ack to camp. An amendment to the law now nakes it read:

"Upon killing of any deer said icensee shall immediately write the place, date and time of day of such killing, punch out the day and month of such killing on said tag and attach the original of said tag to the horns of such deer and keep the same attached thereto turing the open season and for a period of ten days next succeed ing the close of the open season; provided that if a deer is taken in such a locality that the tag, if attached immediately, is liable to mutilation or destruction en route to vehicle or camp, it will be suf-ficient to punch the original tag year ago-"and then forgotten, mmediately and attach the tag on eaching such vehicle or camp. Under the new laws as adopted at the recent session of the legis-

ature, the fish and game commissioners are authorized to deter mine whether or not any valida-tion procedure shall be required. If validation procedure is determined to be necessary, or convenient, they are authorized to determine the procedure to be followed and the officers or agencies authorized to make such validation.


