THE BIRTH OF A FAMILY NEWSLETTER

While on vacation in Nova Scotia in 1973, Joe and Mick Doucette took a sightseeing bus tour of Halifax. Among the points of interest visited and described were the sewage disposal plant and the Provincial Archives. Out of curiosity, they visited there after the tour (the Archives, that is) to inquire about any possible information re Doucette ancestors. There, they were introduced to Bona Arsenault's "Historie et Genealoguie des Acadiens" which cited French families who colonized Nova Scotia in 1632, and lists their descendants thru the end of the 1700's. When Joe retired in 1979, he planned a 1980 visit to Petil-Rocher, N.B., Can. (his mother and grandparent's birthplace) to try to trace his ancestors back to Germain Doucet, born in France in 1595 and an original Acadian colonist. With initial assistance from a Petil-Rocher amatuer genealogist, lots of luck and plenty of hours of research, in less than a year, Joe was able to trace 3 of his grandparents back to Germain Doucet and to numerous other French Acadians--plus an Indian or two and a stray Irishman!

In 1981, to celebrate his mother's 90th birthday, Joe organized an informal 100 person family picnic in the park next to the rest home in Tomohawk, Wisconsin, where his mother lives. At the picnic, Joe presented his genealogical findings to the group. Everyone enjoyed the gathering so much that a more formal family reunion was planned for 1982. And, surprise!--Joe was named family historian! For the 1982 reunion, Joe, using his grandparents as a starting point, contacted living relatives for information and constructed charts of his grandparents descendants to supplement the ancestor charts already developed. Again, Joe made a genealogical presentation, complete with exhibits, this time to over 300 relatives, and again, the affair was declared a success. Another reunion committee was selected and a reunion targeted for 1985.

In order to help maintain interest in a continuing family organization and to provide members with historical and current family information, Joe has now originated a quarterly family newsletter titled "Doucet Doings". With the first edition on its way out in the mail, what the longevity of "Doucet Doings" will be anyone's guess. Joe says that it all depends upon Doucette family contrubutions, both in the form of news items-and a little cash to help defray production and mailing costs!
