Russia's Cutoff of Manganese to U.S. Spurs B.M.I. Rumors

Newest rumor making the rounds of Henderson this week and which might possibly carry some water is the fact that Uncle Sam may order some of the manganese units back into action at the BMI plant, all as a result of the latest rift in Russian-U. S. relations.

Facts to back this up came with the official census bureau report for April, just disclosed this week. That Russia had completely stopped shipments of manganese and chrome to the U. S. during

April. This was the first instance since January, 1948, that this country had not received these two vital steel-hardening metals from Russia.

The United States has been stockpiling manganese and chrome against a war emergency. Anticipating that Russia might stop shipments, it also has been developing sources of supply in Africa, India and Brazil.

Crawford Pictures Henderson Home-Owned Plan; Now Under Consideration of State Officials

Henderson people this week heard a formula that is now under consideration by the governor, the attorney general, the War Assets Administration and the Colorado River Commission—a formula that would provide for the first step toward self government by the people of Henderson.

As explained by James Crawford, of the CRC, and with John Mueller, a designer of the plan, the immediate plan is to set up a non-profit municipal corporation which would take over the administration of Henderson during a transition period for a year or so during a time when buying and selling of properties would be taking place between private purchasers and the state.

A governing board would be set up, composed of six members being appointed by the CRC, three elected for one year by the prospective purchasers, and the chairman appointed by the government. The CRC would oversee the election of the three. There would be no pay involved.

This board would act as the agency handling the property transfers, it would collect rentals, purchase water, sewerage disposal, and would make regular reports to the CRC. It would handle the initial steps in obtaining a permanent charter for the city and conduct an election and turn over all utilities to the new government. It would render a final accounting to the commission.

The property would be sold without a down payment and at rates of payment equal to the ability to pay. No speculation would be allowed. Only qualified purchasers would be eligible to buy, and the definition of a qualified purchaser has still to be worked out.

The overall objective is to preserve for peacetime development this area where industrial possibilities are imminent. State and city and county tax revenues will also result.
