

HISTORY OF HENDERSON

JERICHO HEIGHTS (By Rachel M. (Rae) Von Domum)

"The wildcat real estate promotions around Las Vegas would be humorous except for the fact that most of the 'suckers' can't afford to lose," stated Emmett Donovan in a Los Angeles Record editorial, October 2, 1930.

"For a comprehensive picture of Las Vegas real estate promotions, board Jim Cashman's sedanfor a trip to the damsite, 28 miles away. It is about 33 miles by the auto road. One is soon out of Las Vegas proper and therein is the rub," Donovan continues.

"The city is built in an area of approximately one and a half square miles---the city limits cover 14 square miles. It all looks great on a salesman's map, too. The dry washes, the gullies, the acres covered with hard gypsite, through which water will not penetrate, are not shown. Naturally!

"At the end of the five or six blocks that form Fremont Street, the main stem, trees bloom infertile soil irrigated by the underground springs. And then—the car has not moved more than 50 feet but here is dry, hard desert! And it remains that until the arrival at the river.

"But the fact that the soil is bad and the prospects worse does not deter subdividers. Oh, no! One passes tract after tract. And the names—they sound swell!

"JERICHO HEIGHTS, for instance, is ten miles outside of town, a couple of shacks and an artesian well. There you buy 'business lots' for a hundred or so dollars. The new highway will run through there to the construction town. It is the nearest patented land to this town, the government having closed the rest. Cashman's driver, who takes a daily trip, laughs as he regales his passengers with stories of the suckers."

Mr. Donovan wouldn't have believed that the "couple of shacks and an artesian well," which he looked upon as "sucker bait" at Jericho Heights were the beginning of a city which would become known as the Industrial Center of Nevada.


He could have learned the other side of the story by talking with Jim Cashman, but it wouldn't have made a sensational editorial. Donovan apparently looked but didn't listen, and his writing indicates that his perception was none to perfect.

What Donovan actually saw at Jericho Heights was a good-sized square building, a small cottage, and a windmill on a wooden tower. The windmill is gone, but the "couple of shacks" and wooden tower are still in use.

James Cashman was well acquainted with the entire Southern Nevada area. He had owned and operated half a dozen businesses in Searchlight during the 20 years before Donovan wrote his "deathless prose." These included the Searchlight Garage, Eldorado Canyon Auto and Truck Line, Western Telephone System and a stage line carrying passengers, express and mail between Searchlight, Las Vegas and Nipton, and a truck line from Searchlight to Kingman.

In 1912, Cashman saw the need for a road from Nevada to Arizona and he and Jack McCready constructed and started operation of a ferry across the Colorado river in the area now known as Cotton-



wood Cove, connecting the road between Searchlight and Chloride, Arizona. This ferry remained in use until roads were constructed on each side of Boulder Dam and Cashman started another ferry above the dam.

The first industrial activity in Nevada's Industrial Center occurred during World War I when operation of the Three Kids Mine, later known as Manganese, Inc., was started to supply manganese for the U. S. Government after manganese imports were halted.

Jim Cashman contracted to haul the ore from the mine to the railroad at Las Vegas, and worked on the

job as transportation boss.

Equipment used on the job included a C. L. Best track layer pulling three big wagons and a fleet of one ten-ton and 16 five-ton White Trucks. The track layer hauled 42 tons and made the round trip in 20 hours. It made its own road across the desert and the foot-wide steel rims of the wagon wheels smoothed and packed the road for the trucks.

Rodney Colton was sent here by the U. S. Government in 1918 to work at the Three Kids Mine, and was employed as driver of the track layer. At that time the only habitation in what is now the City of Henderson was that of R. B. Jefferson, one of the

Three Kids, who had a ranch in the area.

According to Colton, who remained in Southern Nevada and served on the Clark County Board of Commissioners from 1940 to 1965, the truck drivers and track layer often had to make the half-mile trip from the road to Jefferson's place for water as there was none available elsewhere on the route.

After the mine closed in 1919, five years elapsed before anyone else became interested in the area. This was T. Alonzo Wells, an attorney, who visited Las Vegas in 1922 and returned with his family the

following year.

Wells was a man of many talents, one of which was vision, and he shared the faith of other residents that Boulder Dam would become a reality. He knew that a more direct highway would be built than the one which then wound its way across the valley, skirting the base of Sunrise Mountain and then crossing to the pass at the southern end of Black Mountain and continued across the dry lake in Eldorado Valley to Searchlight.

Feeling that he should explore the area this future highway would traverse, Wells went to the farthest point from the center of Las Vegas which he thought would remain a permanent part of the existing road. This spot is now known as 25th and Fremont Streets. Assisted by his three sons, Wells spent his weekends running a survey from this point to the area of the pass. This proved to be a very profitable enterprise.

When the survey line reached the point where it crossed Jefferson's Ranch, Wells and his sons became acquainted with Jefferson, and subsequently

with his problems.





Jefferson said he had a well with good drinking water; however, it was in such bad repair that it was becoming unusable. He told Wells that if he and his sons would make the necessary improvements on the well, he would give him 250 acres of land as payment. Wells, who was certain the new highway would cross this property, accepted the offer and thereby became the second property owner in what is now the City of Henderson. The youngest son, Lewis W. Wells, who now operates a Texaco Station in Pittman, recalls that he was nine years old at the time and he still remembers the long, hot weekends spent with his father and brothers in 1924 working on Jefferson's well. The well, he says, was about eight feet square, dug down to where the old pipe had rusted through and could be cut off and sealed. From this main shaft, laterals were dug in three directions and the whole chamber sealed with cement to create an underground storage tank. A new pipe was sunk down to the water table, then the top of the chamber was sealed and a new pipe extended to the surface. This well furnished water for the community for almost 20 years.

After President Calvin Coolidge signed the Boulder Dam Bill, Dec. 21, 1928, Jefferson lost little time in taking advantage of his unique location on the new highway, midway between Las Vegas and the

Dam site.

He had constructed a small dwelling in 1927 and early in 1929, with a partner named Bearden, he subdivided a 40 acre tract which was called Jericho Heights. Chauncey L. "Chan" Nay cleared and leveled the streets using a Fresno and four mule team. Nay recalls that the tract office and windmill tower were constructed before the streets were cleared. Bearden Ave. and Jefferson St. were named for the two subdividers.

Jericho Heights boasted one of the first air strips in Clark County, which was situated between the tract and the highway. It was also the camp site of the first crew of engineers to arrive at the Black Canyon

Project.

The tract office at Jericho Heights did a land office business after work was started on the railroad to the Dam, but few of the patrons were interested in land. This building doubled as a "speakeasy" where weary workers could wash the desert dust out of their throats.

Lewis Construction Company built the railroad, which was completed in September 1931, and Ed "Hook-Em-Up" Higbee of Hiko was subcontractor of the railroad grade which was also built with four-mule teams and Fresnos. Higbee's workers lived in a tent camp, which moved as the grade progressed toward Black Canyon, and these workers found Jericho Heights a real oasis, which was also frequented by workers from other parts of the area.

Real estate sales moved more slowly and only five families moved into the new subdivision during the first year of its existence. Most of the early residents lived in boarded-up tents as few people were financially able to construct a house during this part of "the depression."







When actual work on the dam was started, Jericho Heights became a thriving community. Prohibition agents put an end to the illicit traffic in liquor and the name was changed to Midway City.

The town was doubled in size in 1931 when T. Alonzo Wells and his wife, Maude, subdivided the Sierra Vista City addition, which straddled the high-

way adjacent to Midway City.

Many of the residents returned to their former homes when construction of the dam was completed. Others remained to make their permanent home in Midway. A few years later all of Jefferson and Bearden's land, including the unsold lots in the original subdivision, was sold to T. Alonzo Wells and Clark County Sheriff M. E. "Gene" Ward.




