


THE LEGACY

Ulysses Lawrence Gladys Valentine Bracy October 5, 1868-1943 February 14, 1893-1973

My father was born into a canal-boating family in New York state. His father, three brothers, and two sisters worked on the Erie-Barge Canal from the time the ice melted in the spring until it froze in the fall. Only his mother, who had had enough of ships when she came from Ireland, stayed on the farm.

Dad told us that the toughest town on the whole canal system was a little town called "Montezuma" located near Syracuse. There had always been "tough gangs" who were looking for a fight, even then.

When he turned twenty-one, he quit the canal and bought a "saloon." He told us about wiring a silver dollar on the bar and whoever tried to pick it up got quite a shock.


My Dad was a leader. He owned the first car in Oswego County, New York. He married Gladys Valentine Bracy when he was 50 years old and my mother was 25. I am the middle one of their three children.

Mother did not approve of intoxicating beverages so my father sold his saloon and had a general store built next to our house. We all kept busy in the store, but my dad found time to entertain us by singing songs of the sea and dancing Irish jigs.

He had been healthy all of his life, but at the age of 75 he died of a heart attack.

His legacy to his three daughters was:

"BE YOUR OWN PERSON; DON'T BLINDLY FOLLOW THE CROWD."


MY EXPERIENCE USING THE NEWLY RELEASED SOCIAL SECURITY DEATH INDEX FILES By: Edie Kraemer

The first time I looked at the files I located a distant cousin, Albert H. Brant who died in May, 1967 in Seattle, Wa. From the zip code I found that he had lived in the southwest area of Seattle. Now my main objective for tracing this collateral line was to locate any records on my gr.gr. grandmother and her family. I knew she was Caroline Brant Adams who was born in London as her family was on their way to America from Germany in 1818. From a post card collection of my great grandmother I learned of her cousins in St. Louis and St. Paul who would be my gr-grgrandmother's nephew and gr. nephews. In going through these post cards dated 1909, I was able to ascertain that her gr. nephew went to Seattle, Wa. and was the above mentioned Albert H. Brant.

Now, how do I locate any living descendants? Not being a patient individual I went to the local library on Sunday afternoon and copied all the Brant's from the Seattle phone book and returned home to find one in the SW section of Seattle. The first one I called proved to be Albert's daughter-in-law who put me in touch with Albert's daughter who guided me to Albert's grandson. He just happened to be working on the family tree and proceeded to read me a page from the family Bible which came from Germany. When he had finished, he had told me who my 3rd and 4th great grandparents were. Not only that, I found cousins I didn't know I had.

PLEASE, PLEASE don't ever throw away post cards, address and telephone books, autograph books or pictures of your family members. If you are not interested in the history of your family, maybe one of your children will be. So box it up and put it in a trunk and save it some way. Then inform family members that you have the information. I know there are many like me who wish they had gotten in grandma's attic before these records were destroyed.

After eight years of searching in Philadelphia I got my answers from Seattle, Wa. Find those living descendants and you may get your answers.



BEFORE YOUR VISIT

- 1) Read a book on how to do genealogy.
- Make notes of the names of grandparents and other family members, take special note of maiden names.
- 3) Know the towns or counties where these people have lived and approximate dates of residence.
- 4) Copy any Bible records available.
- 5) Inquire about ownership of land, dates of birth and death, probate records, letters or diaries.

Please contact the department if you plan to bring a group. It will benefit all concerned in planning for a more enjoyable visit.

KENTUCKY

I am sorry to start the new year off with bad news, but the Kentucky researcher now has one less source available. The local county health departments had, up until last fall, kept Index books listing all death records on file in Frankfort since the state began officially keeping death records. These books were very easy to use and extremely helpful. If anyone wanted to know whether or not there was a death certificate on file in Frankfort, the Index books provided that information. The researcher did not have to send a fee to the state not knowing if they would receive anything in return for their money. These early Index books also listed some births. Due to a new Kentucky state law, these Index books were removed from all the county health departments. The health departments do still have the death listing, but everything is now on microfiche. For those older researchers whose eyesight is not the best, this is a great inconvenience. This new law was passed and put into effect before any genealogists in this area even heard of it. M C G H S tried to obtain the set of Index books that were in the Marshall County Health Department, but we were not able to do so. It seems that every year more doors are being closed against the researcher. Does anyone have any suggestions?
