Not realizing the awful thing I was doing, I explained that with 50 cents he could win \$2000, \$3000, \$4000 or even more! Where's Morrie now? Oh, he's somewhere downtown playing BINGO!

Latest news is the new LAS VEGAS CLUB. It happened Sunday night, June 26, when the VEGAS CLUB paid out its \$2500 PROGRESSIVE BLACKOUT GAME to a Vegas player. And it took just 48 numbers! Cecil Lynch, manager, after paying this \$2500 plus a \$500 Progress Opening Game the week before and another \$325 game the first week he opened, declared, "Everybody wins at the Vegas Club. There's nothing to it!"

Then there the BOULDER CLUB, which last Thursday, June 23, paid out its \$5550 BLACKOUT GAME in 54 numbers. There were four winners, and one of them was from Henderson. While the game was going, the BOULDER CLUB literally stacked 'em in, with players upstairs, downstairs, in the aisles, on the floor, on the stairs, and even in the alley. But even so, Managers Wayne Stewart and "Tex" always managed to find a place for any late comers.

Well, here's what we've all been waiting for, the time, amounts and places of those big PROGRESSIVE BLACKOUT GAMES. They were checked Thursday morning just before press time, and naturally are subject to being won Thursday afternoon or evening.

Times of the PROGRESSIVE BLACKOUT GAMES are the same at all the clubs, 3:00 p.m., 10:00 p.m. and 12 midnight, with the exception of the BOULDER CLUB, which does not have an afternoon game except on Sunday.

Largest amount ever paid out in a BLACKOUT GAME was \$6500 by the BINGO CLUB, August, 1948, in 53 numbers. Fewest numbers ever called were 47, Jan. 1, 1949, at the BINGO CLUB.

The new raised platform for callers at the NUGGET is a decided improvement and has resulted in much favorable comment by the players.

## MUELLER READY TO FILE DEED FOR 'NEW' HENDERSON

Henderson is now officially a state owned community, no longer under the supervision of the U. S. government, unless payments aren't made in the future, and John Mueller, plant manager, is just returned from Washington after having signed for the changeover. From now on, the state will attempt to sell to industry and to private enterprise any and all property it can dispose of—for the best interests of the community.

This includes, lots, homes, stores. The state is now in business—in the business of selling to all who will buy a piece of a gigantic war built plant. Should

the selling plan be a success, Nevada will have accomplished an almost impossible dream — to bring industry to the desert.

Right now with the world prices of manganese going up, despite the fall of prices on lead and zinc, it makes the manganese ore setup in Henderson an encouraging one, with the picture due to get brighter immediately as orders for shipments come in from all sides. Russia's failure to ship the precious product to our shores has also helped in setting Henderson into the spotlight.

Clark County will soon file suit on the Colorado River Commission, seeking payment of taxes that have been collected from business firms and house holders in Henderson, the NEWS learned today.

According to information obtained in Henderson, all money collected for taxes is in the hands of the Reconstruction Finance Corporation which will in turn pay the county.

Last year the county received \$120,000 in lieu of taxes from the government. Now, with state ownership, only about \$25,000 is to be the amount the county would get.

Henderson officials are concerned over the drop in tax revenues for the state and county, too, and they point to the \$1000 veterans preference exemption bill which will slice deeply into the amount of money which had been anticipated as being collectable.
