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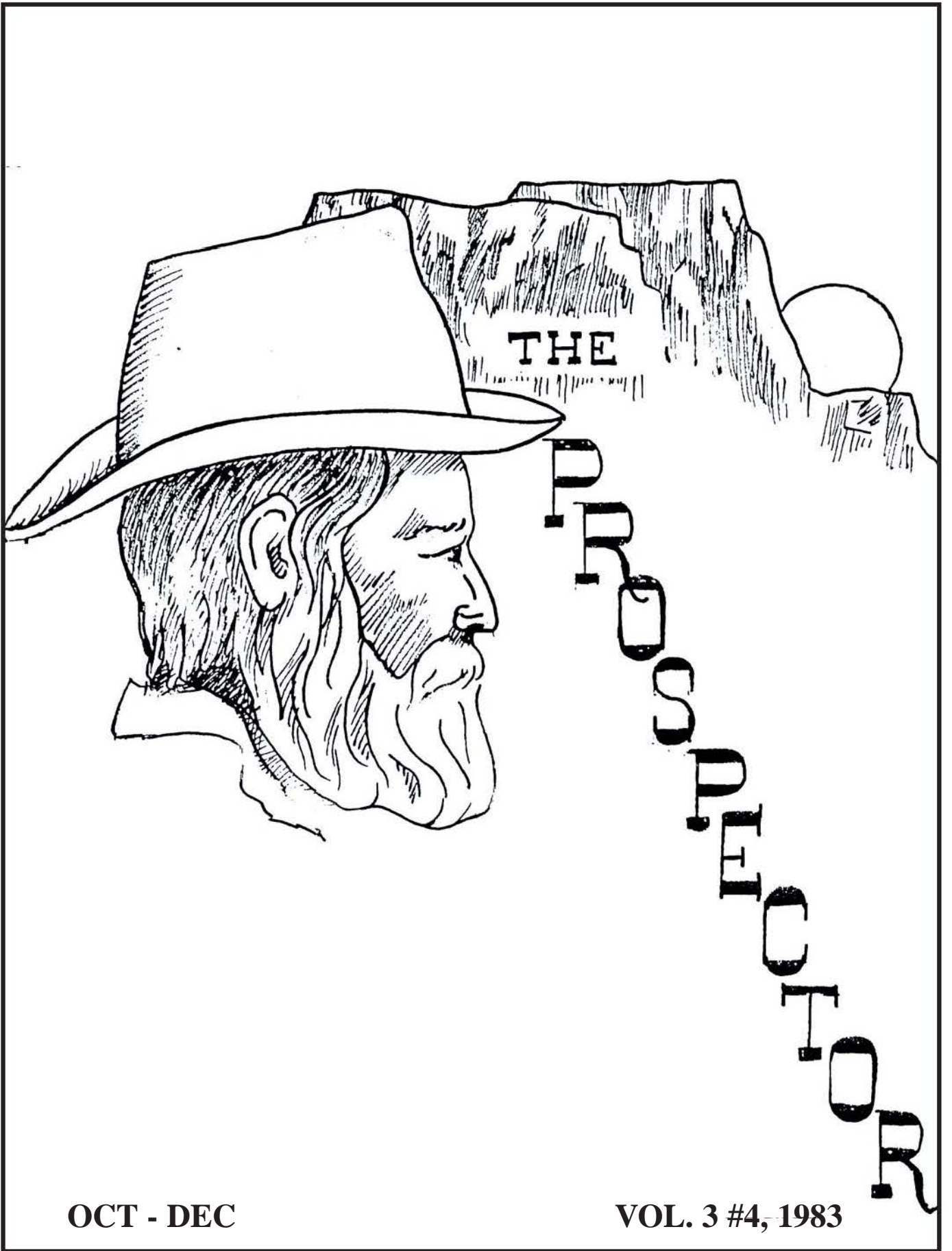

The following AHNENTAFEL was submitted for publication by Ramona Armstrong Duff.

An Ahnentafel is a German word meaning Pedigree, but is found in a different form than the charts we are all used to working with. This form lists all the ancestors in a single column, each with their own number. In order to use this form, if you want to find a person's parents, that person's father would have a number that is double his own number. His mother's number is then double, plus one of his own. Such as: #15, Mary Ellen Dorsey is the daughter of #30, Augustus Dorsey and his wife, #31, Frances Minerva Shultz.

Using this form in lieu of the standard charts, you can get an equivalent of probably 16 - 20 charts onto only 3 or 4 pages.

Ramona has started her ahnentafel with her children instead of herself, so that she has both her own and her husband's lines on the same chart.

3rd Floor-Periodicals (non-circulating)

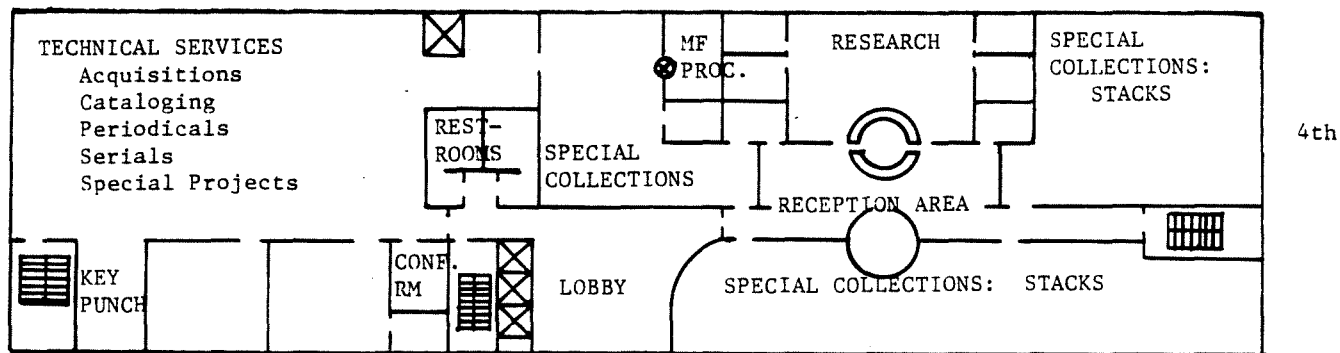
Bound copies of historical/genealogical magazines for most states.

A 12 page booklet describing the library may be obtained free of charge on the 2nd floor of the Library.
