Community Chest

The Secretary was instructed to write a letter to the ~~Co-ordinating Council~~ *Community Chest* inquiring as to the allocation for the Co-ordinating Council for the coming year.

Mr. Burkholder stated that through the combined efforts of our Congressmen; Senator Pat McCarran, Senator Malone and Rep. Walter Baring, our application for funds in the amount of \$547,000 has been approved. This required considerable effort as there were 1,500 applications in the United States amounting to \$550,000,000.00. All that the Congress appropriated for school building program was \$135,000,000.00. Mr. Burkholder suggested that each organization write a note of appreciation to our Congressmen for their attention to our application. This money is for the Elementary School building consisting of 29 classrooms, Administrative offices, and multi-purpose room. Also at this time an application for \$404,918.00 has been submitted for new High School facilities and is expected at any day.

Mr. Woodruff moved, and Mr. Joyce seconded that each organization should write a letter expressing appreciation to our congressmen for their fine work in helping to secure the funds for the new school buildings.

Mr. Woodruff suggested that the secretary be in charge of all publicity for the Co-ordinating Council.

Mr. Joyce, Treasurer reported that we have a balance of \$326.19 in the bank.

Mr. Hickman reported that the equipment behind the Episcopal Church was a responsibility of the Council and that the church inquired as to the disposition of it. It is insured and should be supervised. A discussion followed. Mrs. Riggins suggested that since money for this equipment was donated by townspeople the matter should be taken back to the organizations. Mrs. Woodruff moved that each organization write a letter to Mr. Newell asking if certain playground areas could be allocated which would not conflict with the future building program. Motion seconded by Mrs. Riggins.

Mr. Keenan gave a summary of the purpose of Coordinating Council to help new representatives better understand its functioning. Discussion.

He recommended the first step to be taken was a paid director, Then ~~with~~ with a Base ball, Basketball and Football team with Organizations sponsoring the latter, that returns from these games ~~with~~ defray their costs of equipment. He offered his assistance. He also mentioned the major problems that occur with the youth center, Lack of interest after a short time, drinking, and the need of law patrol at each dance.

A motion was made by Mr. Keenan that the President appoint a committee to meet with the Basic Management Inc. for a fund realitive to a Recreational director. Mr. Joyce seconded the motion. The committee appointed were, Mr. Earl Keenan, Mr. Woodruff, Mr. Joyce, and Mr. Dooley.

The swim program was reported to be functioning as per schedule. Mr. Joyce asked his authority on issuing money for the swim program. Discussion and as in the past the money will be set aside to be used as needed. The school is defraying the cost of transportation this year as to the use of the buss and the drivers. Before the driver was paid by council.

The president announced here would a executive board meeting July 16.

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The meeting of the Henderson Co-Ordinating Council was called to order by President Mrs P.D. Harris. Roll call was made by Mrs. Ring in absence of attendance officer, Mrs. Harblin.

Organizations represented were Eastern Star, Community Church, Teachers' Classroom Organization, B.P.W. Masonic Club of Henderson, St. Peter's Alter Society, American Legion Aux. Chamber of Commerce, V.F.W., V.F.W. Aux., Beta Sigma Phi, P.T.A., A.A.W., and our newest organization, The Henderson Rotary Club.

George Vanhorne seconded the motion.

Hershel Trumbo suggested we get a town board organized immediately and a town planned. The Chamber of Commerce has a meeting on the matter within the next few days.

Mrs Shay asked for a concrete plan to take back to her organization.

A committee was recommended by Mr. Woodruff to formulate the plan. Mrs. Harris appointed Rev. Gilbert, Hershel Trumbo and George Vanhorne.
