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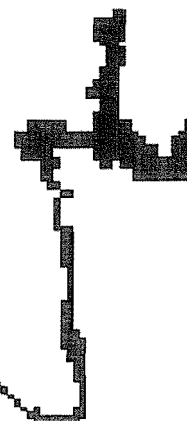

Genealogy and Family History Book Contest 25th Anniversary of the London Bridge in America

Twenty-five years ago Robert P. **McCULLOCH** moved the famous nursery rhyme London Bridge to Arizona as a centerpiece for his new community in the desert. Since October of 1971 millions of visitors have traveled to Lake Havasu City to see the bridge and walk across the world's largest antique

McCULLOCH's 1968 bid of \$2,460,000 started a 3-year dismantling of the 1,005-foot-long span consisting of 26 million pounds of granite blocks. Each stone was numbered in London for reassembling in America. Transportation to Arizona and reconstruction in the desert cost nearly double the original purchase price.

The Arizona desert city is planning a gala week-long celebration starting October 20th marking a quarter century as the American home of the London Bridge. Sam **JONES**, town clerk of London, and Douglas **WOODWARD**, deputy director in London of the Arizona London Bridge Corp., have extended personal invitations to make a return visit for the celebration. The community hopes to reenact the original 1971 dedication of the bridge witnessed by 50,000 visitors.

In conjunction with the celebration authors of genealogy and family history books will compete for \$1,000 in cash prizes in the 25th Anniversary London Bridge Genealogy Book Contest sponsored by the Genealogical Society of Lake Havasu City, AZ. The books must have been published since 10 Oct 1971 - the date the London Bridge opened in Arizona - to be eligible for the world-wide contest. Only entries written in the English language will be considered, and entries must be postmarked before 10 Oct 1996. Judging criteria includes narrative presentation, generation organization, indexing, use of photographs, documentation of data, and historical relationships placing ancestors in historical context. Categories include local, county and church history, documented family histories and abstracted materials such as court records, census, and cemetery data. Each author will receive copies of the judges' scoring sheets.

Cash prizes of \$1,000 will be awarded 31 Dec 1996 to winners. First place will receive \$500, second place \$250, and third place \$125, five \$25 honorable mention prizes will also be awarded. Entrants donate one copy of their book for judging and the books become the property of the Lake Havasu Genealogical Society for their public library and research center.

SALT LAKE CITY CONFERENCE

Margaret **LOUIS**, President of CCNGS, and I attended the April 12-13, 1996 Utah Genealogical Association's Annual Conference held at the Airport Hilton in Salt Lake City. The conference offered a choice of four sessions for each hour from 8 AM until evening. All sessions were presented by Society members, and all speakers were well qualified.

At the various sessions there was an emphasis on organization of records, and one speaker recommended a folder or book for each of your grandparents. Most speakers stressed the importance of documentation. There were sessions on Wills, Land Claims, Probate Records, and Naturalization; records which are often ignored. It was reported that people will take advantage of National and County records, but ignore State resources.

Also there were several sessions on computers that were less than informative. One speaker reminded us that computers, though helpful, are not necessary for genealogical research.

The exhibit area offered a variety of books, maps, computer accessories, material for the preservation of pictures and documents. Space was very limited so one could not move through the area freely. The sessions were also overcrowded.

In the past few years at all conferences, a more complete syllabus of the presentations has been offered which was a help to review later. If the speaker has provided a good outline which can be included in the syllabus, it has made up for not being able to attend all of the sessions. The syllabus for this conference was exceptionally well done.

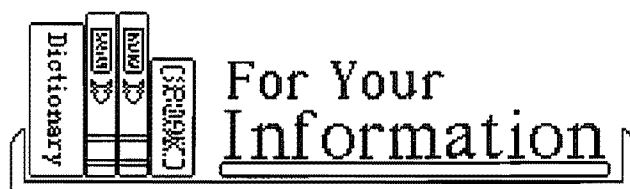

Lana ANDERSON, Merlin, OR, Mar-25-1996: "I am trying to obtain an obituary for my great-grandmother, Anna T. BENSON, who died Aug 2, 1961 in Las Vegas. I am willing to pay cost, etc. Due to budget cuts our local library no longer provides this service. I hope you can help."

CCNGS: Your great-grandmother's obituary appeared in the Las Vegas Review-Journal of Saturday, August 5, 1961, page 4, column 5:

"Bunker Brothers Mortuary. BENSON, Annie T., 86, expired August 2nd at the Southern Nevada Memorial Hospital (note: now University Medical Center). Born April 18, 1875 in Cimarron, New Mexico, she had resided with her daughter at 4601 Cory Place, Las Vegas for the past 7 months. She is survived by her son, Harmon K. BENSON of Ypsilanti, Michigan, 3 daughters, Mrs. Rosella BROWDER of Las Vegas, Mrs. Bonnie B. CLARK of Eden, Idaho, Mrs. Ruby P. SMITH of Phoenix, Arizona, 19 grand children, 47 great grandchildren and 5 great great grandchildren. Services are being held in Longmont, Colorado, on Monday with the Llewellyn Mortuary in charge. All local arrangements are being handled by Bunker Brothers Mortuary of Las Vegas, Nev."

WORLD WAR I DRAFT REGISTRATION CARD REQUEST

World War I draft registrations were:

- 1) June 5, 1917. All men between the ages of 21 and 31 years of age were required to register.
- 2) June 5, 1918. All men who had become 21 years of age since June 5, 1917 were required to register. On August 24, 1918 a supplemental registration required all men who had become 21 years of age since June 5, 1918 were required to register.
- 3) September 12, 1918. All men between ages 18 and 21 and all men between ages 31 and 45 were required to register. This was the third and last World War I draft registration.

All World War I Selective Service Records are held by the National Archives—Southeast Region. If your ancestor was within these age brackets, the Southeast Region should have his draft registration.

More than 24,000,000 World War I Selective Service records are on file at the Southeast Region. They are filed by state and by draft board. To search this large file, you must provide the full name of the person and the city and/or county of residence. In addition, certain large cities have so many registrants that you must also provide a street address or other specific information. These cities are CA: Los Angeles, San Francisco; DC: Washington; GA: Atlanta; IL: Chicago; IN: Indianapolis; KY: Louisville; LA: New Orleans; MD: Baltimore; MA: Boston; MN: Minneapolis, St. Paul; MO: Kansas City, St. Louis; NJ: Jersey City, Newark; NY: Albany, Buffalo, New York City, Syracuse; OH: Cincinnati, Cleveland; PA: Luzerne County, Philadelphia, Pittsburgh; RI: Providence; WA: Seattle; WI: Milwaukee.

CLARK COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT SCHOOLS

VAIL PITTMAN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Information derived from a speech written by:

THE HONORABLE John **MOWBRAY**
DISTRICT COURT JUDGE

More than a half a century ago Governor Vail Montgomery **PITTMAN**, and his brothers Key, William, and Frank came out of the south seeking gold and a new way of life.

The youngest of the brothers, Vail **PITTMAN**, was to have a career ranging from Under Sheriff in Tonopah, gold miner in Round Mountain, newspaper publisher and editor in Ely, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Nevada, and finally to Governor of the Great Silver State.

When Governor **PITTMAN** left the south, he brought with him the polish, soft southern accent and cordial manners attributed to southern gentlemen. Less obvious, but none the less potent, he possessed the characteristics of courage in the face of danger, a determination to overcome adversity, and a sharp mind to cope with all kinds of problems. He had a sparkling wit, a fun loving spirit, kinship with the outdoors, and a rugged stamina.

A direct descendant of Francis Scott **KEY**, Vail **PITTMAN** was born 17 Sep 1883 in Vicksburg, Mississippi; his mother died three months after his delivery. An aunt and uncle, Mr. and Mrs. Vail **MONTGOMERY** took him in to their plantation home in East Carrol Parish, Louisiana.

He first entered public school at the age of nine when the **MONTGOMERYs** purchased a home in Lake Providence, LA. He attended a military preparatory school, then entered the Normal School at Huntington, Tennessee. His formal education was completed with a business course in Brown's Business College in Kansas City. When his uncle died, he was called home from school to manage the 1200 acre cotton plantation, large gin house and general merchandise store in which he was part owner.

In Nevada **PITTMAN** was made Under Sheriff of Nye County (NV) during the mining boom era when Sheriff Jack **OWENS** offered him the job. **PITTMAN** sold his business and while serving as Under Sheriff gained the reputation of being one of the two best shots in the State of Nevada (the other was Clarence **SAGE**).

In 1911, after twelve year as Under Sheriff, **PITTMAN** quit and worked a short time for the White Caps Mining Co. at Manhattan in the Tonopah-Goldfield area. Then he and his brother, Key, who later became a United States Senator for the State of Nevada, went into a partnership and obtained a lease from the Round Mountain Mining Co. in Smokey Valley. The brothers were among the first to operate a placer mine under modern mining methods. The water from the mountains fed hoses used to wash down the banks of gold bearing gravel into sluice boxes where the gold settled to the bottom and was collected. **PITTMAN** tells of a time when he and his brother were driving, making a trip from Tonopah with \$10,000.00 worth of gold bars. At a particularly dangerous curve, they heard men shouting at them to stop but they accelerated their speed and went hurtling forward, leaving the would be robbers to "eat the dust".

Later (ca 1913) **PITTMAN** accepted an offer to become business manager of the Tonopah Times/Tonopah Miner, a weekly newspaper specializing in mining news which had national circulation due to stockholders in the mining companies who lived all over the U.S. He later purchased the Ely newspaper, The Ely Daily Times (1920-1951).

On 20 May 1919, **PITTMAN** married Ida **BREWINGTON**, a teacher in the Tonopah School System. Ida soon became one of the most versatile newspaper women in Nevada and supervised **PITTMAN**'s publicity campaigns when he entered politics.

PITTMAN, a militant member of the Democratic party, was involved in every election campaign after his political career began in 1907. He became a candidate for the State Senate from White Pine County and was elected for a four year term from 1924 to 1928. In the election of 3 Nov 1942, **PITTMAN** was elected Lieutenant Governor with E. P. **CARVILLE** as Governor.

With the death of Senator James **SCRUGHAM** on 23 Jun 1945 a series of events changes **PITTMAN**'s life. Then Gover-

One of the "Highly Recommended Links" categories in the RAND GENEALOGY CLUB was Genealogy SF, based in San Francisco and full of information on genealogy software and many links to other sites such as - Beginning Jewish Genealogy, Tom's Home Page, German Genealogy and many more.

One evening I decided to explore Genealogist's Guide to the Internet. This site listed a number of resources labeled: Found on the Web Index Vol. 0696 using different volume numbers. I clicked on one of the volumes which appeared in my Note Pad but it was all in hieroglyphics; I couldn't read it and did not know how to make it readable but thought there must be a way, I would pass on this one for now. Another listing was Genealogy Guide to the Internet, one of the listings in it was Bridgett's Gene Joint. Back on her home page she indicated that she lived in Las Vegas so I pursued that which led me to Vegas On-Line sponsored by KLAS TV-8 (in Las Vegas). I became interested in what all was offered at this site. I clicked on Personal Home Pages; this included a long list of names, none of which I knew. I returned to Bridgett's Gene Joint and clicked on her surnames and found quite a list. She listed several other sites. I clicked on Pam MIDDLETON's Home Page and found I was visitor number 6185 to her home page. She also had an Index of Surnames. I didn't connect with any of these names either. Her home page was very colorful: black background with lettering in yellow and orange. I looked into her Top 20 Genealogical Sites. I printed out five pages of top sites, each of which had at least twenty more resources. At the top of her list was Genealogy Home Page and described as being a perfect spot for the beginner. Number 20 on her list was The UK & Ireland. (I forgot I was researching Ireland. It is very easy to get sidetracked.) I left the Genealogy Home Page for later, it looked extensive.

I clicked back to Genealogy SF and decided to look into Genealogy & Graphics - All the Answers! Somehow from this I stumbled on a nine page article on "scanners". Back to Genealogy SF and a look at Ohio River Valley Families, an index of 4313 surnames, none of which I knew.

It was time to return to RAND, if I could find it. It was just two clicks back. Another site RAND recommended was Dennis BOALS' Page, which had a long list of further resources, seven pages. He included a short paragraph about using History/Social Studies Web sites in school grades K - 12. On down his page he had the Golden Web Award, the best genealogy websites on the web, three pages of information. So far in 1996, the winners have been National Genealogical Society and Helms' Genealogy Toolbox. Honorable mentions were Ontario Cemetery Finding Aid, Jewish Genealogy, Genealogy Calendar and Everton's O-Line Edition.

Another time I will pursue these sites. I spent over three hours to pursue what is contained in this article. Join me surfin' the internet.

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nor CARVILLE was to appoint SCRUGHAM's successor, CARVILLE, wanting the position himself, resigned as governor and PITTMAN moved into the vacant office on 24 July 1945. His first duty was to appoint CARVILLE as United States Senator.

In the 5 Nov 1946 election Governor PITTMAN became the Democratic candidate and was reelected for a four year term. PITTMAN became the first Lieutenant Governor who had succeeded to the governorship who had been successful in being elected governor.

During Governor PITTMAN's five and one half years in office many significant legislative matters were decided.

When Governor PITTMAN sought office again in 1950, he fell victim to the Nevada Tradition that no Governor shall serve three terms in office.

He and Mrs PITTMAN then moved to southern Nevada where they resided until Governor PITTMAN's death in Jan 1964. Governor PITTMAN was member of the Reno chapter of Sigma Delta Chi and an Honorary Member of the San Francisco, CA chapter, President of the Ely chapter of Rotary International, delegate to Rotary International Congress in Switzerland in 1957, Vestryman for Christ Church Episcopal in Las Vegas, Member of Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, Lodge 1469, Member of Hualapai Club of Las Vegas, received the "Distinguished Nevadan" award presented by the University of Nevada, Reno in June 1960, President of White Pine Chamber of Commerce and Mines, 1927-1939, member of Board of Nevada Historical Society, member of Board of American Cancer Society, Nevada, Vice-President of White Pine Building and Loan Association, and Vice President of Nevada Savings & Loan Association in Las Vegas in 1956-1964.

Pedigree

"PEDIGREE" is a genealogy program from England that has become very popular in the United Kingdom as well as Australia and New Zealand. It has started to gather users in North America as well.

Pedigree is noted as a very fast as well as flexible genealogy program. It has very flexible database fields which can easily be changed to suit the user's needs and wishes. Database fields may be up to 255 characters long (including foreign characters), text fields may be up to 4,096 characters long. Date fields are highly flexible and can even handle quarters or dual dates, such as 1751/2. Up to 15,000 records per database are allowed, with up to 50 fields per record.

Pedigree requires at least 512K of memory and one floppy disk drive, although a database of any significant size will require a hard drive

NOTE: This program should not be confused with several others of the same name. There are at least THREE programs called "Pedigree," they all seem to be unrelated to each other.

Family Tree Maker

"FAMILY TREE MAKER" advertises that it organizes those scattered pieces of family history into beautiful family trees. It automatically draws your family tree, placing each individual in a box containing your choice of information. It then precisely draws lines between boxes to show family relationships. Items that may be tracked include: occupation, medical history, height, weight, personality or other items of your choosing. The latest version of Family Tree Maker is capable of reading Roots-III databases.

GEDCOM import and export is available by purchasing an (extra-cost) utility program for \$29.95 plus shipping.

Expert Personal Roots

"Expert Personal Roots" by Expert Software probably is the lowest-cost commercial genealogy program available. A copy of it was recently purchased at a local department store for \$12.99, prices may vary a bit.

This program is very easy to use, at all times it seems rather intuitive. Expert Personal Roots will handle databases of almost infinite size, the limiting factor being the amount of hard disk space available. It requires 384K of memory or more. Printed output is clean and easy to read. A wide variety of printers is supported, including laser printers.

As might be expected with a commercial program in this price range. Expert Personal Roots can be described as a "basic, bare-bones genealogy program." It does record basic facts and produce some printed output, but only the most elementary functions are available.

Each person's data is limited to birth, death and only one marriage, there is no space for second marriages, for baptism/christening, immigration or any other such fields.

Expert Personal Roots does print pedigree charts, family group reports, lists of descendants, longevity reports showing deceased individuals and their ages at death as well as reports showing birthdays, anniversaries, etc. It does not print any sort of list of one's ancestors (ahnentafel) other than the pedigree charts.

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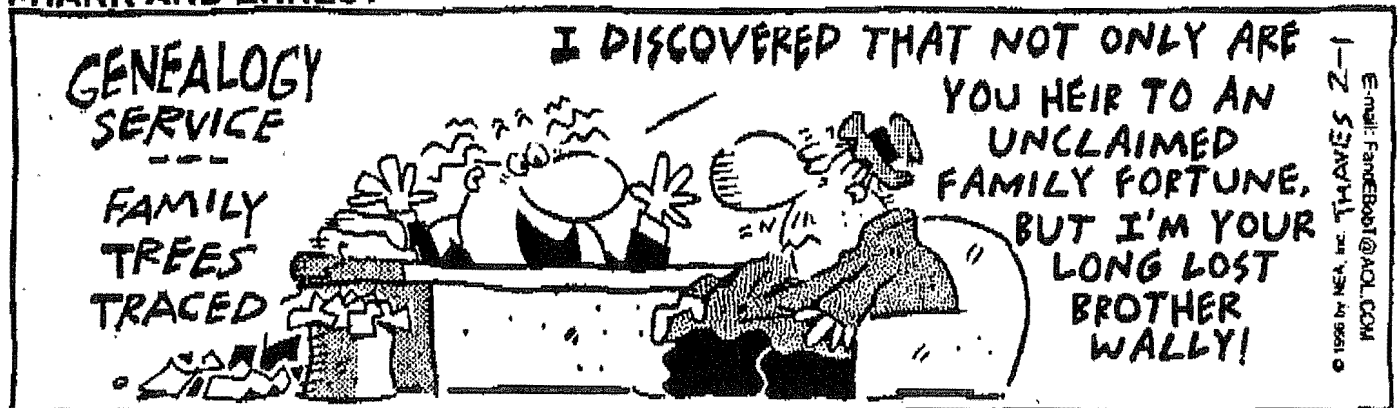

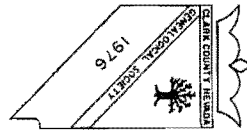
