In Pursuit of Family History •. •.....

Genealogy is the sometimes lonely, frustrating pursuit of one more elusive ancestor; one more dusty record office to search for one more document that will tell you "everything you always wanted to know about •.•.•..•".

You write letters until you have a severe case of writer's cramp, and all that comes back is an answer from someone having even less information than yourself, or there is no reply at all.

I've tried to be somewhat professional in my approach to my hobby, 'though I am just as apt to go off on a wild-goose chase when the mood strikes me. But I try and keep a professional tone to my letters, enclosing a pedigree chart to illustrate the question, and always enclosing a SASE for their reply.

Such a wild-goose I thought I was pursuing in the form of a letter to a gentleman in VA, inquiring about a Whitacre line he might or might not be researching. In practically record time (one week) my 'wild goose' replied with more information than I would ever have believed possible---six generations and all the trimmings! And more to come, in the form of copies of articles he has printed in his newspaper column, as well as a book (which I am purcha.sing for my library) he authored. Also a trip to the cemetary to see if he can locate the grave of my husband's great-grand-mother.

Having only become interested in genealogy in the last year, I pose myself as no expert. But I have found in that year a lot of new friends, enriched my mind with history in a way that is intensely interesting, as well as broadened my knowledge of my family. But above all, I have come to know that there are still people out there who are ready, even eager, to aid me in my pursuit of family history.

EDWARD LESTER. of Chino. was born in Covington, Ky., August zoth, 1828, the son of Joseph and Elizabeth Helms Lester. both natives of Yorkshire. England. They came to the United States in 1818 and settled in Indiana and later located in Covington, Ky. There

Joseph Lester helped to build and worked in the first cotton factory erected west of the Allegheny mountains. In 1830 he removed to Hamilton county, Ohio, and settled on a farm where he lived until he died. He was the father of thirteen children.

Edward Lester started for California in 1852 via New Orleans, thence to Brownsville, Texas, and across Mexico to Xlazatlan. There he took a sailing vessel for San Frau-CISCO. He worked for a time in the mines but not meeting with the success anticipated he went to farming.

In 1355 he left California and went to South America, where he located in Lima, Peru. Here he helped to start the first American brick yard in that country. In 1858 he returned to the United States and settled in Lavaca county, Texas. where he engaged in farming until the outbreak of the Civil war. As he was a strong L nion man. he felt obliged to leave the state rather than to go into the rebel army. As it was too late to reach the north with his farruly, he crossed the border into Mexico and traveled ncrosv that country to Guaymas where, with others, he bought an open boat, and came up the Gulf to the mouth of the Colorado river and from there to Yuma by steamer. There he secured an ox team for his farnily and reached El Monte, Los Angeles county, in 1862. He farmed in this vicinity for three years, and in San Luis Obispo country for nine years. He then located at Rincon and purchased land from various parties until he now has 525 acres of

land from various parties until he now has 525 acres of land, and has for many years conducted a successful stock business.

Mr. Lester was married in 1859 to Miss Ellen Clegg. of Cincinnati. Ohio, her parentage being English. She was killed by an accidental fall in Pomona in 1880. There were five children by this marriage, Joseph. of Rincon: Annie R. Wife of Max Dietrich, of Sorrento.

• In 1881, Mr. Lester married Miss Mary Taylor, of San Dimas, a native of New York.
