We have grown from nine attendees at the initial meeting to thirty card-carrying members. If this is a portent of our forthcoming year, we will be a hearty group.

We are happy to announce that the Board of Directors has voted to encourage members to submit four-generation charts on their spouses, thereby increasing the number of names with which we may work. The entire project is available to all members at every meeting of our Society, and <u>Mr. Recker</u> expresses the hope that more and more of you will use the index and pedigree charts for your own benefit.

We are awaiting replies from several genealogical societies re the possibility of "swapping" our periodical with theirs. One of our members has specificially requested that we attempt to exchange with a group in or near Unillicothe, Ohio. We find that many of our members have Ohio research and will be interested in such an arrangement. Please, if you have a particular area of interest, let a Board member know so that we emay work on your behalf.

We will be most grateful to you if you will work on our behalf as well. Your Society needs assistance in making its presence in the community known to others who may have an interest in genealogy. Your help in becoming an active member of our committees is also requested. /e need orkers on our membership committee, our project committee and working on the PROSPECTOR staff. Some of you wonderful about submitting items and ideas for publication. We hope that everyone will think about how to help our periodical interest our readers. Our thanks to <u>Margaret Schumaker Higby</u>, our new Treasurer, for making available to us the following article;

"LOCAL MORTUARY HAS TREASURY OF GENEALOGICAL INFORMATION

Bunker Mortuary, 925 Las Vegas Boulevard North, has on its shelves a complete set of funeral record books dating back to the establishment of the mortuary in the Las Vegas area in 1944. These volumes, according to David S. Bunker, General Manager, contain a record of each service handled by the firm whether a complete service, a ship-in, or a shipout.

Each of the huge volumes covers a period of approximately one year and a full page is devoted to each service.

'Great care is taken to accurately record all possible information on each decedent,' states Berkeley L. Bunker, one of the original founders' of the firm. 'While we haveno way of verifying all information presented, we do try to obtain as accurate and as complete a record as possible on each individual. Our staff takes great pride in the preparation and preservation of records. We are conscious of their value not only for our time but for future generations.'

Each complete record contains the full name of the decedent, his parentage, and birth, marriage, and death information as well as details of the funeral service and interment.

Staff members indicate that they receive several inquiries each week for genealogical information. Each inquiry receives the prompt personal attention of a full-time member of the staff."

The Las Vegas telephone directory for January, 1977, lists six funeral directors, three of which are local. <u>Mrs. Higby</u> tells us that most mortuaries have excellent recents which can be made available to us for genealogical research.
