## Orthopedic Clinic at Rose de Lima Hospital Becomes a Reality for Entire Community

Richard was case No. 1 when Dr. Ross Sutherland opened the first of his weekly sessions on August 23. Devoted to orthopedic treatment but not limited to children, or to this area exclusively, the Clinic is scheduled for every Tuesday from 8:00 to 10:00 a.m. Appointments may be made through the doctors' offices, telephone 630.

At a staff meeting prior to the beginning of office hours Dr. Sutherland outlined the beginnings of the famous Tichenor Orthopedic Clinic in Long Beach, California, of which he is now chief surgeon. Opened in a basement storeroom, in 1926, with volunteer help, the Tichenor Clinic has grown until today it is considered a model of its kind, with one whole floor of a local hospital devoted to polio cases alone.

The Rose de Lima Orthopedic Clinic will have at its disposal the equipment used at the hospital, the services of the technicians and nurses, as well as those of the local doctors. The fee schedule has been set at cost, according to the individual ability to pay in each instance, it was announced by the superintendent of the Rose de Lima Hospital, with emphasis upon the fact that the Orthopedic Clinic is a non-profit, community project.
