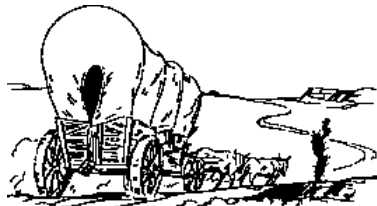

# Dues Increase!

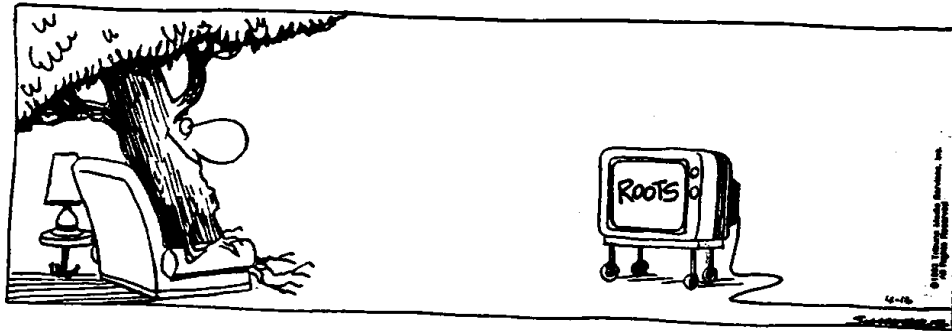

**GREETINGS TO ALL GENEALOGICAL RESEARCHERS!!**

Technology has entered the genealogy field with a bang and has allow previously inaccessible information to be made available at the touch of a button. The best source which is available today is Compact Disc technology. A compact disc, just like the ones used in the music industry, is being used to compress and store millions of bits of data for easy retrieval. There are such CD's as the Phone Disc USA, ProPhone, and Social Security Death Index. Other material stored on CD is World Book (and other titles) Encyclopedia, books, and graphics such as maps. Now there is another valuable source just out on the market.

The Bureau of Land Management has permitted placing all the names, legal description, and misc. information for persons who acquired land in public domain states (none of the original Colony States). At this time the states which have been made available is FL, AR, and LA. Other states which are in the processing stages and should be ready by late in 1994 are MI, MN, OH, WI, MS. These discs are \$15 each and all the software to run the access program is stored on the CD. A Compact Disc Reader is essential to use these plus a computer with a minimum of 4 Mb RAM. Of course, the faster computers can access the information faster. This land information is valuable to genealogists only from the standpoint that it tells you if your ancestor got land in the particular state, gives you the legal description, and makes it accessible to get the original documents from BLM and National Archives. It would be helpful to any researcher to get a township and range type of map of the state wherein you are researching to be able to know where certain property lies. ## Birthdates / Tombstone

This was pub by the Mass Soc of Genealogists as a helpful tip for figuring a birthdate from a gravestone inscription. The Constant number 8870 is used in the following example. If the tomstone records mentions that a person had died on May 6, 1889 and was 71 yrs 7 months and 9 days old, you add the death date in reverse—18890506 subtract the 710709 age then subtract the constant 8870 >> The answer is 18170927 and interpreted as born 1817 Sept 27..

## Social - Feudal Structure and Life of the Clans

A federation of clans in the central highlands that fought together and against each other. Often because of wounded pride or invasion of outsiders, and just as often without rhyme or sometimes without reason.

The system of Clans, whereby each was similar to a small kingdom was calculated to foster a warlike atmosphere. The young chiefs and heads of families were popular according to their military or peaceable nature. If they revenged a dispute with another clan and were successful they were held in high esteem. If they failed in their attempts, they were not respected.

The military ranks of the clans were fixed and perpetual. The chief was the principal commander. The oldest cadet(son) commanded the right wing and the youngest the rear. Every head of a distinct family was captain of his own people. An ensign or standard bearer was attached to each clan, who generally inherited his office. At time of need a clan would meet when called by the chief at a designated place. The taric(cross) was carried throughout the territories of the clan. This signal consisted of two pieces of wood placed in the form of a cross. One of the ends of the horizontal piece was either burnt or burning. A piece of linen or white cloth stained with blood was suspended from the other end. Two men each with a cross, were sent by the chief, each running with great speed in opposite directions. As they ran, shouting the war cry of the clan and naming the place of the gathering, if different from the usual place. The cross was handed from hand to hand until the territory of the clan had been covered. General Stewart says that one of the latest instances of the fiery-cross being used was in 1745 by Lord Breadalbane, when it went round Loch Tay, a distance of 32 miles in 3 hours.

The number of men that might be raised in time of need is lost in distant memory of the clans. There are however estimates of the number who fought at Culloden in the 45 uprising which range from a handful per clan to as high as 3000.

When a Clan went on an "outing," they were very much addicted to omens. If they meet an armed man, they believed that good was forecast. If they observed a deer, fox, hare, or any other four-footed beast of game, and did not succeed in killing it. they prognosticated evil. If a woman barefooted crossed the road before them, they seized her and drew blood from her forehead. The "Cuid-Oidhche," or nights provision, was paid by many tenants to the chief. When hunting or going on an expedition, the tenant who lived near their camp was bound to furnish the master and his followers needed supplies for the night and food for his dogs.

Expeditions or outings as they were often called were a way of life. Each young chieftain of a clan was required to give a public demonstration of his valor before he was acknowledged as chief of his people. He normally was accompanied by several young men, who had not beforehand given any proof of their valor. By going with him, it gave them the opportunity to give evidence of their own abilities and valor. It was usual for the captain to lead them on an incursion into the lands of some neighbor or other, with whom they were presently feuding. They would then by open force bring back such cattle found, or die in the attempt. After the performance of this achievement, the young chieftain was thought to be a man of valor and see as worthy to be chief. Those that went with him gained in stature and reputation. The custom was of course reciprocal in nature among the clans and was not considered robbery, for the damage sustained by one clan in this outing would be repaired when it came time for their chieftain to make his demonstration of worthiness.

The general population of the clan consisted of tacksmen (overseer) who worked on the lands of the Chief, other landed men in the clan, and Crofters or tenant farmers. Within the feudal system of England and France, the peasants of Scotland seemed to have been better off, inspite of taxes, marriage and death duties. By the thirteenth century a crofter had to give three days of plowing a year and three days at harvest, plus some payment in kind and later money for each unit of land worked.

At the same time that there was a social structure within the clan, there was also a sense of family that could not be denied. No one was allowed to want for food or clothing, and it



was the responsibility everyone to share in the common good. Even so the standard of living was low. A typical Crofters cottage had walls of wattle and daub, or rough fieldstones and thatched roofs held in place by ropes of twisted heather. The roof was then weighted down with rocks for protection from wind an rain. Floors were earth-packed and heat and cooking done at a peat-burning hearth, but then everyone including the nobles shared the problem. Oatmeal, dried herring, and cheese were the staples of the diet, with as much as 1/3rd the grain crop turned into ale. Meat was a rarity because it could not be kept for any length of time. The animals which were used for food were those that could not last through the winter. Meat as prepared frequently, was stained green or some other color and well spiced with nutmeg or something else to hide the ripe flavor of the well done steak.

Towns were beginning to develop around the castles and fortresses in Scotland. Many castles in Scotland are really just fortified farm homes. Edinburgh for example began as a fortress on Castle Rock. As the small cluster of houses began to develop into a town along the ridge of the hill. David made it a royal burg. He also gave Holyrood Abbey the right to establish a burg west of its church. By the end of the 12th Century both had grown together into one town.

The towns began to grow as craftsmen began to gather in a central place, first as part time and then full time at their craft. Merchants and traders followed and guilds were set up for mutual aid and protection.

The 13th century saw the life of all in Scotland improved, both that of the noble and commoner, through improved agricultural methods and technology, which brought increased prosperity to the nation. The Reigns of Alexander II and Alexander III are often called the Golden Age of Scotland.

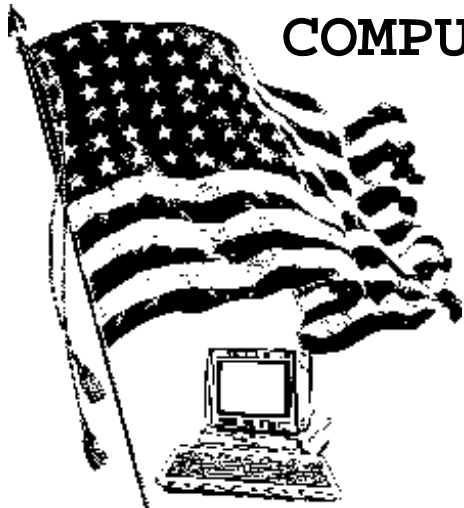

## How to Access a Genealogy Bulletin Board

1. First you need a Communications Program. One should have come with the modem you have in your computer that you use to connect to \*P\*. You could use ProComm, Telix, Boyan or QModem. All of these are good, each having ad-vantages over the other. I use Telix (Registered) and it works like a charm. I believe there is also a Comm program with PAF, Microsoft Works and Tandy's Deskmate.
2. Next, obtain some BB numbers in your own Area Code. (Much cheaper to call) For Genealogy BB's in your Area Code, post a message under the Subject: BBS-Nat Gen Soc or BBS-Nat Gen Conf. One of our knowledgable \*P\* members will post numbers for your AC.(If there are any) When you put a request on this BB for a BB number, al-ways include your Area Code and your City or nearest large City.
3. Next you have to set up the Modem and Dialing Directory in your Comm program. Put in the BB phone number- Baud rate of your modem. (2400 BPS is best if you have a selection to make)-Modem parameters: 8N1 and full duplex and whether you have a tone or pulse dial telephone.
4. After you have set up your Dialing Directory and Modem, you just highlight the number you want to call and press ENTER or RETURN and your Computer does the dialing. If you make a connection you will hear the same connecting tones as you hear when \*P\* connects.
5. When you connect you may see a message to hit your ESC key to awaken the BB. Hit ESC and wait for further instructions from the BB. You will be asked for your name, address and telephone # and a Password. Some BB's have an automatic system to verify who you are, ie , the BB calls you back in a chat mode and you answer a few questions and you are verified. Other times the SYSOP (BB System Operator) will either look you up in the phone book and call you for verification. 1st time access to a BB may be limited to 15-30 minutes to familiarize yourself with the board but after veri-fication you may have from 45 to 120 minutes. Until verification, you can only download a limited number of Bytes and only Read messages.
6. A lot of BB's are free but some do charge a monthly or annual fee. Some request you make a donation to the SYSOP's favorite charity. Some request that you upload files for use by other members of the BB.
7. After you get into the BB (Past the introductory screens), you will see a menu of different subjects. At least one will be Message Area and another Files Area. If you select either you will

find another menu of different subjects, such as Genealogy, Windows, Lotus 123, Wordperfect, etc. On a Genealogy Echo BB there may be many special Genealogy subjects, such as SE (Southeast) Gen,AUS (Australian) Gen, NZ (New Zealand) Gen, GENSOFT (Genealogy Software), EUR (European) Gen, Adoption and many others. Select one from the menu and the BB asks you how you want to read the messages, forward,reverse or by number. Then by hitting ENTER a few times (this selects the defaults) and the first message appears. Then look at the options at the end of the message and if you do not know what the option letters/ numbers mean put in the ? and hit ENTER. You will then see a listing of the letter/number commands. (Hold down shift and hit Prnt Screen for a copy of these commands) When you have read all you want put in S and hit Enter.(S=Stop) You will then see a menu on how to go back one menu, return to Main Menu, select another area and other options. Select- Go Back one menu and then select another Genealogy area.

8. After you have read all the messages you want, you can select S (for stop), go back to the main menu and select the Files area. Here again you may see a lot of subjects, ie, MS-DOS, Windows, Lotus 123, WordPerfect, etc. Select a subject and you should then see a list of programs on that subject, that are available for downloading. (These may be available only AFTER the first time you sign on a BB.) These programs are usually Shareware or Freeware Utilities to use the data or output of another Commercial program (Like PAF) or will make the program do things that were never thought of by the original Programmer.

9. Always sign off a BB in the proper way. Go back to a menu that allows you to say Goodbye and sign off that way or go back till you can leave the SYSOP a message and explain to s/he, any problems you had on the BB or ask for help in navi-gating the BB and the next time you sign on the SYSOP will have an answer for you. Of course the SYSOP likes to hear your comments on his BB. BB's are not easy to run. Takes a lot of time and effort and the SYSOP's do appreciate a "Thanks" for a job well done..After you say Goodbye then do an ALT H to hangup and an ALT X to exit your Comm program. (May have to read you documentation for the correct command to hangup and exit).

10. It gets easier as you practice and soon you can venture onto the NGS BB in Arlington VA. You do not have to be a member of the NGS to use their BB but you will only get 30 minutes of time and a very limited number of Bytes of down-load. If you become a member of NGS, you get 45 min of time and can download a lot of files. (Don't know the exact num-ber of KBytes) The NGS BB has a myriad of Genealogy info on it. From how to start your search, to maps of each floor of the FHL in SLC, to copies of letters in the German Language to use when searching in Germany and/or Switzerland. It is a fantastic BB..Try it!!!! The NGS BB numbers are 703-528-2612/8570.

11. Have fun- Just remember that you cannot hurt the BB you are signing on to nor can the BB hurt your computer.

12. Uploading/downloading files is best explained as the BB you are connected to as being upstairs. So to download a file you will usally use the "Page Dn" or ALT R (for Receive) keys. To upload a file use the "Page Up" or ALT S (for Send) keys. You must also select a protocol for up/down loading files. Most Comm programs can use XMODEM but if both computers can support ZMODEM, use ZMODEM.

13. Just remembered that when you are setting up your Comm program you will also be asked what drive you want to use as your upload/ download drive. When you upload a file you usually have to tell the computer the drive the file is in plus the filename and press ENTER and away the file goes..Remember that BB's are as addictive as Genealogy..Sooooo beware but have fun.
