

In our last issue, I wrote about the early settlement of Las Vegas up until the land auction of 1905. At that time, the Las Vegas township was in Lincoln County; the county seat was, and still is, Pioche.

C. O. WHITTLEMORE, president of the Townsite & Water Company; Frank A. WATERS; Horace BETTIS, Vice-president of the Company and auditor of the railroad; R. M. GRACE, secretary of Vice-president J. Ross CLARK; Ferdinand K. RULE, treasurer of the Company, and several clerks comprised the Los Angeles party in charge of the sale.

The Townsite Company and the railroad reserved no lots in the business center for themselves, in order to allow the people the best opportunity to secure the lots they wanted.

Following is a list, by no means complete, of individuals and businesses purchasing lots at the auction:

First State Bank - a corner on 3rd & Fremont; \$3000 paid for 2 lots. Bankers from Arizona - corner of 1st & Fremont.

BOYER, Harry W. - a mining man from Goldfield, NV.

GARDNER, J. B. - Salt Lake City, UT, capitalist.

HOLMES, Gus - owner of the Knightsford Hotel in Salt Lake City, UT, & former owner of the Hotel Angeles in Los Angeles, CA.

KUHN, Norman A. - of Kuhn Merchantile Co., bought 3 central lots for a store.

LADD, J. H. - bought numerous lots in various blocks.

LEAVITT, Joe - of Kansas City.

LEE, Mrs. Alice - one of two ladies from Los Angeles, who bid shrewdly and secured good lots.

LOWE, W. M. - of the Las Vegas Light Co., was a liberal investor.

PRITTLE, John C. - of Los Angeles. Bought lots for himself and his associates. He held stock in the Las Vegas Hotel Co. and the Las Vegas Trading Co., and some of the lots were used by both corporations.

PULSIFER, Chauncey - bought lots at Clark Avenue & 4th Street, on which to build a theatre and resort buildings. Also bought lots at Wilson Avenue & 4th Street for a hotel.

SMILEY, Miss Jessie - the other shrewd lady bidder from Los Angeles.

WEIGHT, M. H. - Ex-mayor of Pasadena. He was a helf-brother to W. M. LOWE.

DAR's Latest Project: Genetic Study

In cooperation with the Vanderbilt Medical School, the DAR are using their genealogies to trace, not blue blood, but the inheritance of disease. Questionairs have been sent out to members as part of the DAR family Tree Genetics Project, asking them to provide a genealogy covering at least three generations that specifies each person's medical problems, including known genetic disorders as well as other diseases. What the scientists. are looking at is, in an indirect way, the DNA of the DAR.

When the project was announced, the president general of the DAR, Sarah King of Murfressboro, Tenn., pointed out that it would be valuable to the medical profession and the public at large; "We forsee this program as a boom, not only for our own families, but mankind as a whole. We are fortunate in that we know from whence we came. Our research will serve as in inspiration to others."

And the Daughters are rightfully proud of themselves for getting involved in a project so important that it makes them not only daughters of revolutionaries, but revolutionaries themselves.
