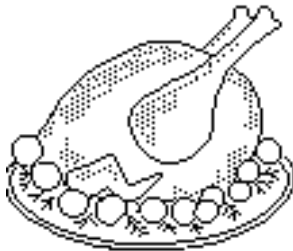

BY THE GOVERNOR**

Social Security Information

CONTACTING A MISSING PERSON

Regulation No. 1 of the Social Security Act does not permit SSA to disclose information about the whereabouts of a missing person except as provided for the Parent Locator Service (service for locating a parent who has skipped out on child support payments). However, circumstances may arise when it would be proper to inform the missing person of information about which he would want to know. Where strongly compelling circumstances of this nature exist, SSA may forward a letter to him/her. The letter forwarding policy is restrictive because:

- 1) the inquirer can be helped only if the addressee replies to the letter. It would serve little purpose to forward a letter to an individual unless it contains information that he/she could reasonably be expected to want to receive and which would cause him/her to reply. This excludes requests which are primarily for the benefit of the requester rather than the missing person.
- 2) SSA does not want to burden employers. Most letters must be forwarded through the last employer of record. Some large employers have asked SSA not to send letters to the employees in care of the company.
- 3) If all requests to forward letters were honored, the volume would significantly interfere with normal SSA operations.
- 4) The addressee may consider receipt of the letter as an unwarranted invasion of his/her privacy.

A letter will not be forwarded unless the following conditions are met:

- 1) There are strongly compelling reasons for wanting to get in touch with the missing person such as: a close relative of the missing person is seriously ill, is dying or has died; a child is left without parental care because of the death or incapacity of the remaining parent; a defendant in a felony case is seeking a defense witness; a parent wishes to locate a missing son or daughter; the consent of the missing person is needed in connection with an adoption proceeding for his/her child; the missing person is the beneficiary of an estate and the executor is trying to locate him; other instances where the missing person is due money or valuable property; a doctor or hospital wishes to contact a missing person for health reasons.
- 2) The missing person would want to know about the contents of the letter.
- 3) The missing person's disappearance occurred far enough in the past that SSA could reasonably expect to have a usable mailing address (wages are reported by employers only once a year, so the most recent information SSA has will be at least a year old).
- 4) All other possibilities for contacting the missing person have been exhausted.

In order to forward a letter, SSA must have sufficient information to locate the missing person's record. The name and SSN are needed for this. The letter to be forwarded must be submitted in a plain unsealed, unstamped envelope bearing only the missing person's name and SSN. If the SSN is unknown, you must furnish as much identifying information as possible. The letter will be reviewed by SSA personnel to ensure that it is not inflammatory or derogatory, contains no obscene language, and will not cause embarrassment if opened by someone other than the addressee. SSA cannot be sure that the letter will reach the missing person or that he/she will reply. If SSA attempts to forward a letter, SSA cannot inform you of the results of that attempt. Subsequent letters for the same purpose will not be forwarded.

No fee is charge for forwarding a letter for humanitarian purposes. The current charge for forwarding letters involving a monetary or valuable consideration is \$3 per letter. Contact your local SSA office if you want to have a letter forwarded to a missing person.

Please be aware that the situations described in these messages are not run of the mill requests that offices deal with all the time. The person you talk to may not be aware that disclosure of the information is allowed or may not be familiar with the procedures involved. In the 9 years I spent working in various local offices, I received 2 requests to forward letters to missing persons and no requests for detailed earnings information or for copies of Social Security number application forms. I was not aware until recently that you could get some of this information. If they refuse to give you the information, saying it isn't allowed, ask them to look it up in the manual. If all else fails, as a last resort, you can write to your congressman, describing your contacts with the local SSA office, and include a copy of your request. Congressional inquiries get special treatment, but the local offices don't like them.

Anytime you have questions about Social Security issues, or need help with a Social Security matter, PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE call your local office. You will get the best information from them. Please don't waste time speculating or asking neighbors or friends (unless they work for SSA). I can still remember being on the receiving end of "but my Uncle Joe says" or "so-and-so told me thus-and-so and he ought to know because" and not being able to convince them that Uncle Joe and so-and-so didn't know what they were talking about. The Social Security Law is quite complicated and encompasses much more than just retirement benefits. No one can know it all, but your local office is the place to get official information. That's what they are there for. End of sermon.

Each office should have a copy of the Social Security Laws and Regulations and the POMS manual (operational instructions to implement the laws & regs). These manuals, except for portions related to security procedures, should be available for you to use at the local office. I would think that all law libraries would also have copies of the law and regs and possibly the operations manuals.

LOST LOCATION?

The first place to look for a seemingly vanished town or one for which the name was changed is a gazeteer. When atlases and these gazeteers do not solve your problem, try the United States Board on Geographical Names, giving as much information as possible on the location and date (in the U.S.). BIRTH OR DEATH AT SEA.

When a birth or death occurs on the high seas, whether on an aircraft or on a ship, the determination of where the record is filed is decided in terms of the direction in which the craft was headed at the time of the event.

- a. If the craft was outbound or docked at a foreign port, requests for copies of the record should be made to the Department of State, Washington, DC 20520.
- b. If the craft was inbound and the port of entry was in the U.S., write to the registration in the city where the craft landed in the U.S.
- c. If the craft was of U.S. registry, contact the U.S. Coast Guard at the port of entry.

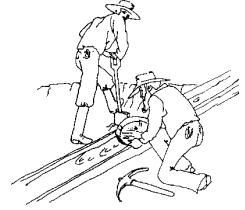

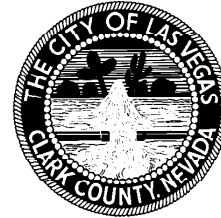

Tartan - "The Myth, The Legend, The Lore And A Few Facts."

A number of attempts were started to bring about some order to the mess that had been created by demand for "CLAN TARTAN." The London Society asked the Chiefs of the Clans to submit pieces of their old clan tartans, some of whom did so, but many did not know what to send or sent only parts of setts. James Logan traveled through the Highlands and published a book in 1831 with 55 different setts, each of which was accurately described.

But the people who did most to turn myth into reality, we have to turn to two Polish con men, the Sobieski brothers, John and Charles Allan, who arrived in the British Isles claiming to be the grandsons of Prince Charles Edward and the heirs to the House of Stewart. They were not Polish, nor Sobieski, nor Stewarts, but they had a good story and a copy of what they said was a 38 page manuscript with the date 1721. They claimed it was a poor copy of a manuscript dating before 1571, belonging to Prince Charles and before him to John, Bishop of Ross. It has never been seen and only the transcript known as the "Comarty MS" was available. It contained some 75 tartans, which was written in 16th century Scots.

A friend of the two brothers, Sir Thomas Disk Lauder, put it into 19th century english and in 1829, Charles Allan added color drawings of the tartans according to the Cromarty MS descriptions. That version. "The Lauder Transcript" resides in Windsor's Royal Library. Hopefully the fire did not destroy it. Regardless of who they were, they did help to set in motion the renewal of culture that was to follow. Even Sir Walter Scot who did more for the rehabilitation of the Highlands than most said the manuscript was "Spurious in content and language." but that did not prevent Sir Thomas and Charles Allan from again publishing the "Vestiarium Scoticum." Its pictures were easy for weavers to follow and today many of the "Clan" tartans have no other authority than this book. In addition many of the Clan Chiefs gave their full approval for their clan tartans, but it should be noted not all.

Two other events of importance should also be noted in discussion of the return of the tartan. Even before George IV made his historic visit to Scotland, Jane Maxwell, the Duchess of Gordon, and who became known as "the Tartan Belle", introduced a plaid woven in the tartan of the Black Watch to the English court to celebrate her son's appointment to that regiment. The Gordon Tartan followed a year later and was based on the Black Watch pattern.

The second event and perhaps the one that put the seal of approval on the wearing of the tartan, was the arrival of Queen Victoria and her Prince Consort Albert in the Highlands. She first came to visit and stay at the lodge on Loch Alvie in the Spey valley, while Balmoral was being built. When Prince Albert discovered Scotland he fell in love with it and the Deeside granites inspired him to design the Balmoral Tartan. A tartan which soon covered the walls, furniture, floors in the Castle and the people as well. It was woven in a heavy cloth for the Royal ghillies (servants), and in a softer version for the Royal Family.

The following tartans are the exclusive use of the Royal family. The Balmoral, Lord of the Isles, and the Duke of Rothesay, which is only worn by Prince Charles. The control of the Tartans now is in the hands of the Clan Chiefs, the Council of Scottish Chiefs, The Lord Lyon King of Arms, and the Scottish Tartan Society. They continue to advise and give consent to new tartans, as the demand today is just as great as it was in when Wilson's began again to weave tartan. Recent tartans created and approved by the Scottish Tartan Society were the 'American Bicentennial Tartan', now know as the 'American St. Andrews' and the 'Blue Bonnet' also known as the "Texas Tartan." I am sure there were others since. Bring forth the tartan as they say.

CONFUSING DEFINITIONS

Some terms commonly used in Colonial times have changed in their meanings - for better or worse.

ALIAS - did not have a criminal meaning. It usually meant illegitimacy; the surnames of the father and mother were joined.

SENIOR - and JUNIOR - did not necessarily refer to father and son. If two men in the same town had the same name, the older of the two was "senior" and the younger became "junior" even though they were unrelated. In earlier times a father might have done the same, in naming sons.

NIECE - could be any female relative, but usually a granddaughter.

NEPHEW - might be an illegitimate son, but usually a grandson.

COUSIN - might be a nephew or an uncle.

BROTHER - might be an adopted brother, but could also be an in-law, lodge or church "brother."

DOMESTIC - could be a wife because she was at home.

MOTHER-IN-LAW - could be a stepmother.

HOUSEKEEPER - once meant property owner and could be used for a male as well as a female.

INMATE - as found in the PN (sic) Archives, refers to a man living in the home of another person but not necessarily in an institution.

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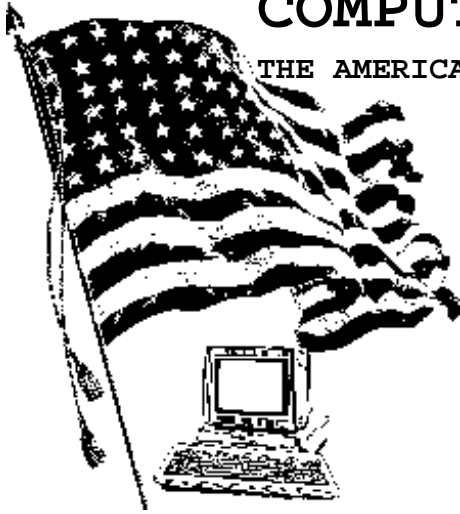

UNDERSTANDING COMPUTER TERMS PART 3

FLOPPY - A removable disk that comes in various sizes and capacities. Floppies are available in 3.5, 5.25 and 8-inch sizes. The most common floppy is the 5.25-inch which comes in 360Kbyte and 1.2Mbyte capacities. The 3.5-inch floppy comes in 1Mbyte and 2Mbyte sizes that format to 720K and 1.44Mbytes of usable space. To specify a floppy disk: 1S or SS is single side; 2S or DS is double side; HD is high density; RH is reinforced center hub ring; TPI stands for tracks per inch. A 3.5-inch DS HD disk is a 1.44Mbyte floppy. A 5.25-inch DS DD 48 TPI RH disk is a 360K floppy with a reinforced hub ring. All IBM and compatible PCs use soft sector floppy disks.

FORMAT - The process of preparing a floppy or hard disk for use. Formatting places marks on the disk where data goes and sets up a directory to store the file names. The DOS FORMAT command is used to format disks. Before formatting a hard disk, it must be partitioned with the FDISK command. Formatting a disk that has previously been used erases all the files on it.

HGA - Hercules graphics adapter. The card that plugs into a PC bus to give it graphics with a monochrome monitor (MDM). Also referred to as HERC. Once very popular but rapidly being replaced by EGA or VGA.

K - Kilobytes or 1024 bytes. A 360 floppy actually can store 368,640 bytes.

LIM - See expanded memory.

MCGA - Multi color graphics array. A slightly less capable VGA. Used on low end PS/2 systems.

MDA - Monochrome display adapter. The card that plugs into a personal computer bus to give it the ability to drive a monochrome video monitor.

MDM - Monochrome display monitor.

MONOCHROME - Single color monitor, usually green on black screen. Also white on black and amber on black.

MS-DOS - Microsoft version of DOS for all IM compatible PCs. See DOS

PC - A personal computer. Also refers to the first personal computer IBM released that did not have a hard disk. All later computers are referred to as XT or PC/XT, AT or PC/AT, etc. The newest computers released by IBM are the PS/1 and PS/2, the PS standing for personal system.

PC-DOS - IBM version of DOS. See DOS.

POS - Programmable option select. This allows the PS/2 with microchannel to query and set the system configuration. On an XT or AT, the individual cards often had DIP switches (small switches mounted in dual-in-line packages) that must be set. POS eliminates the switches. Adaptor description files (ADF) describe each adaptor card. The adaptor IDs are stored in the system battery-backed CMOS RAM. System configuration is set with the Reference Diskette software.

POST - The power on self test checks that the hardware is working when the PC is first turned on. POST is stored in the BIOS. After the POST completes, the boot record of the disk is loaded, which in turn loads DOS.

PROTECTED MODE - Available only on the 80286 and later CPU chips. A special mode the chip can switch to that allows it to use up to 16Mbytes of memory. See Real mode.

RAM - Random-access memory. Most memory on a PC is RAM. The 640K of memory on a PC is RAM. See extended and expanded memory.
