conducted here, with the Most Rev. Thomas K. Gorman, Bishop of Reno, officiating.

Testifying to their enthusiastic well-wishing for the new institution, scores of local ministers, civic dignitaries, and representatives of Southern Nevada societies were in attendance.

The day's varied program began with the Community Mass celebrated by the Bishop in the hospital chapel, following which he blessed and erected the stations of the cross.

The actual dedication ceremony began at 3 o'clock, terminating with outdoor Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Huge floral offerings, the gift of Southern Nevada florists, banked and surrounded the altar.

Bishop Gives Main Address

Bishop Gorman was the principal speaker at the civic ceremony held after Benediction. He told his listeners of his high commendation of the Sisters of St. Dominic of Adrian, Mich., who will conduct the hospital, with Sister Mary Carolyn as superior.

Pointing out that the dominant note in the liturgy for the blessing of hospitals is that Christ is served through the care of the sick, he declared that there is infinitely more in the care of the sick than mere technical skill.

"It is not what you do, but the manner in which and the motive by which you do it," the Bishop said. "The sisters are dedicated to the care of the sick for the love and service of God."

The prelate recalled also that Nevada's first hospital had been erected in Virginia City and placed under the care of the Sisters of Charity.

Each speaker stressed aspects of the contribution to Southern Nevada that would be made by a new hospital, commended the Catholic diocese for its evidences of vital growth, and congratulated the Sisters of St. Dominic on their pioneer responsibilities in Nevada.

Representative groups of sisters were present from Phoenix, Casa Grande, Winslow, and Kingman, Ariz.; Santa Cruz and Los Angeles, Calif.; Las Vegas, Nev.; and Adrian, Mich., including Mother General Mary Gerald, who was accompanied by Sister Mary Edmund, the mother-house's novice mistress and sister of the hospital's superior.

The clergy were entertained at a luncheon held in the Henderson rectory and at dinner served in St. Joan of Arc's rectory in Las Vegas.

Both a hospital and a clinic are operated as a service to approximately 10,000 residents of Henderson, Victory Village, Carver Park and nearby Pittman and Whitney. In addition, they are generally serving southern Nevada.

The Sisters of St. Dominic operate hospitals and schools throughout the United States. Through the efforts of Father Peter V. Moran they came here to take over the operation of the hospital. Father Moran, pastor of

St. Peter's church in Henderson, worked for nearly a year in getting the establishment under their operation to assure the people of the community of adequate medical services.

A luncheon for the staff and those who have made operation of the hospital possible, supervised by Chef Rom, of El Rancho Vegas, and with the cooperation of Mrs. Ray Ingle, wife of the laboratory technician of the hospital, will precede the dedication.

Rose de Lima Hospital Dedicated At Formal Ceremony Wednesday

"This hospital is dedicated to the treatment of all races and creeds by any and all accredited physicians."

This was the keynote statement yesterday afternoon by Dr. Gerald Sylvain, president of the Clark County Medical society, one of several speakers who participated in the elaborate dedication of Rose de Lima Hospital in Henderson. The hospital was taken over June 27 by the Sisters of St. Dominic, of Adrian, Michigan.

Dr. Sylvain was one of a group of speakers which included Al E. Cahlan, managing editor of the Las Vegas Evening Review-Journal.

The program started at 3 p. m. on the green and spacious lawn of the hospital, the speakers appearing in front of a specially created purple altar.

Cahlan, speaking on behalf of the people of Clark county, said he represented Governor Vail Pittman and the Colorado River commission of Nevada, and that "it was felt that the Sisters of St. Dominic had done a wonderful job and that great credit was due Father Peter V. Moran, pastor of St. Peter's church in Henderson who worked wholeheartedly to bring the Sisters here.

"The governor, the Colorado River commission and the Las Vegas Evening Review-Journal will give continued support to the operation of the institution," Cahlan told more than 200 prominent citizens of Nevada and other states who had gathered for the exercises.

Dr. Kenneth F. Smith, chief of staff, said he "wished to congratulate the Sisters of St. Dominic on the organization and operation of the hospital," and that he "felt it a personal honor" to serve with them in his present capacity.

Other speakers were: His Excellency, The Most Reverend Thomas K. Gorman, Bishop of Reno; Fred A. Unsworth, Henderson property manager; Reverend George Patterson, pastor Community church, Henderson; Rev. Howard Davis, pastor St. Timothy's Episcopal church, Henderson; Colonel John R. Reilly, war assets administration; Edwin D. Hickman, bishop of the L. D. S. church, Henderson; Monsignor James B. Empey, pastor St. Ann's church, Las Vegas; Monsignor John J. Lambe, pas-

tor, St. Joan of Arc's church, Las Vegas.

Bishop Gorman, who was introduced by Monsignor Lambe, spoke in glowing terms of the reputation of the Sisters of St. Dominic through several hundred years of kindly treatment and ministrations to the sick. He said that "the coming of the Sisters of St. Dominic to southern Nevada is a joy to our hearts. They are not in our debt, but we owe them more than we can tell."

He gave an outline of the history of the order, saying that the name of the hospital comes from its first American canonized saint, Saint Rose of Lima.

Colonel Reilly, in telling how efforts were made by the war assets administration to expedite the transfer of the former Basic Hospital, operated during the war years by the government, to the Sisters, said that they had been given "a losing proposition which they have turned into a community asset," and that they are to be congratulated on the work they have done and are doing.

Francis Heher, Henderson civic leader, was master of ceremonies. One of the features was the singing of Dr. Chester C. Lockwood, a member of the staff who sang "Panis Angelicus."

Those who gathered to play a part in the dedication came from Nevada, Michigan, Arizona and California.

Mother Mary Gerald, head of the Dominican order, of Adrian, Michigan, came here for the dedication, one of several she has attended on the west coast.

Among those present were: Reverend Dr. George Eagleton, of Reno, who accompanied Bishop Gorman; Fathers Alfred McMullen, Tonopah; Eugene J. McCarthy, Winslow, Arizona; Michael Mee, St. Columbans, Nebraska, temporarily in Boulder City; Florence Flahive, Eureka; Joseph B. Heffner, Kingman, Arizona, and groups of Nuns from Santa Cruz and Oakland, California, Kingman, Winslow, Casa Grande and Gilbert, Arizona, and the state of Michigan.

The ceremonies lasted approximately an hour and a half. Father Moran gave the welcoming address.

Prior to the dedication, a luncheon was held at the hospital for members of the staff, clergy and many visiting dignitaries, supervised by Chef Rom of El Rancho Vegas. Mrs. Ray Ingle, wife of the laboratory technician, was in charge of arrangements. Highlight of the luncheon was a cake in the exact replica of the hospital, created by Chef Rom.

The fourth degree assembly of the Knights of Columbus provided an escort for Bishop Gorman while he blessed the hospital.

Prior to the ceremonies, the Catholic activities committee of the Knights of Columbus, of which J. M. Hiegel is chairman, and John Burke, Frank Paola, Ed Joyce, Charles McNamara, Jerry King, Grant Ray and Pat Heher are members, worked at renovating the institution for the ceremonies.

The Sisters today expressed thanks to the Knights of Columbus for their generous work, and the residents of Las Vegas, Boulder City and Henderson for the many beautiful floral arrangements presented for the occasion. They also expressed appreciation to residents of Clark county for their kindness and cooperation in helping them make the hospital a success.
