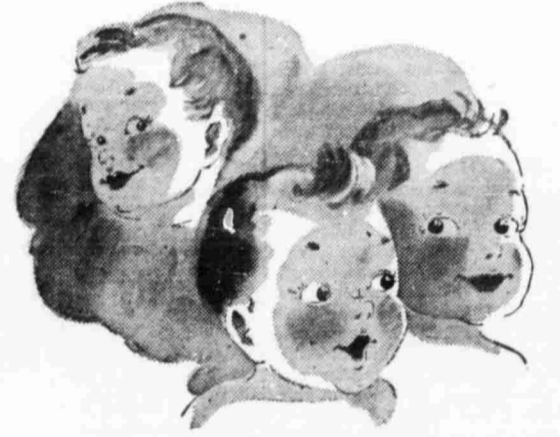
The main line of the water system has been laid, Dickson said, and many of the residents are already connected.
