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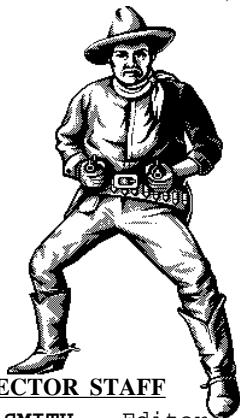

GENEALOGY ON THE PUBLIC BROADCASTING SYSTEM

A new ten part series on genealogy is scheduled for national release on PBS in January 1997. The series is an introduction to genealogy and family history, focusing on the impact that connecting with ancestors has on individuals and families.

Although no date has been set for airing the program in Nevada, dates of airing should be announced in mid or late October.

The series is as follows:

Episode 1 - Getting Started dispels common misconceptions about genealogy and family history and introduces the pedigree chart as one of the most important tools that is used in searching for ancestors.

Episode 2 - Looking At Home explores what to look for at home and how to organize these bits and pieces of information.

Episode 3 - Gathering Family Stories focuses on how the novice can successfully interview and document living relatives.

Episode 4 - The Paper Trail explains how the records that we find are witness to important events in our ancestors' lives.

Episode 5 - Libraries and Archives presents a tour of the Family History Library in Salt Lake City. The hosts also introduce you to different places to find genealogical records after you've exhausted resources at home, including city, state and national repositories.

Episode 6 - Military and Census Records presents Curt Wichter, President of the Federation of Genealogical Societies, to introduce two major American records that are commonly used in genealogy searches - census and military records - and explains what you can find in them.

Episode 7 - African-American Families focuses on the distinct challenge of researching African-American records and introduces new information to help begin a successful search in this area.

Episode 8 - Your Medical Heritage helps you learn how to begin building your own medical pedigree.

Episode 9 - High Tech Help focuses on how the use of a computer and microfiche makes genealogy easier and more fun than ever.

Episode 10 - Leaving a Legacy focuses on stories of three different legacies left by families in our country.

NEVADA VITAL RECORDS

Ilene CHAIX

This information is from the Nevada State Archive Library in Carson City, Nevada. I hope is helpful to people searching Nevada records. The staff has been very helpful in directing you in the right direction.

They are located at 101 South Fall Street, the southwest corner of Stewart and Musser Streets in Carson City. Public parking is available on Musser Street or in the Public parking garage on Stewart Street south of the library. They are open M-F 8am to 5pm except for holidays, phone number is: (702) 687-5160.

BIRTH and DEATH RECORDS in NEVADA. The Division of Archives and Records does not have Birth and Death Records. There were **NO** birth or death records kept in Nevada until 1887 when the first vital statistics law was passed by the Nevada State Legislature. Prior to that date, the only possible sources available for proof of birth were newspapers or baptismal records (at the NV State Archive Library see the copy of existing newspaper indexes and their locations). Birth and Death records from 1887 to the present are recorded in each county, either in the office of the County Recorders or County Health Officer. The Nevada State Office of Vital Statistics has birth and death records from 1911 to the present for all counties.

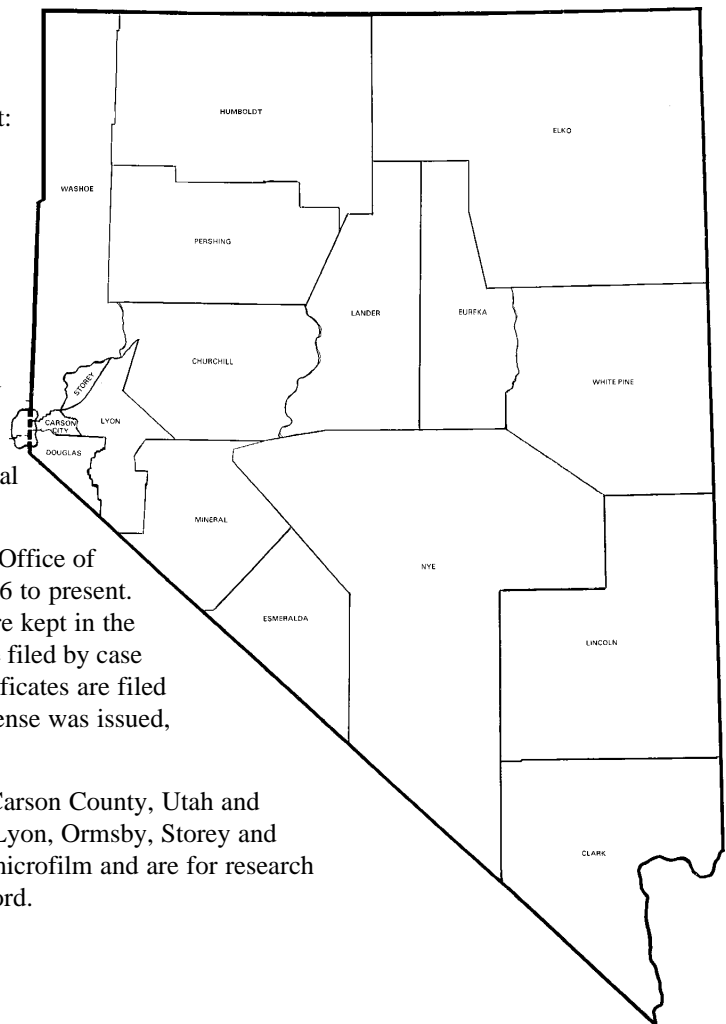

From 1879 to 1911, incorporated cities required undertakers to obtain burial permits from the county coroner's office. Permits were issued upon the filing of death certificates. These certificates exist for Virginia City and Gold Hill for 1879- 1887, and for Carson City 1893-1896. Transcripts of the Storey County Coroner's records are found at the Nevada State Library and Archives and the Nevada Historical Society. Carson City's burial permits are located at the Archives.

MARRIAGE and DIVORCE RECORDS. The Nevada State Office of Vital Statistics also has marriage and divorce records from 1896 to present. Divorces are civil court actions and from 1862 to the present are kept in the office of the County Clerk for each county. Civil court cases are filed by case number and indexed by plaintiff and defendant. Marriage certificates are filed with the County Recorder in the county where the marriage license was issued, not where the marriage took place.

The Archives has some records for marriage and divorces for Carson County, Utah and Nevada territories, 1856 -1862; marriage records for Douglas, Lyon, Ormsby, Storey and Washoe Counties for 1862 - 1900. The latter are available on microfilm and are for research only. Certified copies should be obtained from the office of record.

Rediscovered Sources

The Veterans' Administration has discovered some 10 million duplicates of 20th century military records thought to have been destroyed in the 1973 fire. If you have been told the records you need were burned in that fire, you may want to write again:

Also, over one hundred boxes of pension records were found recently at the National Archives in Washington, DC. They date back to the Revolutionary War, the War of 1812, and the Seminole War. They were never indexed or microfilmed. The files, arranged by account number are being published in the American Genealogy Magazine by Datatrace Systems, P.O. Box 1587, Stephenville TX 76401.

WHAT IS THE DAR?

The National Society Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR) was founded on October 11, 1890 in Washington, D.C. It was incorporated by Act of the United States Congress in 1896. It is an organization for women whose eligibility for membership is based on direct descent from a man or woman who actively participated in the American Revolution (1776-1783).

The three objectives of the DAR are: 1) Historic Preservation - to perpetuate the memory and spirit of the men and women who aided in the American Independence, 2) Educational - to promote the importance of education, and 3) Patriotic - to foster Patriotism and love of country.

Nearly 750,000 members have joined the NSDAR since it was founded. Presently there are over 190,000 members in 3,035 chapters in all fifty states, the District of Columbia, Australia, Canada, United Kingdom, France and Mexico. The Silver State Chapter was organized September 7, 1991, in Boulder City.

The Society achieves its goals through the work of the chapter, state, and national committees. The Genealogical Records Committee collects unpublished genealogical materials which are copied, bound, and placed in the DAR Library. The Silver State Chapter compiled the Boulder City Cemetery records in 1993, and then in 1995, compiled records from the Southern Nevada Memorial Veterans Cemetery. This year the chapter is collecting all the obituaries from the Boulder and Henderson Home News; they will be indexed and donated to various libraries and genealogical societies and to the DAR Library.

The Chapter participates in the following programs: DAR Good Citizens (recognizes senior high school students who excel in qualities of dependability, service, leadership and patriotism), DAR Scholarship (scholarships given in political science, history, government, economics, nursing, and occupational therapy), and American History (conducts DAR American History Essay Contests). The chapter also presents various other awards to ROTC members and outstanding community leaders.

The Silver State Chapter collects used postage stamps which are sent to Phoenix to disabled veterans who use them in their rehabilitation program. The chapter also collects Campbell Soup labels to help purchase equipment for classrooms and recreational equipment at the Kate Duncan Smith DAR School (AL), Tamasee DAR School (SC), Berry College (GA), Crossnore School (NC), Hillside School (MA), and Hindman Settlement School (KY).

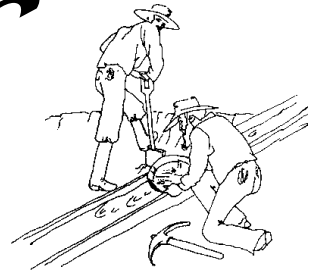
The Volunteer Information Specialists was established in 1995, to encourage communication and exchange of information through computer technology. It promotes membership through on-line referrals and genealogical research.

The National Headquarters in Washington, D.C. is just a short distance from the White House. It covers a full city block of buildings: memorial Continental Hall, DAR Constitution Hall, and Administration Building. The DAR Museum was established in 1896 and has 33

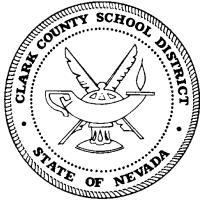

C. P. SQUIRES Elementary School

C. P. **SQUIRES** Elementary School opened its doors in September, 1959. The School Board of Trustees named the school in honor of Charles Pemberton **SQUIRES**, a pioneer Las Vegas resident and a leader in the commercial, political, and cultural growth of Las Vegas for more than 50 years.

C.P. SQUIRES

Arriving by train in 13 February 1905, Charles Pemberton "*Pop*" **SQUIRES** checked into a tent hotel in dusty, dry and cold Las Vegas, Nevada. Not until 21 June 1906, would his wife join him. Sent to Las Vegas with \$25,000 to establish a lumber yard, hotel, and the First State Bank under the company name of the Las Vegas Trading Company, **SQUIRES** and his partners, Chris **BROWN** and Frank **WATERS**, got to work. The Hotel Las Vegas was set up with 30 rooms in a canvas building and was designed primarily to house buyers coming for the 15 May 1905, Las Vegas auction. Squires and his friends bought an entire block on Fremont Street between Fourth and Fifth Streets where they would all build houses (later).

From that starting point Pop **SQUIRES** became one of the renowned pioneers of city of Las Vegas for which he campaigned and nurtured from the time of his arrival until his death. His platform to present his ideas was the Las Vegas Age (newspaper) which he bought in 1908. Until 1948, **SQUIRES** was the editor and publisher, advocating such political hot topics of the day as county division, which ultimately resulted in the formation of Clark County out of Lincoln County and the building of a dam on the Colorado River. In fact, **SQUIRES** pressed for the Boulder Dam to be renamed after President **HOOVER** until he ultimately achieved that goal.

Pop **SQUIRES** was born 22 May 1865, in Waterloo, Wisconsin, the son of Dr. and Mrs. James P. **SQUIRES**. Shortly after his birth, the family moved to Austin, Minnesota where Pop **SQUIRES** graduated from high school and later taught for the impressive salary of \$35 a month. He grew up with his future wife, Della **ANDERSON**, in Austin.

Born Delphine **ANDERSON** 8 January 1869, in Portage City, Wisconsin to parents James Sylvester and Mary Anice (**McWHORTER**) **ANDERSON**, the future leading lady of Las Vegas prepared for her teaching career at the Normal School in Winona, Minnesota. After teaching music for two years, she moved with the **ANDERSON** family to Seattle, Washington shortly before the **SQUIRES** family moved to Redlands, California.

Pop married his childhood sweetheart, Della, on 21 August 1889, and they established their first home in Redlands. Later the young couple moved to San Bernardino and then to Los Angeles (California) where in 1903, Pop **SQUIRES** met officials of the San Pedro-Los Angeles-Salt Lake Railroad Company who told him of plans to establish a community in Nevada.

Pop and Della **SQUIRES** had four children while living in California. Florence May, born 21 August 1890, married Frank **DOHERTY** in 1912. He died in 1917, in Goodsprings, Nevada and Florence then married C.C. **BOYER**. James Wert was born in 1892 and died in 1943. Herbert Arthur was born about 1895, and married Florence **DOAN** of Carson City, Nevada in 1940. Charles Russell was born about 1905.

Pop **SQUIRES** died 12 August 1958, in Las Vegas and the death of his wife followed in 1961.

Extensive family information was provided by Florence **BOYER** in an oral history which is archived at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas in their Special Collections.

We made an exception in this case and located Mr. Keathler's obituary after a one-hour search:

Las Vegas Review-Journal, Thursday, 27 Jul 1972, page 8, column 2:
 "KEATHLER, Wayne, 79, of 6305 Alta Drive, died Monday (24 Jul 1972) at a local hospital. Resident 3½ years. Owner and operator of a motel. Survivors: wife, Evelyn; daughter; Elizabeth Daunis, both of Las Vegas; and two grandchildren. No local services. Burial in Fairmount Cemetery at Denver, Cob. Palm Mortuary."

We did not locate Mrs. Keathier's obituary after a further two-hour search. Nevada retains death records at the county level for only 20 years –so we could not review her death record at the Health Department. We enclose a form which you may use to obtain a death certificate for Evelyn Keathler from the state for \$8.00. We also tried to obtain complete death information from Palm Mortuary but their card file lists only the year of her death and confirms that she was not buried in Las Vegas –Palm's older records are stored at a professional archiving firm which charges \$15.00 to retrieve any record. In all probability Evelyn Keathler is buried with her husband at Fairmount (Cemetery in Denver – you can probably obtain her death and burial dates from Fairmount. If you send us the complete death date, we'll look again for her obituary.

Based on Mr. Keathier's obituary, Las Vegas city directories, telephone directories, and the SSDI, we concluded that Wayne and Evelyn Keathler retired from the motel business in Denver (Mr. Keathler's occupation is listed as retired in Las Vegas city directories), moved to Las Vegas about 1968 and bought a home very near their daughter and son-in-law. When they died in 1972, they were still living at the Alta Drive residence they bought when they moved here in 1968

Using the same sources, we located their daughter Elizabeth K. Daunis. She was married to Frederic Daunis and lived only a few blocks from the Keathlers. Mr. Daunis appears in the SSDI; Mrs. Daunis does not:

He is survived by his wife, Elizabeth of Las Vegas; son, Ramon of Pomona, Calif; daughter Karen Willet of Brownstown, Ind., and four grandchildren. Nevada Memorial Cremation Society handled arrangements. In lieu of flowers, the family requested donations be made to Nathan Adelson Hospice.

Frederic Daunis was a purchasing manager (city directories) and/or a heavy construction manager (obituary) for REECO, the company which managed the Nevada Test Site. These documents showed that the Daunises moved to Las Vegas about 1962. The SSDI added the information that Mr. Daunis died in Las Vegas in 1985. Voter registration records list his birthplace as New Orleans.

Mrs. Daunis is probably still living. The Jan 1996 telephone directory still lists a phone for "FT & EK Daunis" but the number was disconnected very recently, We visited Elizabeth's closely secured home and talked to neighbors on either side. From them we learned that the elderly Mrs. Daunis has recently been relocated by her son because of her age. Both children probably still live elsewhere. Neither they nor any other persons with the surname DAUNIS –except Frederic and Elizabeth –appear in city directories, phone books, voter registrations, and property ownership records. You may be able to locate the Daunis children, Ramon Daunis or Karen Daunis Willet in national CD-ROM telephone directories at your library,



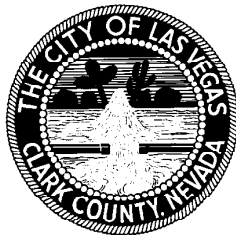

SURFIN' THE INTERNET

If you get detoured on the super highway, you can't always find your way back. In fact, you may completely forget where you were going. There are too many interesting attractions along the highway and they lead to many more.

One such attraction I found was called Mailing Lists. I printed out 27 pages of mailing lists to which I could subscribe. None mentioned a cost, and most don't cost. They just ask that you contribute information. I had already subscribed to the Roots_L list. As a result I have printed out literally reams of paper which include queries of all sorts. I finally put the last mailing on disk and printed out the index to each batch. It seems so strange that no one else seems to be interested in the same names that I need. The ROOTS_L queries are really the same type that we see on bulletin boards. There has been a running argument on the meaning of "Native American". It seems that some dispute that the term refers to our Native American Indians.

More about the Mailing Lists. Every ethnic group is on the list. "Albanian, Arab-American, Basque" and others. An interesting group to which you may subscribe is the "GenObit" group. If you become a contributor to the group, by doing an index of obituaries from your paper, you can request information lookup for a listed obituaries across the world.

A group that doesn't guarantee your responses will be in English is the "Genpol" list for discussions of Polish genealogy. There is a group which helps in your search of Native American ancestors called the "Indian-Roots". A few states are building a research base, such as Kansas through the University of Kansas. Kentucky, Deep South, Indiana, Northwest and other areas are on line giving you the opportunity to submit queries and read queries submitted by others. You may join the "Makedon" group which is a moderated mailing list for discussions of the Macedonian Republic. It may be in English and Macedonian. Another interesting name for a groups is "No-Slekt, a Norwegian genealogy group, or "No-Slekt-Etterlysning" which is conducted in Norwegian. Since one of my lines has Quaker roots, I think I will subscribe to the "Quaker-Roots" group.

There are 27 pages of many kinds of groups including single name groups, such as: Arnold, Cooley, Godfrey, Pettit, etc.

Of course, all this is done through E-Mail and you can print it out or have it sent to a desk and read at your leisure, off line. I have Microsoft Internet Explorer which allows me to receive and send my E-Mail off line.

All records of **DEATHS, MARRIAGES** and **DIVORCES** compiled by the Kentucky Department of Vital Statistics are available for non-commercial purposes via the **INTERNET** and a World Wide Web Gopher site. Use either of the two addresses listed at the beginning of this article to locate the two death indexes, one marriage index, and one divorce index which make up these records.

The four indexes may also be accessed directly at their individual Gopher addresses. The indexes and their Gopher site addresses are

You search these indexes by entering **GIVEN-NAME** and **SURNAME** (**LAURA GREEN** not **GREEN, LAURA**) The **GIVEN-NAME** and **SURNAME** search finds all of the persons with differing middle initials. You can also search using **SURNAME** only; that search will produce all of those in the index with that name as either a **SURNAME** or **GIVEN-NAME** A search of the "Deaths 1911-1986" index located 21 persons with the name **LAURA GREEN**. When I added an asterisk to broaden the search (**LAURA GREEN***), I added four persons to the list of 21 --**LAURA E GREENE, LAURA J GREENFIELD, LAURA B GREENUP**, and **LAURA E GREENUP**. Divorce records may be searched using the name of either the husband or the wife -- the wife's surname is usually, but not always, her maiden name.

Kentucky enacted one of the pioneering vital statistics laws but compliance has never been perfect. Compliance of county clerks with the 1911 law requiring reporting of deaths to the state was estimated at only 90% by 1917. By 1981 the non-compliance rate was estimated at 3 in 10,000 births and 1 in 10,000 deaths. Inaccuracies in the records include recording women under their husband's names in death records (Mrs. John Smith), truncated long names when field lengths are exceeded, misspelled names, missing records, and duplicated records.

The Office of Vital Statistics, Human Resources Building, 275 Main Street, Frankfort, KY 40601 is the official repository of vital statistics from 1911 to the present. You may order a death certificate for \$7.00 (as of 1994). Enclose your check payable to the Kentucky State Treasurer. Provide the name of the deceased, the county of residence, the date of death, and your reason for requesting the certificate (family records).

The Kentucky Vital Records INTERNET site also has a listing for each county with the name and electronic address of the person who has "adopted" that county (a few counties still need a "foster parent"). That person has volunteered to coordinate searches and data bases for the county. I have not used this feature. Let me know what happens if you try it

If you are using the INTERNET, try searching for the Rand Genealogy Club which links to Illinois Public Land records. That may be our next search project. If you locate these or other records of value to other researchers, please share that knowledge with us. The INTERNET can be a valuable research tool for all of us

Senate Bill 2922 of the 67th Congress, Second Session. 16 Jan 1922, authorized the Secretary of War to transfer to State Adjutants General "Statement of Service Cards" and "Muster-In Records" of Officers, Soldiers, Sailors and Marines. The War Department sent these records to the Adjutants General of the state where the person enlisted -- not where he was born or lived. Over time the records have been transferred by the states among various state agencies. The list which follows gives the current location of the records in each state and the name and telephone number of the person or agency to whom you can address a request.

If you request records, supply as much information as you can to identify your veteran. Request the *Statement of Service Card* and *Muster-In Record* and any *World War I Bonus Application*. All may help to document your veteran's World War I military service. There may be a fee for copying and handling, but you should be notified of any costs when the records are located. If you are not sure where your serviceman enlisted, a possible clue might be where he registered for the U.S. Selective Service or Draft. (See the article *World War I Registration Card Request* in the preceding issue of the *CCNGS Prospector*).

The cards are treasure troves which include your veteran's military service number, where and with what units he served, awards earned, injuries or wounds suffered, disabilities, declared dependents, and other valuable information.

OBTAINING RECORDS FROM THE 1930 TO 1990 CENSUSES

Reference: Bureau of the Census Form BC-600

SEARCHES OF CENSUS RECORDS

1930 and later census records are confidential and not in the public domain. There are procedures for obtaining these records but searches are expensive and access is very limited. The cost of a search is high because these are time-consuming searches of microfilm and not searches of computerized records.

In addition to their value in genealogy, these records are often accepted as evidence of age, citizenship, and place of birth for employment, social security benefits, insurance, and other purposes. Although the 1790 through 1920 censuses are in the public domain, some persons may need to obtain certified reports from earlier census records for proof of personal data when records are not otherwise available.

WHO MAY OBTAIN RECORDS

- You may, of course, request your own records.
- You may request records of another person only with the written approval of that person except for the special circumstances which follow.
- Either parent or guardian may request records of a minor child.
- If you request records of a deceased person, you **MUST** provide a certified copy of the death certificate and your relationship to the deceased person or legal evidence of your appointment or entitlement. Reports will be provided only to:
 - 1) A blood relative in the immediate family (parent, brother, sister, or child).
 - 2) The surviving wife or husband.
 - 3) The administrator or executor of the estate.
 - 4) A beneficiary by will, or insurance.
- If you are the legal representative of a mentally incompetent person you must include with the request a certified copy of the court order appointing you.

TYPES OF REPORTS

OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT

The primary report provided is an **OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPT**. There is a fee of \$40.00 for a search for one name in one census (do not include a SASE). Each request for a search for an additional name or for another census year requires payment of an additional \$40.00. The fee is for the search — it will not be refunded whether or not the record is located. If a census record is located, the “official transcript” includes information which differs somewhat from census to census:

• Census year	1930-1990
• County where taken	1930-1980
• State where taken	1930-1990
• Name	1930-1990
• Relationship to head of household	1930-1990
• Name of head of household	1930-1990
• Age on 1 April of the census year	1930-1950, 1970-1990
• Date of birth

FULL SCHEDULE (FOR GENEALOGY)

A second report which may be requested is called a **FULL SCHEDULE (FOR GENEALOGY)**. A “*full schedule*” is the complete one-line census entry for the same person named in the “*official transcript*.” It is typed on a facsimile of the original census schedule and verified as a true copy. “Full schedule” reports are available only for 1930, 1940, and 1950: they are not available for 1970, 1980, and 1990.

The fee for a “*full schedule*” report is \$10.00 (in addition to the \$40.00 fee for the “official transcript”).

“*Full schedule*” reports may be requested for other members of the same household for an added fee of \$ 10.00 for each additional member. You must be authorized to obtain the records and provide for each member of the household the same information described in the paragraph **WHO MAY OBTAIN RECORDS**.

Some of the information sources available locally include newspaper microfilm and indexes, telephone directories, a few city directories, book and manuscript collections, property records and voter registrations.
