Now, eighty years later we have just begun to look upon the creations of Isadora Duncan and Ruth St. Dennis as masterpieces of our past. St. Dennis was complimented by the works of her students who followed to become the founders of American Modern Dance; Martha Graham, Doris Humphries, Charles Weidman, and Helen Tamaris.

Today, more than three quarters of a century after the initial stirrings of St. Dennis and her part-
