



California and Nevada Vital Records

Current requirements for obtaining copies of vital records in these states are:

CALIFORNIA

BIRTHS, MARRIAGES, DIVORCES AND DEATHS:

Office of the State Registrar of Vital Statistics, P.O. Box 730241, Sacramento, CA 94244-0241. The application must be accompanied by a check or money order payable to the State Registrar of Vital Statistics. The fee for each certified copy of a birth, marriage or divorce record is \$12.00; for a death record is \$8.00. If the exact date of the event is not known, an additional fee is charged for each 10 years searched. If no record is found, the fee will be retained for searching and a Certification of No Record will be sent.

BIRTH RECORDS: Birth records have been maintained in the Office of the State Registrar of Vital Statistics since July 1, 1905. The only records of earlier births are delayed birth certificates and court ordered delayed birth certificates registered as provided by law.

CERTIFICATE INFORMATION: First, Middle and Last Name; City or Town of Birth; County of Birth; Month/Day/Year of Birth; Sex; First/Middle/Last Name of Father; First/Middle/Last (Maiden) Name of Mother. APPLICANT INFORMATION: Purpose for Which Certified Copy is to be Used; Today's Date; Phone Number, Area Code First; Name of Person Completing Application; Signature of Person Completing Application; Address, Street, City, State and Zip Code; Number of Certified Copies Requested; Amount of Money Enclosed; and Name and Address of Person Receiving Copies if Different from Applicant.

The office of the State Registrar of Vital Statistics advises that the processing time for requests is currently eight to sixteen weeks.

I just finished reading the current issue of the Prospector and, although I enjoyed every page, I wanted to comment on your article "CEMETERIES - 'Perpetual Care' A GENEALOGIST'S CONCERN."

Since I have been trying for five years to prove the location of the graves of my greatgrandparents I certainly can sympathize, empathize and feel for all the other researchers that haven't been able to prove what we think we know is true!

MY PROBLEM IS: that the cemetery, in a small town in Indiana, is a VERY old cemetery. It is the White Lick Cemetery in Pittsboro, IN and it belongs or be-longed to the White Lick Missionary Baptist Church. Unfortunately I have not been able to find anyone who did attend the church who might know where the cem-etery records are at this point. The thing that makes this so totally mad-dening is that just every now and then a new grave appears in this cemetery. I have contacted all of the Funeral Dir-ectors in all of the surrounding small towns and no one seems to know who was contacted to get permission for the burial(s)! My cousins and I would really like to be able to place proper head-stones on these graves while we are still around to preserve the site. Very few things, in my research, have been quite as frustrating as this.

Just had to get that off my chest, thank you again for the article; it has made me even more determined to pursue the search!

RESEARCH YOUR FAMILY HEALTH TREE

"A medical family tree can save live," says Dr. Michael Crouch, a family-practice specialist at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston. Many diseases once thought to be random can have a genetic link. "We see hereditary patterns in colon, breast, ovarian, and skin cancers, hypertension, high blood pressure, asthma, emphysema, polycystic kidney disease, gall-bladder problems, insulin dependent diabetes, and peptic ulcers, to name only some."

With cancers alone, it is now speculated that 5 to 10 percent of new cases - as many as 100,000 annually - may be hereditary, that is, triggered by a specific gene. Yet many more cancers are considered "familial"; they run in families seemingly without a genetic pattern. For example, 9 percent of breast cancers are hereditary, and another 25 percent are familial.

The list of possibly inherited illnesses goes on. Researchers are studying genetic factors in sub-stance abuse, multiple sclerosis, depression, Alzheimer's, arthritis, and heart disease. All This on top of known hereditary illnesses like Huntington's chorea, hemophilia, and Tay-Sachs disease.

One way to spot possible genetic diseases in you family is to compile a health tree. Start by drawing a diagram like the one shown. Fill in as many "branches" as possible with this infor-mation: full name of relative, date of birth, date and cause of death. It is very important to include the age at which an illness was diagnosed, and it help to note the relative's profession and personal habits, like smoking or use of alcohol. This could help distinguish hereditary from en- vironmental factors.

"It's helpful to talk to older members of the family and compare notes," Couch says. "Make sure they know you're just gathering information and not being judgmental." Although reminiscing can bring families closer together, mistakes can occur when you rely solely on memories. To confirm an illness or cause of death, try to get medical records. Sometimes a surviving spouse will have to sign a permission letter. Crouch suggest enlisting the aid of a doctor at the hospital where the relative was treated.

For ancestors farther up the tree, death certificates may be the only available documents. Most state of county record bureaus will send you a copy for a small fee. It was a death certificate that helped clear the 50-year-old mystery of (Aunt Bertha.) Family lore said she died of "stomach or colon" cancer at 32. With records, it was found she actually died of ovarian cancer. It is a classic example of how families in generations past didn't discuss "delicate" illnesses. When your tree is somewhat complete, look for red flags: two or more relatives with the same illness, or deaths at a young age from cancer or from heart of kidney problems. Hereditary cancers usually strike earlier than nonhereditary cancers would - often when people are in their forties or early fifties.

If you think you see a pattern, consult a medical geneticist, most easily found at universit y medical centers, or a specialist in the most common illness on your tree. And don't despair. "There's a misperception that because it's genetic, there's nothing you can do." say Dr. John Mulvihill, chief of human genetics at the Univ-ersity of Pittsburgh. "Actually, you can manage your predisposition to certain diseases."

High blood-cholesterol levels in your family, for example, may encourage you to change your diet.

Far from being foreboding, a medical family tree can be a useful tool. If you are a woman "too busy" for a mammogram or a man still tossing salt on your potato, a look at your family's past may be the incentive you need to take charge of your future health.

Deaths Reported in the Las Vegas Age

November 1, 1915 through December 31, 1917

This is the fifth in a series of death indexes from the pioneer Las Vegas newspaper, the Las Vegas Age. As in the first four of these series, the reported deaths include high percentages of violent deaths from accidents and crime as well as deaths reported as occurring in other communities. Both are reflections of the frontier nature of the new city during the first dozen years of its existence.

In the four preceding issues of the CCNGS **Prospector**, we published the list of deaths reported from the first edition of the Age on April 7, 1905 through October 31, 1915. In this issue we continue through December 31, 1917.

Encourage your parents or grandparents to write or tape their family history. Perhaps the grandchildren could record their history while visiting during the summer. The stories could be given to their relatives...what a priceless gift. Grandparents would love having their grandchildren interested in their life.

Include grandma's first meal "goof", her budget, and grandpa's first car. What did it cost? How fast would it go? How did grandpa meet grandma? What a great gift for the rest of the family at Christmas.

CEMETERY RUBBINGS

How are cemetery rubbings made? What materials are used? Is there an advantage over photographs?

Grave stone rubbings are easy to do, a creative art form available even to the untalented. They can be mounted or framed and make an interesting conversation piece. There are times when an almost obliterated number or letter appears like magic during a rubbing. Along with photographs, they establish the information on the stone.

For rubbing a tombstone, one need a large sheet of paper which is not stiff, but is firm. We have found that pellon works even better than paper. This material, used for stiffening in coat linings, may be purchased at a fabric store and is inexpensive. Buy light-weight, non-bondable pellon. Use masking tape to fasten to the stone you wish to rub. Begin rubbing and keep the strokes mainly in one direction. Rubbing wax may also be used instead of soft large lead pencils or charcoal. I prefer the wax as it is less messy.
