

POSTAGE PAYS OFF

WALTER V. HIGBY, a charter member of the CCNGS, recently had the good fortune to secure considerable family data for the price of a postage stamp.

Seeking information on a descendant of his ancestor, William BRISBANE of Waseca County, MN, Walter secured the name and address of a Robert Brisbane of Fairmont, MN from a telephone directory.

In January of this year, Walter wrote to Mr. Brisbane requesting information on the family and suggesting that if data were not readily available to him he pass the letter on to a relative who might possess family records.

On April 26, 1977, Walter received a reply from a lady in Vancouver, WN. While working in Washington, D.C., she had researched information on 1,021 descendants on William and Janet Brisbane of Waseca County, MN! Enclosed was a sheet bearing all the genealogical data on the particular family Walter was seeking. Walter, in turn, is now forwarding data she lacks on an allied family to the lady in Vancouver.

Always a fan of the U.S. Post Office (his dad was a rural mail carrier at Bradgate, IA, and his father-in-law a post office clerk at Rochelle, IL), Walter states that he plans to make considerable further investment in postage stamps!
