For the benefit of the ladies I have a very excellent Cruller recipe today—one that is a favorite of many during the holidays—

an extremely easy one to make and a "husbands favorite."

2 tablespoons shortening, ½ tsp. grated nutmeg, 1 cup sugar 2 eggs well beaten, ½ tsp. salt, 4 cups sifted flour, 1 cup cream or 1 cup undiluted canned milk, 3½ tps. baking powder.

Cream shortening and sugar together until thoroughly mixed. Add eggs and beat well. Sift dry ingredients together and add alternately with cream to creamed mixture. Mix thoroughly. Place dough on floured board and pat and roll to ¼ inch thickness, cut into (6x1) inch strips. Twist dough and press ends together. Fry a few at a time in hot deep fat (360 degrees F.) until brown and drain on absorbent paper. Dust with confectioner's sugar. Makes 2 dozen crullers.

A neighbor of mine made this recipe the other evening and I had a sample of it. It is very delicious and I'm sure you will enjoy it as much as I have.

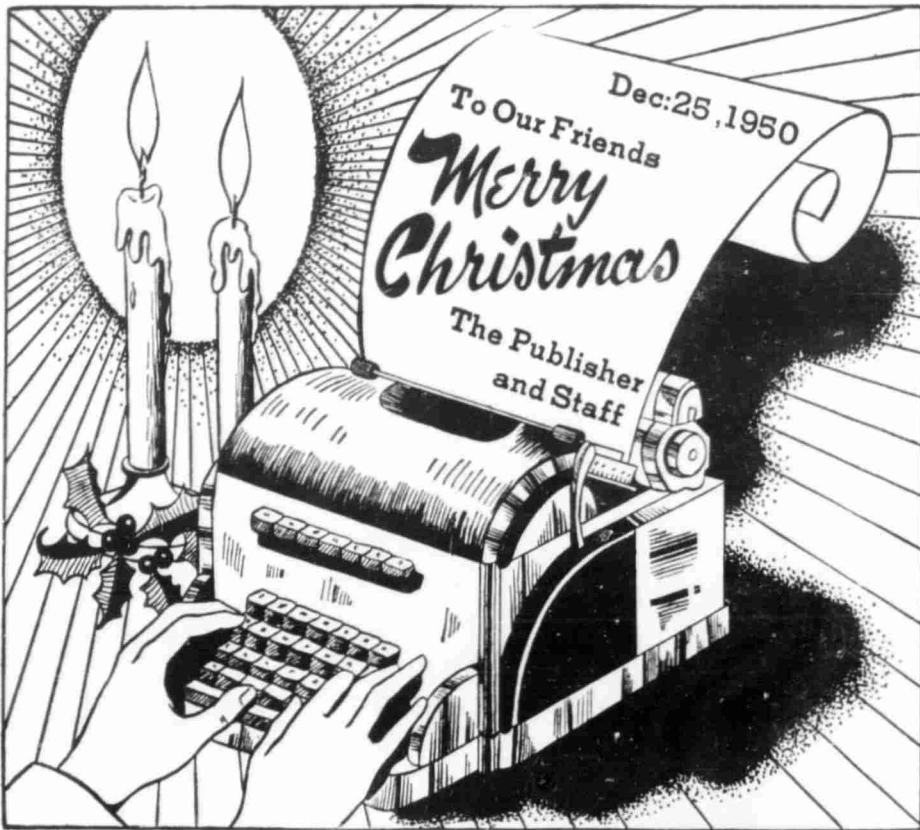

Yes, Virginia

It was only September, and 1897's Christmas was three months in the future. But Virginia O'Hanlon's concern was with an important problem that, to her, knew no season. That was why she wrote her letter to the New York Sun.

The answer to Virginia's question, written in a moment of deep spiritual insight by Francis B. Church, stands even today as a testament expressing two thousand years of faith. It has been reprinted here because it always will deserve to be read again.

"Yes, indeed! "Virginia, your little friends are wrong. They have been affected by the skepticism of a skeptical age—they do not believe except what they see—they think that nothing can be which is not comprehensible by their little minds.

"All minds, Virginia, whether they be men's or children's, are little

"In this great universe of ours, man is a mere

insect, an ant, in his intellect, as compared with the boundless world about him, as measured by the intelligence capable of grasping the whole of truth and knowledge.

"Yes, Virginia, there is a Santa Claus.

"He exists as certainly as love and generosity and devotion exist, and you know that they abound and give to your life its highest beauty and joy. Alas! how dreary would be the world if there were no Santa Claus! It would be as dreary as if there were no Virginias. There would be no childlike faith then, no poetry, no romance to make tolerable this existence. We should have no enjoyment, except in sense and sight. The eternal light with which childhood fills the world would be extinguished.

"Not believe in Santa Claus! You might as well not believe in fairies!

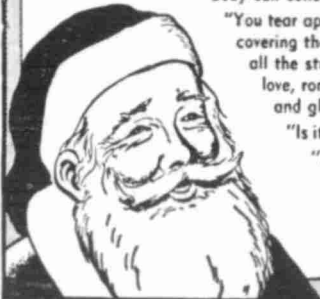
"You might get your papa to hire men to watch in all the chimneys on Christmas Eve to catch Santa Claus, but even if they did see Santa Claus coming down, what would that prove? Nobody sees Santa Claus, but that is no sign that there is no Santa Claus — the most real things in the world are those neither Children nor men can see

"Did you ever see fairies dancing on the lawn? Of course not, but that's no proof that they are not there — nobody can conceive or imagine all the wonders that are unseen and unseeable in the world.

"You tear apart the baby's rattle and see what makes the noise inside, but there is a veil covering the unseen world which not the strongest man, or even the united strength of all the strongest men, that ever lived, could tear apart. Only faith, fancy, poetry, love, romance, can push aside the curtain and view and picture the supernal beauty and glory beyond.

"Is it all real? — ah, Virginia, in all this world there is nothing else real and abiding.

"No Santa Claus! Thank God! — he lives, and he lives forever — a thousand years, from now, Virginia, nay, ten thousand years from now, he will continue to make glad the heart of childhood."

HARRY MacKAY TELLS ABOUT XMAS SHOPPING FOR THE WIFE

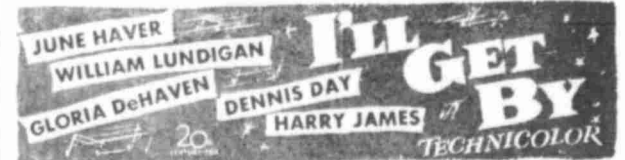
